Henderson during 1779. On 1 May 1780, he enlisted under Capt. John Robinson and Col. Taylor and remained in service until the evacuation of Charleston. During 1781, he served under Lt. Samuel Littlejohn, a Capt. Gray and Gen. Greene and was in the battles at Congaree Fort, Orangeburg and the siege of Ninety Six. (Moved to Ga., Ky., and Ill.) A.A.3452; S251.

He settled on the frontier of South Garolina and was captured by Indians along with his mother and two sisters about 1762. After being released, he became a blacksmith in York County. He was with Col. Thomas Neel, his father-in-law, on the Snow Campaign in 1775. Thereafter, he was with Williamson on the Cherokee Campaign in 1776. During 1777, he became a first lieutenant in the Sixth Regiment. On 22 February 1778, he was a captain and was on the Florida Expedition. He served as an adjutant, major and lieutenant colonel. From 15 September 1778 to 23 March 1779, he served as a trainer of the militia for Col. Neel in the New Acquisition District. He served under Sumter and was in the battles at Rockv Mount, Hanging Rock, Carey's Fort and Fishing Creek. In the battle at Kings Mountain, he was in charge of Hill's troop. He was in the battle at Fish Dam Ford, Blackstock's Plantation and was wounded at Camden on 25 April 1781. In addition, he was wounded at Cowpens. (Moved to Ky.)
