## Generation 7 Overview

Following are a number of interesting 'tidbits' regarding Ann Ella's GGGGrandparents.

- 7.1 Unknown Henderson Family (i.e., Parents of William Franklin Henderson)
  - a) George believes this family was neighbors to Stephens, Wardlaw, and Taylor families near Donalds, Abbeville County, SC just prior to 1820.
  - b) The Henderson family was headed by a poor Irish immigrant. Three (of 4) of their children list themselves in later census as being unable to read or write.
  - c) George believes the Widow Henderson is buried in the Old Bethel Baptist Church Cemetery.
  - d) George believes that the three Henderson sons (i.e., Samuel, David, and William) signed 7-year indentured contracts in return for 80 acres of land in Greene County. Further, indications are that Cynthia (their sister) signed a similar contract.
- 7.2 Benjamin Henderson
  - a) Benjamin married unknown wife #1 in about 1817 in Abbeville County, SC. The mother died during childbirth either with Agness (in 1818) or with their second child.
- 7.4 Robert Lamb
  - a) The Lamb family was somewhat notorious among the Quakers. In this case, at least three of family members were 'disowned' by the Quakers because each married a non-Quaker.
- 7.7 Thomas James Drummond
  - a) Thomas purchased land in Greene County in 1820, returned to SC where he married Isabel Legg in 1825, and the emigrated back to Greene County in 1827.
- 7.9 David Montgomery
  - a) The Montgomery family were instrumental in getting a university (now called Mississippi State University) established in Starkville, MS.

<p>George's Hypotheses:</p> <p>1) Mr Henderson was a poor Irish immigrant who died in SC in 1820. Evidence: AL census indicates that David and Cynthia were illiterate.</p> <p>2) William Franklin Henderson signed 7-year indenture contract - probably w/ Benjamin Stephens - in late 1824. He was to receive 80 acres of land in Greene County in Jan1832.</p> <p>3) David and Samuel Henderson signed 7-year indenture contract - probably w/ Benjamin Stephens - Sep 1828. They were each to receive 80 acres of land in Greene County in Oct1835.</p>		<p>Family lore says that Widow Henderson with four children migrated from SC to Greene County, AL. Presumption is this migration occurred between 1820+ (when her husband died) and 1830 when the family was listed in the Greene County census.</p> <p>Note: George is skeptical that a widow and four teenage children would have migrated from SC to Greene County, AL in early 1820s by themselves. Suspect they either traveled as part of a caravan of migrants (which is almost a certainty) or the widow Henderson remarried before they left SC. So far, George has been unable to find evidence of either alternative and has been unable to find any reference to the widow Henderson in either SC or once they arrived in Alabama.</p>
		Allegedly, the Widow Henderson was born in 1764 but George considers this to be unrealistic. She married and had 4 children between 1803 and 1818, migrated to Alabama in the 1820s, and died in 1845. Suggest her birth was in the 1780-1785 time period.
		Given the family ties to Bethel Baptist Church, George strongly suspects that the Widow Henderson was buried in the original Bethel Baptist Church Cemetery. Her tombstone would have disintegrated long ago because of acidity of the soil in that location.

## Descendants of Mr and Mrs Henderson

George's Assumption: Several couples among Ann's ancestors were neighbors prior to 1820 in the Abbeville District of SC. Mrs Henderson was likely born about 1780-1785 because she had several children between 1803 and 1818 plus she allegedly died in 1845. The couple were likely married about 1802 in Abbeville District, SC and had (at least) four children

Note: Samuel Henderson and Sarah Head were married by Zachary Logan, JP in 1839. Presumably, this individual is the same Zachary Logan who married Dorothy Stephens and then emigrated with the Stephens, Wardlaw, and Henderson families from Donalds, SC to Greene County in the 1820s. This marriage also implies that the Henderson and Logan families were neighbors in Greene County, AL in 1839.

