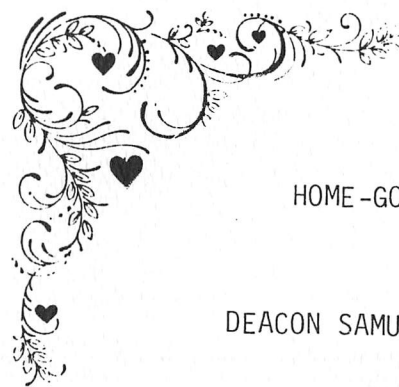


"LET NOT YOUR HEART
BE TROUBLED"

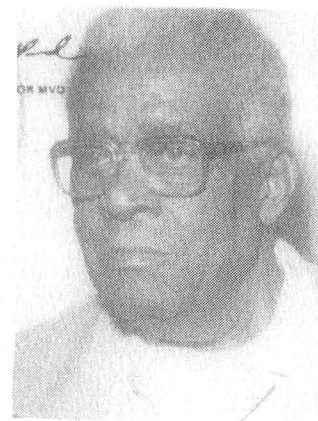
Whenever I am troubled

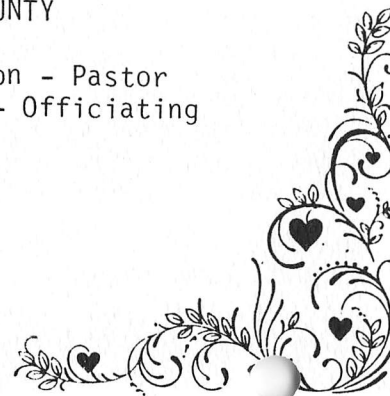
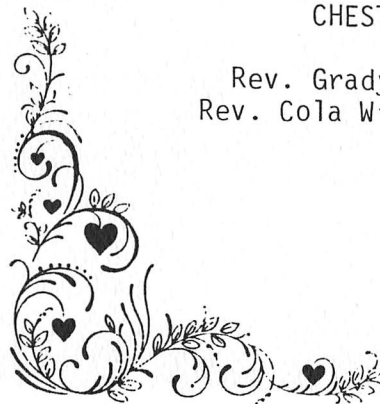
