This data has been compiled by me from the South Carolina
State Archives in Columbia...Plus some data sent to me by
each of the clients..plus some additional data which will
later be added as it is taken from the various S.C. County
Seats...The surname is spelled as

WOODARD and WOODWARD

and the first form is used by some Woodward Families and
mainly in the coastal areas of S.C.

The wide margin is for punching and for a binder...The
margin numbers are for cross references...This work is what I
term a "Kittypot" in that each client takes a carbon copy as
a work sheet...Then as the study goes forward, each client is
to make her comments on any item number which she thinks may
help in clearing her line...The Archives data is far from
complete and has to be aided by work in the county seat court
houses...The will abstracts are from the WPA copies, on file
here in Columbia. I usually find these with the original
wills on file in the county court houses. Also in the files
with the original wills are usually some very helpful data
which supplements the wills.

Mrs. Pauline Woodward of Indianapolis, is not in this
kittypot..she came to Columbia and engaged me to work with
her in trying to find the WOODWARD lineage for her two
daughters...I will add this data to the paper however for it
may give an excellent clue for some of you...Mrs. Pauline

Woodward was originally from New Orleans, La...She married WILLIAM ARCHIBALD WOODWARD, a native of Barnwell County S.C. and a former resident of Columbia, S.C....He was born 18 May 1885 and by his marriage to Mrs. Pauline Woodward had issue of two daughters and it is their lineage Mrs. Woodward was trying to prove...Her Woodward line removed from Fairfield Co., S.C. to Barnwell ca. 1800...The famous writer Woodward of Aiken S.C., who died recently, was of the same family.

7. THOMAS WOODWARD, the Regulator, wed 1st Jemima Collins and wed 2nd Mrs. Elizabeth May nee Stokes...Later data shows her as Mrs. May nee Simpson.

This data clarifies itself later on when I type the main data of Mrs. Pauline Woodward as made from our findings.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The above genealogy that implies that Richard Woodward was son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward is wrong...I notice that Andrea stopped short of saying Richard Woodward was son of Thomas, (Regulator) Woodward...HE WAS NOT. Thomas was my 5th great grandfather and he had no son named Richard...

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr...The above is wrong| Ellen Woodward not same as daughter of John Woodward, thus not part of Regulator's line. Also father of Thomas was not, repeat was not Abraham Woodward....I have documentary proof of this fact....Reference: "Annapolis Maryland Families" by Robert Henry McIntire (from Parish records) shows that the Thomas Woodward, that was son of Abraham Woodward, was not born until March 10, 1732 and died in April of 1799, which was about 20 years after the Regulator was killed (May 12, 1779 in S.C.).

Mrs. Julian L. Johnson sent me her chart but not her lineage. ELIZABETH WOODWARD, born 2 April 1808 and married 16 December 1828 to Andrew M. Hanns of Fairfield Co., S.C....She was probably the daughter of GEORGE WOODWARD who died ca. 1811.

8 LAND GRANTS FROM LORD PROPRIETORS OF S.C.

The Lords had control of S.C. from 1669 to 1720, but not until 1728 was the Province made a ROYAL COLONY....save for a short interval ca. 1711.

11. COLONIAL COUNTIES
South Carolina had four Colonial Counties...Granville,

Colleton, Berkeley and CRAVEN....Each county began at the Atlantic Ocean and went to the North Carolina State Line entirely across the state....CHARLESTON was the county seat for each of these four counties...ALL South Carolina Records up to the REVOLUTION (some as late as 1785) are to be found in the Court House at Charleston.

The Regulators had as one cause of their uprisings, this fact that all of the up-country folks had to journey to CHARLESTON to have their legal papers, deeds, wills and estates recorded in Charleston.

11-b

During the time that S.C. was a ROYAL COLONY, the land was allotted by head rights...A man as head of the house got 100 acres some years and other years got 50 acres...Then for a wife he got 50 acres more...for each child or dependent under the age of 16 years, he was allowed 50 acres for each of these...Up to ca. 1752 he was allowed lands for slaves or servants...Each boy or single girl could take either 50 acres or 100 acres (Depending on which year) for him or herself as a grant...No married woman unless a widow could take a land grant from the King...Often additional land was granted for "Increase in Family" and 50 acres for each new son or daughter born after the original grant...Often a man if a surveyor was paid in land...OFTEN a man who came in late was not able to find any free land where he wanted to settle and hence he bought land rather than take a grant...STUDY carefully the land grants and you can estimate the number in a family.

Lands which were original grants or sold to someone else...Had a special tag and was called a "MEMORIAL."