Benjamin Waller Stephens married Margaret Wardlaw in 1826 in South Carolina. (see 7.5). He was 29 and she was 32 at time of their wedding. Given their age at marriage, it is likely that both Benjamin and Margaret were first married to someone else.	George's Assumptions: 1) Benjamin married a young neighbor woman in ~1817. 2) The couple had one daughter - Agness R. Stephens - born in 1818. 3) Mother died of childbirth complications shortly after Agness was born. 4) Benjamin (w/Agness) emigrated to Greene County, AL in 1824 and purchased land in 1826 5) Benjamin returned to SC where he married Margaret Wardlaw in 1826. This couple emigrated to Greene County, AL in 1827.	
Benjamin and Margaret migrated from South Carolina to Greene County, AL in ~1827.	Some of the census records show that Agness would have been born in 1815 (vs 1818).	
Benjamin had a sister Dorothy Waller Stephens - who married (wealthy) Zachary Logan in 1818 in South Carolina. This couple also migrated to Greene County, AL in 1824.		
Benjamin purchased 80 acres through St Stephens land office on 1Feb1826. Land is located at Twp 22-N, Range 2-E, Section 12 in Greene County, AL (~3 miles NE of Eutaw).		

George's Hypothesis: **Benjamin Waller Stephens** (1797-1850) fathered a daughter and a son (by different wives) each of whom represent a different lineage down to Ann's paternal grandparents. Benjamin's **Unknown wife #1** was the mother of Agness Robinson Stephens (1818-1843) - whose lineage resulted in **John Clifton Henderson**. Benjamin's Wife #2 Margaret Only Wardlaw (1794-1874) was the mother of **Benjamin Waller Stephens** (1797-1844) whose lineage resulted in **Lydia Ann Stephens**. Incidentally, this dual lineage has resulted in tremendous confusion among the family trees associated with the "Alabama Hendersons".

Further confusion has been added because record seems to show that Edmund Waller Stephens (1777-1864) and his second wife Jane Griffen had two daughters - Agnes #1 (1810- ) and Agnes #2 (1830- ). Agnes was living with Edmund and his 2nd wife Jane Griffen after they emigrated to Kentucky in ~1829. These two daughters are in addition to the **Agness R Stephens** (1818-1873) who emigrated to Greene County, AL and married **William Franklin Henderson**.

Note: George has found the same unusual spelling of a woman's name among Stephens lineage which propagated over at least 5 generations:

- 1) Agness Smith - wife of Rev William Robinson
- 2) Agness Smith Robinson - Wife of Edmund Waller Stephens  
- Mother of Benjamin Waller Stephens
- 3) Agness R(obinson) Stephens - wife of William Franklin Henderson  
- thought to be daughter of Benjamin Waller Stephens
- 4) Agness R(obinson) Henderson - daughter of William Franklin Henderson

Finally, Benjamin Waller Stephens family and William Franklin Henderson family were 'next-door' neighbors in Greene County, AL per 1850 census records.

George's Conclusion: Benjamin Waller Stephens and Unk wife #1 (from SC) were the parents of Agness Robinson Stephens.

Supposedly John owned land in Spartanburg County, SC. Thus far George has not found a record documenting his land ownership.		
George was unable to find a death record for either John or Elizabeth.		

So far, George has found only a few online records documenting the lives of John M Cartee and Elizabeth Kimbrell. Further, there has been a lot of confusion among researchers as to "Who was John M Cartee?" First, there was a John M Cartee who was also born in Virginia in 1785 - these two Johns might have even been close relatives. John M Cartee migrated to Missouri and married Mary Polly Grider (1790- ) who was born in South Carolina and had emigrated to Missouri. Incidentally, there was a second John M Cartee in Missouri who served as a private in the Missouri's 6th Regiment, 6th Missouri Infantry (rationale: John M Cartee from Virginia would have been 75 years old in 1860. There was also a James Cartee who lived about this same time in Spartanburg County, SC which further adds to the confusion.

