Buchanan, George

b. 9 September 1759

In June or July 1777, he and his two brothers enlisted under Capt. John Buchanan in the Sixth Regiment. He served as a corporal. In addition, he served as a sergeant under Cols. Pinckney and Henderson and was in the battle at Stono. He was taken prisoner on Sullivan's Island in May 1780 and held nineteen days before escaping. Thereafter, he joined Captain James Kelly and Col. Glenn as an adjutant. He may have been in the battle at Cowpens. (Moved to Ga.) N.A.246.

Buchanan, George

He served in the militia under Col. Waters after the fall of Charleston. A.A.868; X2445.

Buchanan, James

b. c. 1741, Ireland

He served as a drummer in the Rangers under Capt. Edward Richardson during 1775. He became a drummer in the Fifth Regiment on 18 March 1776 but was not on the rolls after 12 January 1777. During 1779, he was a drummer in the Sixth Regiment under Capt. Alexander Boyes. He was also in service from 1 February 1780 to 1 July 1783. S.C.H.&G., II, 181; A.A.869; G57; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Buchanan, James

He served under Capt. John Buchanan and Col. Sumter. In addition, he was under Capt. William Jackson and Col. Pinckney. After being taken prisoner at the fall of Charleston, he made his escape and joined the militia. (Moved to Ga.) N.A.853.

Buchanan, James

He served as an adjutant under Col. Waters from May 1781 to April 1783. C.S.; A.A.869; X2447.

Buchanan, James

He served as a private in the militia under Col. Anderson from May 1781 to April 1783. A.A.869; I596.

Buchanan, James, Jr.

He served two hundred twenty-five days on horseback and eleven days on foot from July 1779 to May 1783 under Capt. John Gowen. A.A.869; I592; I595; C.S.

Buchanan, James, Jr.

He enlisted in the First Regiment on 23 October 1782. In addition, he served in the Sixth Regiment. N.A.853.

Buchanan, John

He served as a surgeon in Horry's regiment

from 1 August 1781 to July 1782. A.A.870; C599; C.S.

Buchanan, John

BLWt 271-300

b. North Ireland

He served as a captain in the Second and Sixth Regiments from 1777 and was taken prisoner at Charleston on 12 May 1780. He was exchanged during June 1781 and served to the close of the war. In addition, he was a captain in the Third Regiment during 1782 and 1783 and became a brevet major on 30 September 1783. A.A.870; C83; Heitman, p. 129; Logan, p. 23.

Buchanan, John

He served as a sergeant in the Sixth Regiment under Capt. Henry Hampton during 1779. N.A.246.

Buchanan, John, Jr.

He served in Waters's regiment after the fall of Charleston. In addition, he served two hundred eight days in the militia as a horseman and forty-four days as a sergeant from July 1779 to May 1783 under Capt. McGowen. A.A.870; I593; X2446; C.S.

Buchanan, Robert

R12819

d. 31 August 1780

He became a second lieutenant in the Sixth Regiment on 18 April 1776 and was a first lieutenant on 23 January 1778. In addition, he served as a lieutenant in the Sixth Regiment under Capt. John Buchanan during 1779. After being taken prisoner while in the Third Regiment at Charleston on 12 May 1780, he died. Heitman, p. 129; N.A.853; N.A.246; A.A.871; C84.

Buchanan, Robert

He served as a sergeant of foot from 20 January to 6 March 1779 under Capt. John Hampton. A.A.871; X1936; C.S.

Buchanan, Thomas

He served two hundred forty-six days in the militia from 1 May 1781 to 1 January 1782. A.A.872; R352; C.S.

Buchanan, William

He served eight hundred twenty-four days in the militia on horseback from July 1779 to May 1783 under Capt. McGowen. A.A.873; I594; C.S.

Buchanan, William

b. Ireland

While residing in the Ninety Six District, he was drafted under a Lt. Wardlaw and Major Noble in Abbeville District. His next tour was

against the Cherokees during the siege of Ninety Six under Capt. Dunbar. During the battle at the Beatty's Ford and the Lee and Washington, he suppressed the Tories.

Buckalew, John
In Loudon County. While residing in Ireland at age 16, he was drafted by Gen. Williams and Gen. Williams. He was promoted to colonel captain. He was a captain. Thereafter, he served in the militia company of Williams, Col. Fu West, he volunteered as a private under Capt. Robert Roebuck, Esq. William Hammond went to North Carolina in a company of horse (replaced by Capt. William Davidson). He was in the militia of Guilford County.

Buckalew, William
He served in the militia in the Charleston. A.A.873.

Hatcher, William S31727
b. 23 November 1759, Mecklenburg County, Va.

