OBITUARY

Robert Henry entered Eternal Rest Sunday evening, May 27, 1990, at the Veterans Hospital, Columbia, South Carolina.

Affectionately known as "Pop," he was born in Fairfield County, South Carolina, September 6, 1886, a son of the late James Henry and Mary Stall Henry.

A dedicated churchworker, Robert Henry's service to St. John A.M.E. Church dates to the church's beginning. He was the oldest member and "Father of the Church." He served as Chairman and Chairman Emeritus of the Trustee Board, Class Leader, Treasurer and in many other capacities in the church, including oral church historian for younger members of the church.

He was an employee of Uniroyal, retiring after fifty-six years of continuous service, and a veteran of World War I.

Mr. Henry was married to the late Mrs. Louise Ford Henry. Born to this union were six children; four daughters, Mrs. Bobbie Rabb and Mrs. Florence Harrison of Hartford, Connecticut, Mrs. Myrtle Richmond and Mrs. Thelma Gladney of Winnsboro, SC; two sons, Robert W. Henry of Hartford, Conn. and Taft Henry of Winnsboro; one brother, John W. Henry, Sr. of Winnsboro; five sisters-in-law, two brothers-in-law; twenty-nine grandchildren, forty great-grandchildren, thirty-nine great-great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and other relatives and friends.

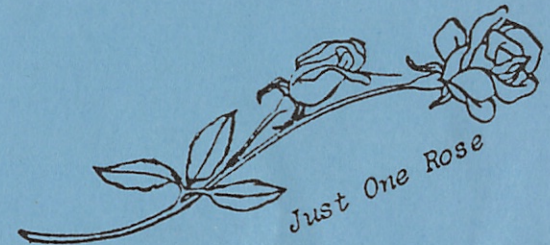