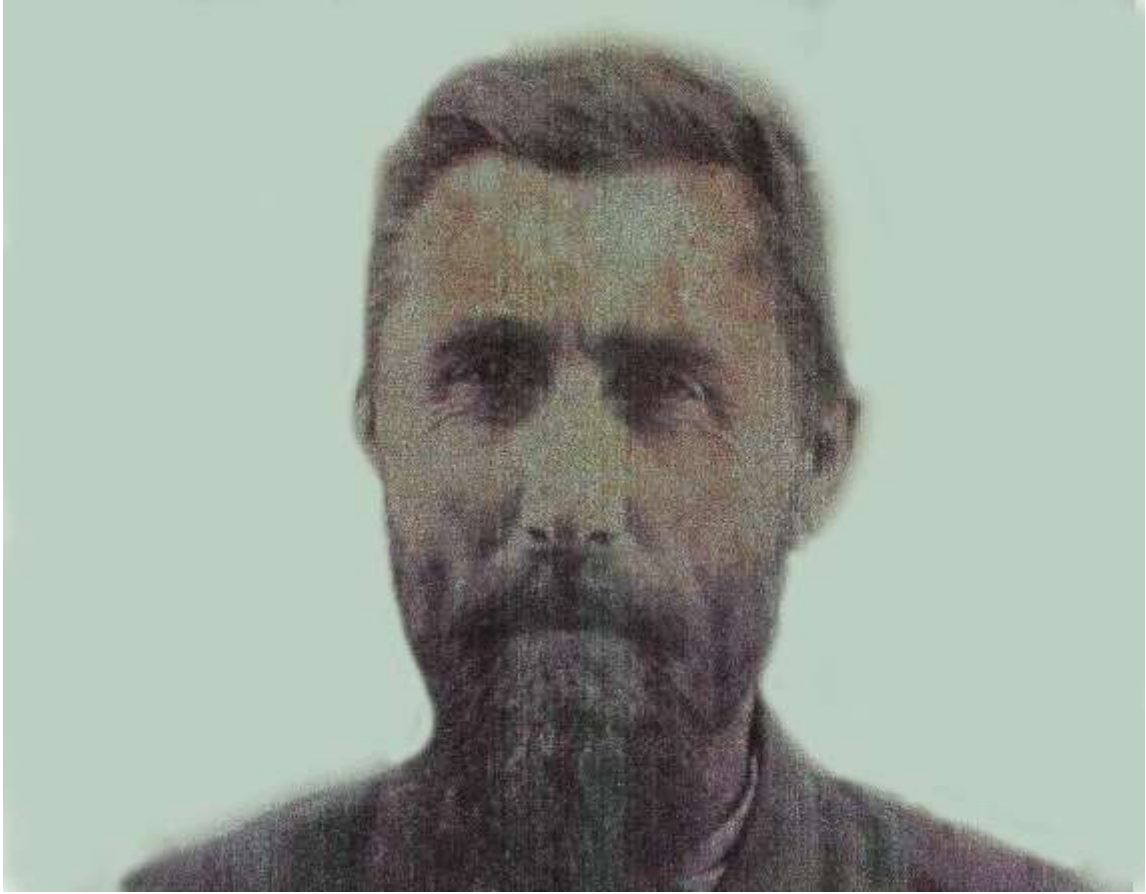
Per Mormon database, one researcher stated that John M Cartee was a charter member of the Boiling Springs Baptist Church (in Va?) when it was reconstructed in 1792. If so, John would have joined the church as a 7 year old.

Thus far George has been unable to find any documentation related to burial location of Jesse and Frances Williamson. Presumably, both were buried in area of Spartanburg, SC.		Even though most researchers insist that Frances Williamson was born in Maine, George is VERY skeptical of this 'fact'. More likely, Frances was either from a poor family or an Irish immigrant who entered America via Charleston, SC about 1800. Further research needed.

One reference says that Benjamin and Margaret migrated from SC to Greene County, Alabama in ~1827. If so, this suggests they could have been part of that caravan of Irish immigrants (including **Thomas & Isabel Drummond\_7.7**) who migrated from Edgefield District, SC to Greene County, AL in 1827.

