

Genealogy of the Hicklin Family -  
 (From a sketch by J. C. Hicklin, son  
 of Zachariah and Sarah Cloud Hicklin,  
 and grand son of William Hicklin).

Arthur Hicklin, from Tyrone, Ireland  
 settled in Pa., thence to Lancaster  
 County, S. C., between 1750 and 1761. He was  
 buried in the Hicklin graveyard, now owned  
 by Daniel Brown, about one mile from  
 Browns Ferry. He had five sons, viz:  
 George, William, Arthur, Hugh and John -  
 They served in the Revolutionary War -  
 Arthur and John were killed in the  
 battle of Hanging Rock.

William was born in 1734 in Ireland  
 Died Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>, 1819, aged 85 years - Sarah  
 Isbel, wife of William Hicklin, died July  
 29<sup>th</sup>, 1841 - She lived to be about 93 years old.

The sons of William & Sarah Isbel Hicklin  
 were:

Jason, Hugh, Zachariah, William, Arthur  
 and Reubin.

The Hicklin Family (by L. M. Ford, who married Jane Atwood Hicklin)

This family is of Scotch ~~Irish~~ origin. On account of persecutions received in Scotland, Arthur Hicklin left his home (native land) and settled in Tyrone Ireland, probably about 1730. After a residence here of more than 20 years, the times were again stormy, so much so that he concluded to go to America where he might serve God in his own way, under his own vine and fig tree.

Sometime in the decade of 1750-1760 which nearly desecrated Ireland.

Arthur Hicklin brought his family over, and settled in Lancaster, Pa - it is not

thought that he tarried long at this place. He came to South Carolina, and settled in Lancaster County, taking up a large body of land along the eastern bank of the Catawba River at Brown's Ferry.

The name of Arthur Hicklin's wife is not known. It is likely that he was married before he left Scotland. His children were: George, William, Arthur, Hugh, John and Elizabeth.

Some years of peace were spent in the forest, but "dogs of war" were turned loose, and the Revolution was on hand. Having some experience in the treatment by the Royal Government, the sons of Arthur Hicklin, one and all, soon decided on which side they would serve - so the Whigs were strengthened by the five sons of Arthur Hicklin. Arthur, Jr., Hugh and John lost their lives in fighting for their country. One fell at Hanging Rock, another at Eutaw Springs, and still another was so badly wounded in the latter battle, that he died. Arthur, Jr., lost two daughters who were reared by their Uncle George Hicklin (his brother). One daughter married Henry Cole - the other daughter

married a Williams - a daughter of Henry Cole, married Capt. Nathaniel Van Landingham of Lancaster County, and left children. He was an ardent Methodist, and is said to have been the first Class Leader in the new country. His Bible and a hymn book are still preserved among the descendants of Henry Cole.

Elizabeth (only dau.) of Arthur Hicklin married George Hammond. They lived in the southern part of Lancaster County, and nothing is known of their descendants.

William Hicklin, son of Arthur Hicklin, a Whig soldier in the Revolution and progenitor of all the Hicklins in Chester County, was born in County Tyrone, Ireland in 1734. He married Sarah Isbel, probably in Ireland. Sarah Isbel, (his wife) was a sister of Littleton Isbel, a brave and noted Whig soldier in the Revolution, and who has descendants in Kershaw and the counties of South Carolina.

William Hicklin and Sarah Isbel Hicklin's children were: Jason, Hugh, Arthur, Zachariah, William II, Reuben and Sarah.

Zachariah espoused Sarah Cloud, daughter of James Cloud and his wife Jane McLeown, or

Aug. 5<sup>th</sup>, 1801. Their children were: Jason Isabel, who espoused Isabella Ferguson; Hugh married Margaret Towze; James Cloud,<sup>M.D.</sup> married Rebecca Douglass; Jane Hicklin, James Williamson Hicklin, Elizabeth and John Hall Hicklin -

Hugh (William II brother) m<sup>d</sup>. Mary Cloud, a sister of his brother Zachariah's wife, Sarah, in 1812. Their children were: James C., William C., Charles B., and Mary Hicklin. All of Hugh's children went west, except James C. (Cloud, 3 imagine) (Hall), who espoused Rebecca Poag. One of Hugh's sons was a professor in the Mobile Medical College, for years.

William Hicklin, II, married Sarah Heath, who bore to them, Charlotte, who married John Bea Buchanan; Nancy married George Heath; <sup>3</sup>Elizabeth married Chappel Russell; <sup>4</sup>Sarah, <sup>5</sup>Peter Hardin; <sup>6</sup>William James (M. D.) was twice married. 1<sup>st</sup> Malissa Atwood McCreary, 2<sup>nd</sup> Martha Gaston McCreary, <sup>3</sup>Malvina Adelaide Guthrie <sup>wife # 1 + 2 were sisters</sup>.

7. Jason and Arthur, were never married. Both were men of intelligence and possessed of much business tact. They were partners in their undertakings and prospered. They built the first Mill at Thornes old Mill site on Fishing Creek - This, they sold to

Charles Thorne, and ever since, it has gone by Thorne's name. They owned the home place of the late Dr. William C. Cloud, and did a mercantile business there until Arthur's death. Then all their joint holdings were sold, and Jason went to Lancaster and opened a new store, and later he established another at Camden - these he continued until his death. In addition to his mercantile business, he had a considerable estate in land and negroes -

After William's children became some size, there being no church near the old homestead in Lancaster County, ~~he either removed~~ he bought a tract of land near Catholic Church and either removed so that all the family could attend church worship. This was his home for many years. His children grew up, and as fast as they became of age, they were given a portion of the old homestead in Lancaster; until all were provided for except the two youngest. Then he sold the tract of land near Catholic, and with his wife (Sarah Isabell Hicklin) and two youngest children, Reuben and Sarah, went to Washington County, Ga. Altho Reuben died quite a young man, he arose to some prominence and was quite popular. He was a member of the Georgia

Beaufort, S.C.  
Legislature at the time of his death - He  
never married -

Sarah Hicklin (dau. of William I, + Sarah 2nd Hicklin)  
married Reuben Hall, and may have  
descendants in Georgia.

Much of the life of William Hicklin was stormy. He spent his young manhood in Ireland, where the Catholics brought on personal difficulties with the Protestants. They were hard fought, and sometimes to the death of one of the parties, and besides, the Government persecuted them. No doubt he thought the wild woods of America would furnish him a peaceful retreat for life. Not many years elapsed before the Revolutionary storms began. Besides battling for the Royal Army, many of the neighbors joined and helped King George make slaves of themselves and others. He lost three brothers in a battle, which no doubt caused him much grief and sorrow. That he loved his children is proven by his leaving a large tract of good land and moving to a small poor one, for their benefit. His body reposes in Washington County, Georgia.

Note: This Mr. Ford, married Jane Atwood Hicklin, some years after he wrote this sketch, however - how-

ever, he had taught school in Chester County all of his life and had access to family Bibles and to the burying grounds, so this account is fairly accurate, and would be valuable, if he had set down all the dates -