13 LANDS

Lands granted after the Revolution were not by head rights. Where ever free land was available, a man could apply for the land and if he paid for the surveying and costs of title, the land was granted.

The REV. WILLIAM WOODWARD, as an early Baptist minister in S.C. is mentioned several times in the History of the baptist of S.C...He shows as a Chaplain during the Revolution...in 1791 he was Pastor of the Sandy Run Baptist Church which later became known as Woodward's Church...i.e..the lower branch... Because of the long distance from upper Sandy Run Meeting House, a meeting was organized at lower Sandy Run in Fairfield and this is the meeting house which became known as Woodward's (Meeting House). Rev. WILLIAM WOODWARD was pastor of this lower church until his death. (In 1820)

THOMAS WOODWARD was born near Annapolis, Maryland...He was married twice...His first wife bore him several children and died..Thomas Woodward then removed to Fairfax County Virginia and there wed a Scotch lady, Elizabeth Simpson, who bore him one son, THOMAS WOODWARD JR. who at the age of 46 years removed to S.C. He was the famed REGULATOR...(See land grants # 14 where a 1st land grant in what is now Fairfield County S.C. was dated 22 January 1759.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The above information is very important but incorrect in this fact....The mother of Thomas Woodward (Regulator) was named MARY SIMPSON and not Elizabeth...She and her children, Thomas & Ann, were named in the will of THOMAS SIMPSON, deceased, of Prince William County Virginia. Thomas Simpson was a Scotsman...and the only known Woodward to be in that area at the proper time was a JOHN WOODWARD. Note that Thomas (Regulator) Woodward named his 1st son John and not Thomas...indicating his father was named John...Also MARY SIMPSON WOODWARD, was named as a 2nd wife of JOHN ROBERTSON, whom Elizabeth Simpson Woodward was said to have married. The above data was arrived at from land deeds and the will of Thomas Simpson.

THOMAS WOODWARD, the Regulator ...Many of the early and also later histories of S.C. have much on the Regulator, THOMAS WOODWARD, who in the year 1764 with Joseph Kirkland and Barnaby Pope, organized the Regulators in what is now Fairfield Co., S.C.

CAPTAIN THOMAS WOODWARD in the Revolution...There is much written data on him and his company...His company was known as "The Rangers"..His superior officers were Lt. Col. William Thompson of Orangeburg and Major James Mayson...Capt. Thomas Woodward was commissioned 18 June 1775 and was killed by Tories in May of 1779. He had resigned as Captain in the 3rd S.C. Continental Regiment on 30 January 1779....His eldest son, JOHN WOODWARD succeeded as Captain of the Rangers....

Note by Andrea: I have visited the grave and Family Cemetery of Captain Thomas Woodward on the Road from Ridgeway to Winnsboro, S.C.....I copied all grave inscriptions several years ago but I cannot locate that copy I made...There was a large marker erected at the grave of Captain Thomas Woodward some decades ago and it still stands.

THOMAS WOODWARD (1698-1779) was born in Fairfax County, Virginia and died in Fairfield County S.C....He wed twice...First to JEMIMA COLLINS and 2nd to RACHEL STARR...He had two sons: John Woodward and William Woodward and also had four daughters.

Note by Robert Hill Sr: Incorrect. Thomas Woodward (The Regulator) was born in 1729, he did marry Jemima Collins, and had the above children BUT his 2nd marriage was not to Rachel Starr, but to a widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Stokes May and they had 6 more children, all in S.C.

JOHN WOODWARD (son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward & Jemima Collins) lived to an advanced age....He was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. on 1 July 1775 at the age of 28 years, having been born in 1747 in Fairfax County Virginia...He died in 1817...He married in 1772 to Esther McDonald and had two sons: Osmond Woodward (1795-1863) married Martha Williamson and John Woodward, who married Martha (Patsy) Axem.

Jemima Woodward m. Thomas Hill (NOTE BY ROBERT HILL: This is wrong...Jemima Woodward was a daughter of William Woodward & Nancy Barrett, and was a grand daughter of Thomas & Jemima Woodward.

Nancy Woodward m. Robert Rabb.

Perhaps a study may find the other daughters...Many students of Woodward data place RICHARD WOODWARD (# 52) as a son of Jemima. (NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: This was not so).

CHARNEL DURHAM...Born 1 July 1753 in Virginia and was a son of John Durham and a brother of Joshua Durham...He died 13 April 1836...He moved to S.C. before the Revolution and

resided near a village called Monticello...He enlisted for service in Winnsboro as a Private under Col. David Hopkins. He was captured by the Tories in 1780...Pension was allowed...He was married 2 January 1777 to NANCY ECKLES or ICHOLE and she died 1 June 1840...Children:

Lucrecy Durham, born 30 Sept. 1778 and wed John Ford.