There appears to have been 'bad blood' between the first and second families of **Edmund Waller Stephens** (i.e., **Benjamin's** father) which resulted in the two families splitting apart. Further, George suggests that the source of the split was MONEY. Edmund Waller Stephens owned significant amount of property - his net worth in KY 1850 census was \$4,000 - which was 2-4 times the wealth of other farmers listed on the same census roll.

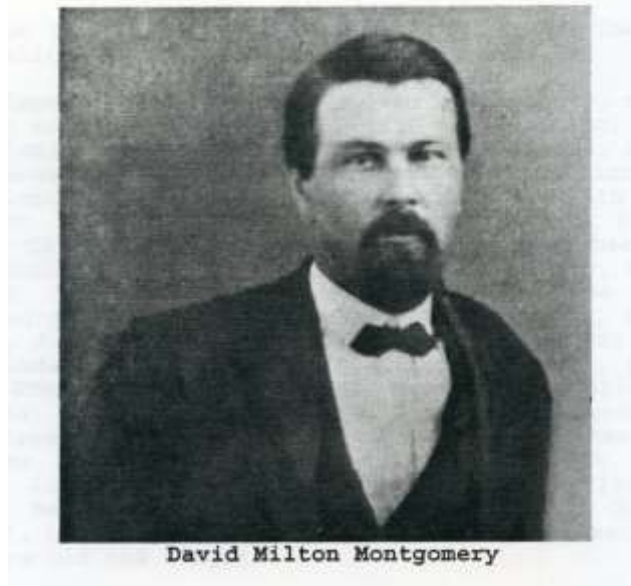

Upon the death of David's father, David was given half of his father's estate. Each of his brothers and sisters were given substantial holdings before and after their father's death.

Around 1838, David and Martha emigrated from South Carolina to Oktibbeha County, Mississippi. (Other families making this same migration included other Montgomery, Bell, Mckell, and Nason relatives who relocated to Octibbeha County, MS near Starkville - then called Boardtown.) Here they were charter members of the Starkville Associated Reform Presbyterian Church and became leading citizens of the community. David became a wealthy planter (probably cotton) as he grew his fortune in Mississippi. He acquired vast land holdings and had 46 slaves per 1850 census. One of his first holdings was in Oktibbeha County, Township 19-N, Range 14-E, Section 26 which he acquired on 1Feb1841. George found a record which indicates that David (as well as every other planter) filed a claim with the U.S. Southern Claims Commission in the 1871-1880 time period - presumably trying to recoup some of their losses which occurred when the slaves were freed. George was unable to determine whether or not any of these claims were successful.

David built the rather striking residence which is located on West Point Road a mile or two from Starkville. This house is said to have been built before 1840 David and his brother, Hugh, were strong adherents to the Seceders, a religious group which had seceded from the Old School Presbyterians. For many years the Seceder Church was the most important one in Starkville and was largely supported, first by David and Hugh, and later by descendants of Hugh. David, however, showed his devotion to the Seceders by on two occasions by giving some thousands of dollars to Erskine College, Due West, SC and by sending several of his grandsons there to school. However, David's wife was Martha Thompson, a Baptist, and perhaps the reason why none of David's descendants were Seceders.

