of a prosperous Connexion Church.
Miss Jane Hutchinson of Montville
Fairfield Co., told the ^{Chaplain} ~~Observer~~ that
she remembered hearing her grand
mother tell how the bricks for the
Church were made. After the
crops were laid by, the workmen
would go to the brick yard and
tramp the mud into mortar, put it into
molds wth their hands, carry it
out in the sun to dry, then burning
the kilns by night & day. The church
was completed in 1788.

A massive rock wall of granite blocks
laid in cement, surrounds the church &
cemetery. The church stands in a grove
of oak & hickory, a short distance
from Kincaid's Bridge over Little River.