He moved to South Carolina in 1764 and later settled in Richmond County, Georgia. Thereafter, he moved to Edgefield District, South Carolina. He enlisted about June 1778 and served four months under Capt. John Ryan and Col. LeRoy Hammond and was on the expedition to Florida. During this tour, he was in several skirmishes with Indians. In early 1779, he re-enlisted in the same unit and was in the battle at Stono Ferry. In November 1780, he re-enlisted and served at various times under Capts. Patrick Carr, Willis Witaker, Francis Boykin, Joshua Inman and Cols. Brandon, John Twiggs, Chandler and Micajah Williamson and Gen. Pickens of the Georgia and South Carolina regiments and was in the battles at Blackstock's Plantation, Reedy River, Cowpens, the siege of Augusta, Galphin's Fort and was in numerous skirmishes with the British, Tories and Indians. About January 1782, he joined Gen. Wayne and was stationed at Cherokee Hill. He acted as a scout against the Indians, Tories and British. (Moved to Ga.) A.A.3434; T362.

Hatcher, William
He served one hundred twenty-five days in the militia. During May 1781, he served twenty-eight days under Capt. John Mills as a footman and from December 1781 through February 1782, he served sixty-seven days at Orangeburg under Capt. William M. Robertson. In June 1782, he served thirty days at Four Holes. A.A.3434; X1007.

Hatfield, David
He enlisted on 3 October 1776 and re-enlisted on 1 February 1780. On 22 June 1778, he became a corporal. He served as a sergeant in the First Regiment under Capt. Joseph Elliott during 1780. Salley, *Doc.*, p. 22; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Hatfield, Henry
He served in the militia and was at the fall of Charleston. A.A.3899; Yearbook, 1897.

Hatfield, Samuel
He served as a sergeant in the Second Dragoons under Capt. Isaac Ross, Col. Charles Myddleton and Gen. Sumter and was killed in either June or July 1781. At one time, he was a sergeant under Lt. Robert Miscampbell. Salley, *Doc.*, pp. 77, 83; A.A.3435; M387.

Hatter, John
He was one of the men under Capt. Clement Lemprier who boarded the Betsey for powder.

His schooner was burned during 1780. *Yearbook*, I, 40; A.A.3438.

Huffman, Christopher
See Christopher Huffman.

Haugabook, John
He served eighty days during 1782 under Col. William A. Thomson. A.A.3439.

Haughey, Robert
See Robert Howie.

Hauldewonger, George
He served alternately in the militia from 10 October 1781 to 12 August 1782 under Capt. Jacob Fulmore and Col. Waters. A.A.3245; X1207.

Hauldewonger, John
He served as a footman in the militia from 1 January to 8 July 1779 alternately under Capt. John Adam Summer and Col. Waters. In addition, he served under Lt. John Lindsay and Capt. Jacob Fulmore and Col. Waters from 10 October 1781 to 12 August 1782 alternately. A.A.3245; X1206; X1801; X2558.

Haulman, Andrew
He served in the militia from 10 October 1781 to 12 August 1782 under Capt. Jacob Fulmore and Col. Waters. A.A.3238; X1204.

Haulman, George
He served as a footman under Capt. Jacob Fulmore and Col. Waters from 10 October 1781 to 12 August 1782 alternately. A.A.3238; X1205.

Hauser, Elias
He served in the German Fusiliers of Charleston during 1775. From 1 January 1780 to 22 May 1781, he served as a deputy wagon master. Yearbook, 1885; A.A.3439B; A.A.3439C.

Haverson, John
He served in the First Regiment during 1780. N.A.246; N.A.853.

Havis, Jesse ^{mi}
He served one hundred fifteen days in the militia. During 1781, he served under Gen. Sumter. He was on the expedition to Biggin Church and Monck's Corner. In 1782, he served Gen. Henderson. A.A.3441; R171.

Hawk, John
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 2 March 1776 and was discharged on 30 May 1777. N.A.853.

Hawkings, Chapman
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment during 1778. N.A.853.

Hawkings, John
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment during 1778. He deserted in 1783.

Hawkings, Isaac
He lost a mare in 1774.

Hawkings, James
b. c. 1757, Va.
He served in the Third Regiment under Charles Heatley during 1781. *Yearbook*, III, 74.

Hawkings, John
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment during 1775. Du. *Yearbook*, p. 290; N.A.853.

Hawkings, Theopio
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment during 1775. In 1782, he served under Capt. Isaac Weather. Salley, *Doc.*, p. 35; N.A.853.

Hawkings, Thomas
He served in the Fifth Regiment after the fall of Charleston.

Hawks, Stephen
He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment during 1777. N.A.853.

Haws, John
He served in the Fifth Regiment under Capt. Jacob Barnett, Lt. Gen. Sumter during 1780. M300.

Hawthorn, Adam
He served in the Fifth Regiment during 1775. N.A.853.

Hawthorn, Benjamin
He served one hundred days in the militia during 1778. He served under Capts. Durham, and Col. Winn. A.A.3442.

Hawthorn, James
He served twenty days in the militia from May 1781 to August 1781. Dawson. A.A.3443.