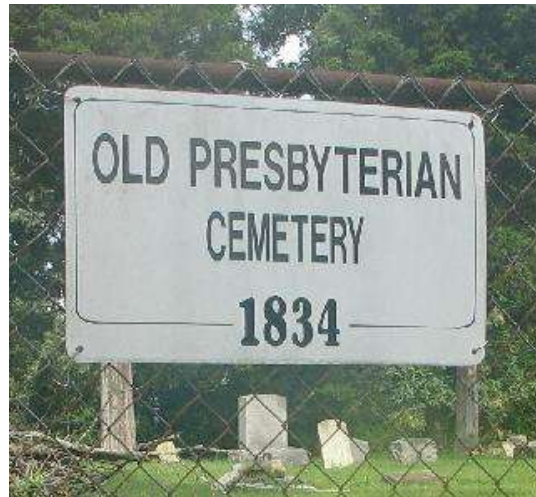
According to 'History of the Town of Goshen' by Hiram Barrus, "Araunah Bardwell united with the church in 1805, became a physician, was dismissed by letter to North Carolina in 1824 (should be prior to 1812). He died in Mississippi in October 1838." In effect, Dr Brainard (and probably his wife) were named as missionaries to the heathen Indians. According to one reference "History of Newton County", Dr Bardwell had preached multiple times at his church. Also, the book "Historical Sketches of Oktibbeha County (Mississippi)" by Thomas Battle Carroll indicates that Dr Araunah had been working at the local mission school which had been established for the Choctaw Indians.

According to a history of Lowndes County, Mississippi, "In 1817 the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions began to set up a series of mission stations among the Indians. The first of the stations was to the Cherokees at a station called 'Brainard' near Chattanooga." Perhaps this was the inspiration for Araunah and Sarah naming their son Brainard when he was born in 1817.

