Know all Men by these Presents That I Adam Hawthorne Sen.^R of the State and District aforesaid being Sick of Body but of Sound mind do for diverse causes hereunto moving make and ordain this as my last will and Testament. That is to say I wish and desire that all lawful debts and contracts may be discharged and fully paid. I allow the Negro Wench to be valued at three hundred dollars and the Negro Yellow at four hundred and fifty, and both these Negroes Tony and Lucy to be delivered unto my Wife Elisabeth to enable her to raise maintain and educate my three children and when they arrive at Maturity I leave it wholly at the discretion of my Wife and in her power what part or portion She may see cause to give them. The land whereon I now live I bequeath unto my Son Robert when he comes of age allowing my Wife to live with him and be supported by him. I give and bequeath unto my Son John the fields he has now cleared and is building on with all the land lying up the branch from his fence with forty acres on this side of the road. The other part of my plantation being for my Son Robert as already mentioned. The stock of Horses Cattle and Hogs to be left in the possession of my Wife to use discretionally, I do appoint my Wife as- Executrix and my Son Adam Hawthorne as Executor of this my last will and Testament. Signed Sealed and acknowledged this 6th day March 1811 In Presence of
