THOMAS & PATIENCE HILL, his wife, sell to REUBEN HARRISON, all of Fairfield Co., for 100 pounds sterling, three plantations... third tract is 150 A in Craven Co. on W side Wateree R., bd. NW by sd. R., E by land laid out to EDWARD KIRKLAND, other vacant. Orig. gt. to PATRICK McCORMICK 20 Oct 1763 and he sold to JAMES McCORMICK 11 & 12 March 1766. JAMES McCORMICK sold to JOSEPH KERSHAW in 1774 and sd. KERSHAW sold 7 & 8 Dec. unto THOMAS HILL.

ZACHARIAH KIRKLAND of Fairfield Co., S.C., Planter, sells to FRANCIS LEE of same for 108 pounds & 15 shillings a tract of land containing 350 A orig. gt. ISAAC LENOIR 10 Dec. 1766 & another tract of 250 A orig. gt. ZACHARIAH KIRKLAND 16 July 1784 on Big Branch waters of Cedar Ck.

ZACHARIAH KIRKLAND appeared in Jan. Ct. 1798.

- Deed Bk. H p. 82 Divorce  
WILLIAM SORSBY & WILLIAM WATSON are bound unto ELIZABETH SORSBY for \$2,000 to be paid to sd. ELIZABETH, her heirs...  
Whereas WILLIAM SORSBY & his wife, ELIZABETH, both of Fairfield Co., S.C. have this day mutually agreed forever hereafter to live separate and apart from each other, in consideration whereof the above named WILLIAM SORSBY agrees to pay sd. ELIZABETH.. Also one feather bed to be given and delivered in three months from this day to my son, SAMUEL SORSBY...together with all property we have received from her father,

JOHN KIRKLAND of Fairfield Dist. sells to WILLIAM ROBERTSON 292 A for \$1,065 on Cedar Ck. waters of Broad R., being part of a 3800 A tract orig. gt. JOHN WINN & MINOR WINN Jan. 1786.  
Wit: WM. STROTHER S. L. ALSTON  
SAMUEL ALSTON swore before W. BROWN, JP  
REBECCA KIRKLAND, wife of JOHN D. KIRKLAND, released her dower 16 March 1826 before J. ALSTON.
- 13 May 1826 - Will Bk. 10, p. 280 - Apt. 51, File 798  
WILLOUGHBY HARRISON of Fairfield Dist., S.C. wills to wife, ELIZABETH, and his children. He names RICHARD B. HARRISON as his Exor. and wants RICHARD to buy land in Ala...  
"if RICHARD B. HARRISON should die before my son, RICHARD, is 21, I wish KIRKLAND HARRISON to be my Exor."

HARRISON one-seventh, to JOHN HARRISON one-seventh, to chn. of WILLOUGHBY HARRISON one-seventh, to JAMES HARRISON one-seventh, to dau., NANCY ROCHELLE, wife of ANDERSON ROCHELLE, one seventh, to dau. MARY MOORES, wife of CHARLES MOORES, one-seventh...until my son DAVID has paid the last dollar for land he purchased of JOHN J. MICKLE. Son DAVID HARRISON sole Exor.

 20 years old.

8 Jan 1813 - Deed Bk. X, p. 223; Rec. 29 March 1816  
 ANN GRAVES of Fairfield Dist., S.C. gives to her son  
 REUBEN HARRISON six Negros, namely, David, Governer,  
 Massintrin ?, Frank, Daniel and Bobo and all my cattle & movable  
 property...having paid all my other children the full amounts of my  
 estate...REUBEN having supported me in my old age and having his papers  
 burnt in his house...

 THOMAS BRIGGS swore before DARLING JONES, JP 27 March 1816.

1 Dec 1815 - Deed Bk. X, p. 264; Rec. 15 April 1818  
 CAPT. WM. MCCRIGHT of Winnsboro is indebted to  
 DR. JOSEPH KIRKLAND of Charleston for obligation dated  
 1 July 1813 for \$3,340...One tract of 545 A., one of 341 A. both gt.  
 THOMAS JOHNSTON & conveyed by him to MCCORMIE & from him to sd.  
 MCCRIGHT except for the farm of 150 A. sold to GEORGE MURPHY...one tract  
 gt. JOSEPH RONCE...much more to deed.

 A plat of the deceased WILLIAM KIRKLAND's land is given &  
 labeled A B C D & E, of which 467 A. of the 1110 total was  
 divided off for Martha M. \_\_\_ situate on Cedar Ck. in Fairfield Dist.  
 Divided 23 Feb 1821.

We, WM. STROTHER, JAMES ALSTON & SAMUEL ALSTON, Exors. of WILLIAM  
 KIRKLAND have, agreeable to a provision in the last will & testament of  
 sd. dec'd., divided unto MARTHA MARIA KIRKLAND a tract of land containing  
 467 A. more or less...as her full distributive share of the real estate  
 of her father, reserving nevertheless there out unto JOHN KIRKLAND the  
 full & absolute right to overflow so much thereof as he may think proper  
 by a dam erected on his land where a saw mill has recently been destroyed  
 by fire...23 Feb. 1821.

whereas the lands herein described upon the Demise of WILLIAM HARRISON the Incumbent became invested in JAMES HARRISON in fee simple as Son & Heir of sd. dec'd. WILLIAM HARRISON and JAMES HARRISON did for a valuable consideration make and execute legal conveyances in Law of the sd. lands unto REUBEN HARRISON...1st tract is 150 A lying in Craven Co., now Camden Dist., on S side Wateree R. on Dutchman's Ck. bd. NE by sd. R., NW on SAMUEL BACOT & other vacant at time of survey. Gt. to JOHN TODD, JR. 12 Jun 1751 and by sd. JOHN TODD & MARY, his wife, conveyed 10th and 11th Nov. 1752 unto WILLIAM HARRISON, dec'd. 2nd tract is 100 A orig. gt. to the dec'd. WILLIAM HARRISON 1 Dec. 1769 in Craven Co., now Camden Dist. on S side of Wateree bd. NE on sd. HARRISONS, NW on RICHARD KIRKLAND, other vacant.

ZACHARIAH KIRKLAND of Fairfield Co., SC buys from MATTHEW TALBERT, now of Ga., Adm. to estate of DAVID HAYS, late of this Co. and State, dec'd for 94 pounds, 100 A in Craven Co., now Fairfield, on branch of Broad River called Cedar Ck. All sides vacant at orig. survey to JOHN GEE on 1 Aug. 1750. GEE sold to JACOB FREED 7 July 1762. FREED & wife, MARY, sold to ANTHONY DUESTO 8 Feb. 1763 who sold on 9 April to BENJAMIN SIMS. SIMS sold 2 March 1770 to DAVID HAYS, dec'd. Also 250 A orig. gt. BENJAMIN SIMS 20 Oct. 1772, Cedar Ck., a branch of Broad River, adj. WILLIAM SAUNDERS, BENJAMIN SIMS & vacant. SIMS sold to DAVID HAYS 2 March 1770.