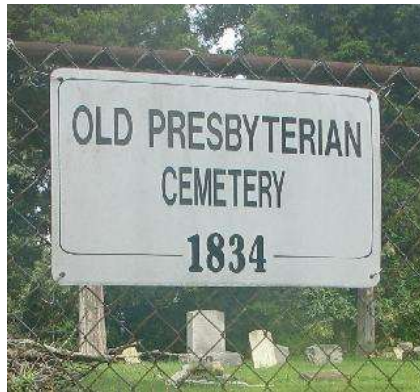

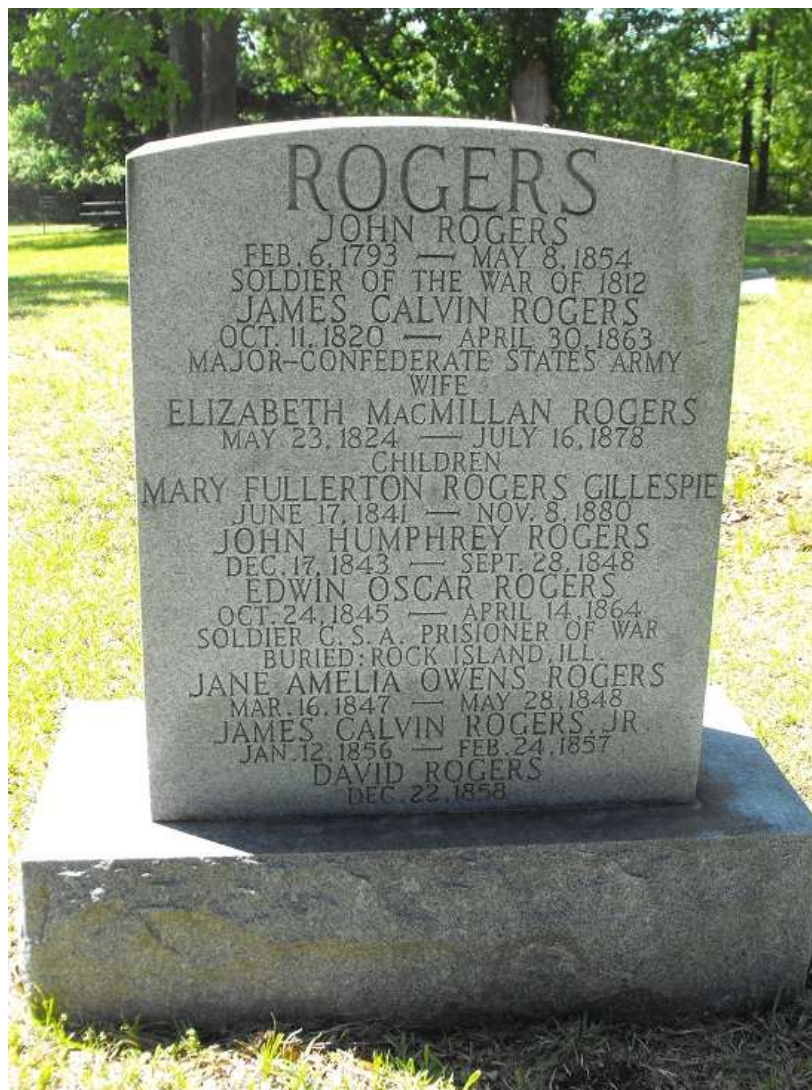

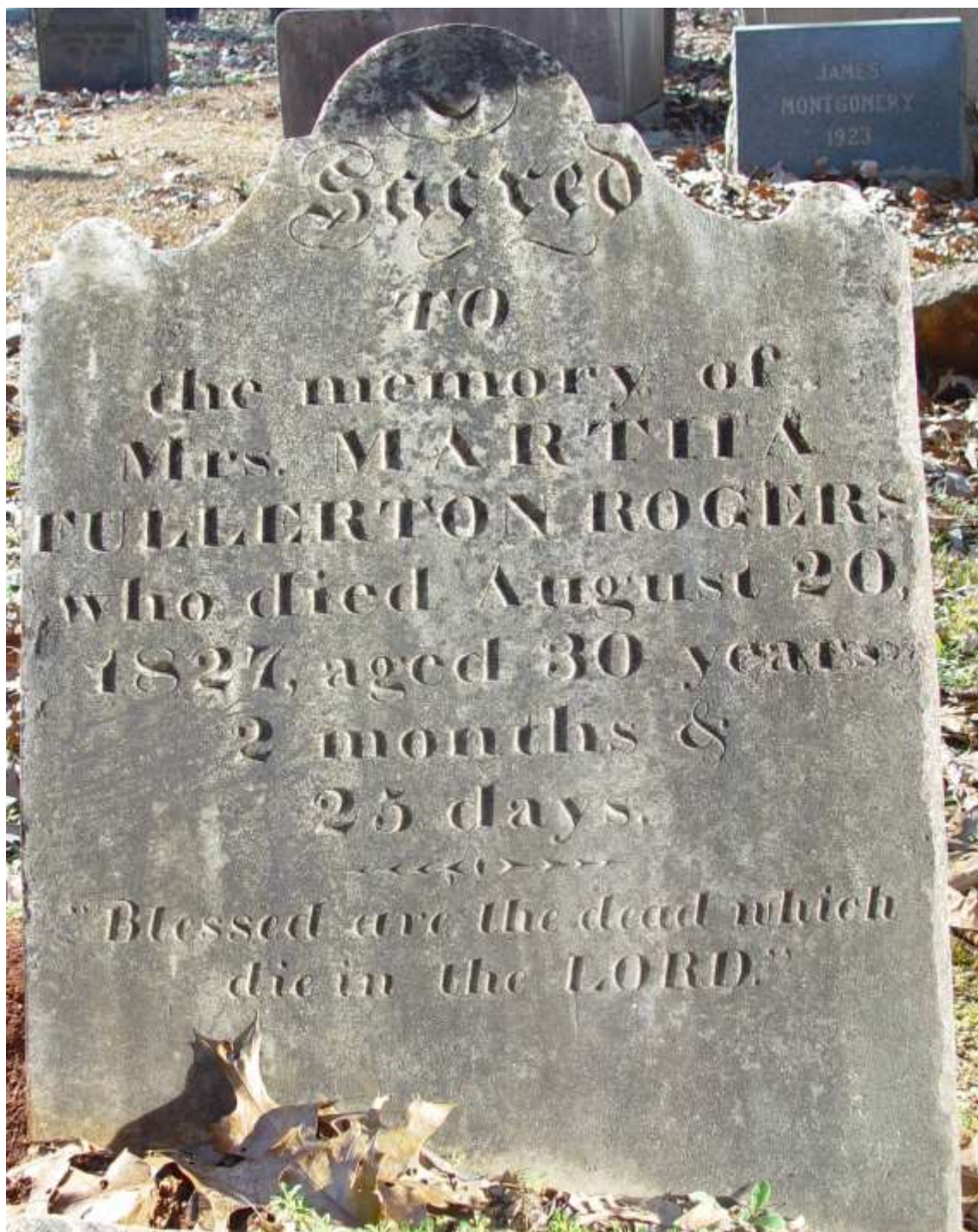

Rev James Bellah was 28 years of age when he was admitted to the Ministry by the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1816. That conference, prior to the organization of the Georgia Conference, embraced the work of the Methodist Church in Georgia. James immediately entered active service, was admitted to full connection in 1818, elected deacon the same year, and was ordained Elder in 1820. James health failed in 1823, he was that year superannuated; but he returned to work the following years and remained in the service until 1833. His health failed again and he was permanently superannuated at La Grange, Georgia on January 2, 1833. Apparently, James preached at 14 different churches over a period of 16 years - all of them in the Athens District. Morgan Bellah (James' brother) took up the ministry work and replaced James when he could no longer be an active minister.

Edward Pharr, paternal grandfather of Mary Pharr, served in Revolutionary Army as a private in Captain Henry Terrell's Company, 5th Virginia Regiment - which was commanded at times by Col Charles Scott and Lt Colonel Josiah Parker. He enlisted 7Feb1776. He also served in the Virginia State Infantry.

*Notes for MARY POLLY PHARR:* Mentioned in father's will. Mary Pharr daughter of Jane Smith and (adopted by?) Ephraim Pharr. The family lived in Morgan Co. Ga. in 1812. On 2/14/1814 she joined with her sisters, Elizabeth Holton Pharr (of Morgan County) and Margaret Pharr (of Oglethorpe County) in selling to Michael Powers for \$200 part of the land formerly granted to Andrew McNabb and conveyed to Ephraim Pharr. This tract was known as the Fork tract. James W. Bellah had died about 1834 in Newton Co. where he was probably then living. His two oldest children being over 14 years of age came into the courts as minor orphans and chose