In the name of God amen I Thomas Daves of Greene County and State of Tennessee being weak of body but sound in mind and in my perfect recollection calling to mind the mortality of the body and that it is appointed for all men to die I therefore do make ordain and constitute this instrument to be my last will and testament utterly revoking all other former wills by me made and all other Executors by me appointed I now declare this to be my last will and Testament.

And first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it And my body to the Earth to be interred in a decent Christianlike manner at the discretion of my Executors. And as touching my worldly estate I dispose of in the following manner and form And first of all I charge my Executors faithfully to pay all my just debts and funeral expences and then all my children to whom I have already given Negroes or other property for them to have and enjoy & keep the same them and their heirs forever.

It I give and bequeath unto my son John Daves a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in said County of Greene and on the South side of the dry-fork of Camp-creek beginning at a White-oak on the South bank of said dry-fork of Camp-creek marked as a corner between said land and an other lot bequeathed to my son James H. Daves thence South forty nine degrees west until that course will intersect the South boundary line of a Survey of mine of Two Hundred Acres granted bearing date the 20th Sept^r 1789 thence East with the outside line of said tract to where said survey intersects with an other survey of mine of Two Hundred Acres granted the 12th of Jan^y 1793.

Dry-fork to be bounded as followeth that is to say
the Dry-fork to be North East boundary and a line
mentioned in the former legacy to be the South
boundary thence down the western bank of Camp-beek
to the Dry-fork of it and the Dry-fork so as to in-
clude all his present improvements be the same
more or less together with all the privileges and
and immunities there unto belonging with all the
right title claim and interest as clear free and
an indivisible inheritance in fee simple to him &
his Heirs forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeeth unto my daughter Sally B. Holland
a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in
the County of Greene aforesaid ~~the~~ the land and
premises where on I now live that is to say all
my land on the East of the Dry-fork and all on the North
and East of the main-camp-beek (except what is in the
Dearman Survey none of which is to be included
in her legacy) be the same more or less together with
all the improvements thereon and all the right title
claim and interest to the said land and premises
belonging or in any ways appertaining to her and her
Heirs lawfully begotten of her body as clear free and an
indivisible inheritance in fee simple.
