Per Milton Henderson, "Members of my family have told me that Edmund Waller Henderson was named after the English poet & politician Edmund Waller (1606-1687). Records show that Edmund Waller's descendants first married Stephens who later married Hendersons.	John P Doigg - Enlisted September 10, 1861 in Company B, 36th Alabama Infantry. Shown later in the Alabama Volunteer Militia. Son of John Doigg (179?-184?) and Martha "Patsy" Legg (1810-aft. 1870).
Edmund and Elizabeth were members of Bethel Baptist Church (near Ralph) during first ten years of their marriage. In 1877, they transferred their membership to Beulah Baptist Church (by letter) and Edmund served as a deacon between 1893 and 1899. Both Edmund and Elizabeth are buried in Beulah Baptist Church Cemetery.	
In 1906, Henderson families in Greene County apparently experienced a financial catastrophe. As many as a dozen families sold their land to a single individual and moved elsewhere. Thus far, author has been unable to determine what caused this course of action.	

76th Birthday Celebration for Edmund Waller Henderson (1915)

On the 28th day of April Mr. E.W. Henderson, known as "Bud" invited all his children and grandchildren to his home near Beulah to celebrate his seventy-sixth birthday.

He has six children and thirty seven grand children living, and all were present except seven of the grand children, and he invited enough of his friends to make the number fifty six.

Mr. Henderson married to Miss Jennie Cartee May 19, 1867. The couple had 9 children. She died October 31 1885.

Edmund married Miss Evelyn Ellis Doigg (1851-1920) on 22Oct1829 who has been a good and helpful step-mother.

Mr. Henderson was a good soldier, belonging to the Alabama Regiment. Two of his soldier friends helped to enjoy the great dinner which was so carefully prepared in a nice cool shade in the yard. The cake that grandmother baked was delicious. Everyone present seemed to enjoy the day. After refreshments were served all enjoyed some nice string and vocal music.

Obituary of Edmund Waller Henderson

E.W. Henderson was born April 28, 1839 and died Sunday morning March 18 1917, lacking a little more than a month of being 78 years old. While a youth he joined Bethel Baptist Church near Ralph, Tuscaloosa County. He was a confederate veteran, member of the 36th Alabama Regiment, Company B and served faithfully through the war of 1861-1865 between the states of the North and South. He became a member of Beulah Baptist Church by letter November 1877 and served efficiently as a deacon and also as church clerk for many years. He was frail and in poor health for a long period but was regular in attendance upon service of his church at all times when physically able. Many will remember his presence at church oftentimes when he was barely able to walk or to stand. He endured hardness as a good soldier of his country. And, as his pastor for seven years I can testify that he made a good soldier of Jesus Christ. He served whom he had believed and was persuaded that he was able to keep that which he had committed unto him against that day.

He is survived by his wife, five sons and one daughter, 40 grand children and one great-grand child.

Loved ones emulate his noble example and in the end may each of you enter into the rest that remaineth for the people of God as he has now passed over the river and rests under the shade of the trees. Signed J.D. Cook, April 4 1917



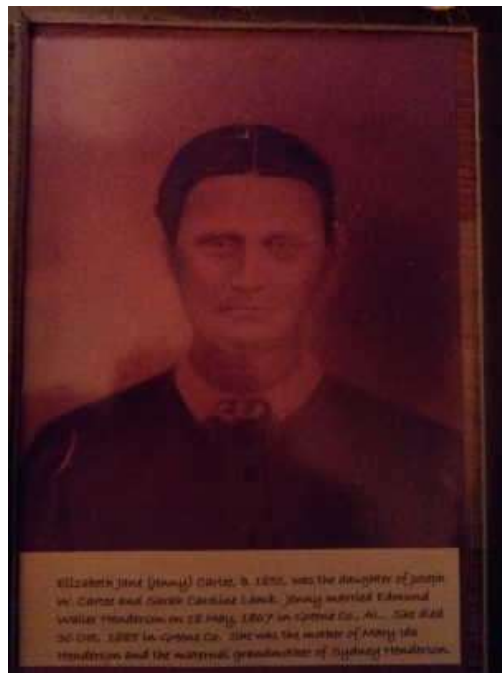