Alexander Pharr as their guardian. The courts then made the appointment and Alexander Pharr served in this capacity until the youngest child was of age. Per 1850 census, Nancy Stanton (21) and Hester Ann Middlebrook (7) were living in the Zere Middlebrook household. Per 1860 census, Zere and Sophia were in their 70s and had Georgia A V Rosser (16) living with them. In 1832, Zere Middlebrook (in Georgia) became prominently connected with the Methodist Episcopal Church organization in the South. He was always an ardent advocate of Christian teaching and living.

George has copied two different membership applications to the Sons of the American Revolution based on their ancestral lineage back to John Middlebrook, Jr. Lovick Pierce Bellah of Giles County, TN made such an application to The Tennessee Society on 19Jul1921 - SAR membership #34646. Samuel Bellah of Orleans Parish made a similar application to The Louisiana Society on 28Aug1924 - SAR membership #40194.

### **History of Alabama Middlebrooks:**

Azariah Burton Middlebrook, Sr, Elijah Edmund Middlebrook, (brothers of Zere Middlebrook) and Azariah Burton Middlebrook, Jr arrived in Alabama sometime after the 1850 federal census. They probably crossed the Chattahoochee River at Fort Gaines, Georgia, on the old "plank" road that ran all the way to Mobile. Azariah purchased land at the Elba (AL) land office on 15Sep1854. This group will become the ancestors of future Middlebrooks who were to reside in Alabama and Mississippi.

Obituary Notice - Southern Christian Advocate (1867-1878) - Mrs Sophia West Middlebrook, daughter of John and Elizabeth Shell, was born in Mecklenburg County, Virginia, March 31, 1789. She joined the M.E. Church in Newberry District, SC, whither parents had moved from Virginia. In 1808, she was married to Zere Middlebrook, late of Newton County, Ga., and died at the house of her son, Dr A.C. Middlebrook, in Doraville, DeKalb County, Ga on 10th April 1877.
