



L. Aubrey Haynes

July 10, 1940 – September 12, 2015

Aubrey entered eternal rest on Saturday, September 12, 2015. Born and lifelong resident of Fairfield County, he was the son of the late John Henry and Nell B. Ligon Haynes. He was an active member of Greenbrier United Methodist Church.

In addition to his parents and his loving wife of over 51 years, Martha Wood Haynes, Aubrey is predeceased by his two brothers, John Henry Haynes, Jr. and Herbert "Bubba" Haynes.

Survivors include his two sons, Leland Aubrey (Dawn) Haynes, Jr. of Blythewood and Thomas Henry (Karen) Haynes of Elgin; and three grandchildren, Justin, Madison, and Bauer Haynes. Aubrey is also survived by his dear friend and a close companion of recent, Nancy Lyles Brown.

Aubrey joined the South Carolina Air National Guard while in high school, transferred to the U.S. Naval Reserves in 1958, and served a tour of active duty in the U. S. Navy Seabees as a construction electrician. Returning from active duty, he rejoined the U.S. Naval Reserves and retired in 1989, having attained the rank of Chief Petty Officer.

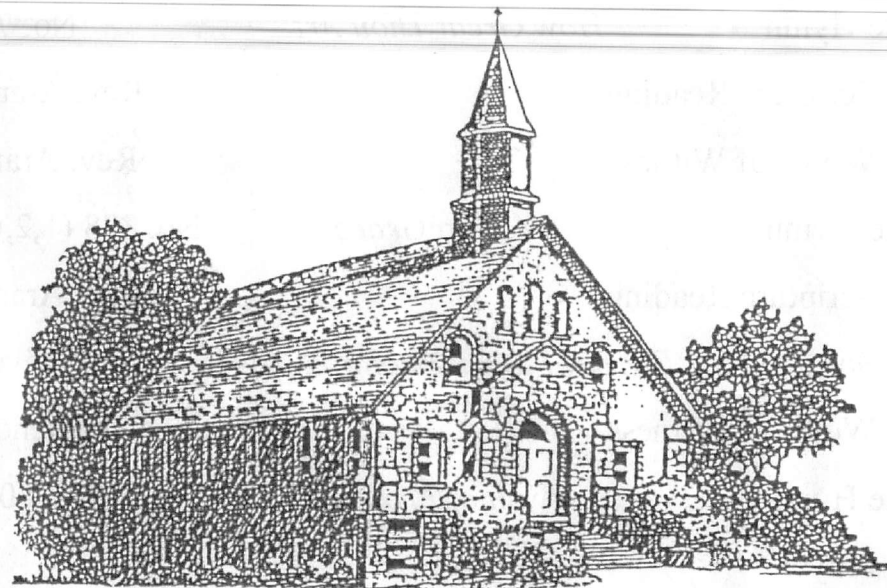
He was raised a Master Mason on November 21, 1963, in Winnsboro Lodge #11, A.F.M. in Winnsboro, SC. He served his lodge as Worshipful Master in 1977 and 2010. He was named "Master Mason of the Year" in 1996, 2000 and 2011, and "District Master Mason of the Year" in 1996. He was honored with Honorary Memberships in Lugoff #411 and Kershaw #29. He was appointed District Deputy Grand Master of the 23rd District in 1998-2000.

Aubrey is a Life Member of the Camden and Chester York Rite Bodies. He was elected High Priest of Rising Star Chapter #4 in 1997, Illustrious Master of Lafayette Council #25 in 1998 and Eminent Commander of Camden Commandery #12 in 2000. He has served as Grand Master of the 2nd Veil in 1998 and 2000, Right Illustrious District Deputy Grand Master in 1999 and Right Eminent Grand Representative of the 5th District in 2001. He was appointed as Grand Representative of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of West Virginia to the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Carolina in 1998, also appointed in 2003 to be Grand Representative of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of West Virginia to the Grand Council Royal and Select Masters of South Carolina. He was elected Grand Scribe of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Carolina in 2002, Grand King in 2003 and Deputy Grand High Priest in 2004. On March 15, 2005 he was elected to serve the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Carolina as Grand High Priest for the ensuing year. At this time he was awarded the distinction of Knight York Grand Cross of Honour.

Aubrey has served his community as a Scoutmaster; Assistance Little League Football Coach; co-founder of a local volunteer fire department and serving on and as Chairman of the Board of Disabilities and Special Needs for Fairfield/Newberry Counties. He is a member of the Sons of Confederate Veterans, Gen. John Bratton Camp #1816, and an officer of American Legion Post 16.

Following the funeral service, burial will occur in the church cemetery with Masonic Rights and Military Honors.