John Durham, born 2 August 1782...(see # 51 wed Cynthia Woodward).

Robert Winfield Durham born 10 September 1784.

Add this date in # 28-j.....He first moved to Green County Alabama from Fairfield County S.C. and later came to Winston County, Miss..His aunt, Mrs. LIVICIA SMITH WOODWARD, a widow, moved with him to Miss., bringing with her, her children...27 December 1848 in the Louisville Lodge # 75 F.&A.M. the petitions of NATHANIEL WOODWARD and of William McMillin were received and read...The children of NATHANIEL WOODWARD recall their father stating that his father, GEORGE WOODWARD, died when Nathaniel was aged 10 years.

Some students of Woodward data state that George Woodward was a son of RICHARD WOODWARD (# 52)...This will have to be studied in detail in Winnsboro....Andrew W. Hanna was born 7 May 1807. The Hannah Family came from Fairfield Co. S.C.

CHARLES WOODWARD....His estate Admst. 3 Jan. 1814 by his

widow KEZIAH WOODWARD and her bond signed by Charles Woodward and James Woodward...No list of heirs in this file.

Whether James & Richard are the only sons of Mrs. Keziah Woodward is not clear from this deed...KEZIAH WOODWARD was a sister in law of JAMES WOODWARD, according to family data...Her Old Family Cemetery is near the town of Williston, S.C.

James Woodward Sr...had land grant there 7 March 1814.

James Woodward Jr. had a land grant 3 July 1820.

William Woodward had a land grant 7 Feb. 1814.

Charles Woodward had a land grant 3 Sept. 1797.

James Woodward Sr. wed Annie Fasly or Feasler...She is buried at Rosemary Baptist Church and her tombstone reads.."ANNIE/ Wife of James Woodward/ Died 10 August 1887/ Age 93." This makes her born in ca. 1794...This James Woodward was the youngest son of RICHARD WOODWARD (# 57) of Fairfield County S.C.

74 DATA (RECEIVED) FROM MRS. PAULINE WOODWARD.

RICHARD WOODWARD was a son of Thomas Woodward, the Regulator, by his 2nd wife nee Elizabeth Stokes (Mays)...Richard Woodward had James Woodward, youngest m. Annie Feaster. George Woodward m. _____Morgan. Margaret Woodward...died single and see (# 50). John Woodward (# 53). Charles Woodward m. Keziah_____?

I shall have to examine all of this data in Winnsboro to see if the above is correct.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The above is WRONG! Richard Woodward was not, repeat WAS NOT the son of Thomas Woodward, known as the Regulator. The Regulator and his 2nd wife Elizabeth Stokes May had no child by the name of Richard Woodward. It appears that Mrs. Johnson, as have others, has confused the father of Richard (THOMAS WOODWARD) mixed up with Thomas Woodward, known as the Regulator. I suspect the Thomas Woodward, father of Richard, was another Thomas Woodward, who came from N.C. (was a Private in Revolutionary Soldier in N.C.) to Camden District and who died in 1781. The Regulator died in 1779 and was a Captain.

THOMAS WOODWARD (# 42)...Some students of Woodward data set forth the data that this Thomas Woodward and 2nd wife Elizabeth Simpson came into Camden District S.C. from Fairfax County Virginia. That he is the father of Thomas Woodward, the Regulator...They state this Thomas Woodward was born 1698 and died 1782 aged 84 years...They state he is the Thomas Woodward who gave land for High Hills Church (# 24). I do know that he resided in that locality...Can either of you give further light on this?

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Again another error on the genealogy of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward! It appears that the problem with the Woodward genealogy stems from statements made by Thomas Simpson Woodward, a grandson of the Regulator. Those statements are in a Book entitled "REMINISCENCES OF THE CREEK-MUSKOGEE NATION" by Thomas Simpson Woodward...He states that the father of the Regulator was Thomas Woodward of Maryland, who had a Maryland wife and she died...Thomas went to Fairfax County Virginia and remarried a 2nd time to ELIZABETH SIMPSON, and had a son also named Thomas (who later became known as the "Regulator). Most people have zeroed in on Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham Woodward of Annapolis, Md. as the father but this was impossible for the following reasons.

Reference "Annapolis Maryland Families" by Robert Harry McIntire, page 783, The Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham and supposedly father of the Regulator, was born on March 10th, 1785...some 6 years AFTER the death of the Regulator in 1779. That Thomas Woodward (son of Abraham and supposedly father of the Regulator, was supposed to have married 1st to MARGARET (WATERS) IJAMS, dau. of Mordecai & Rachel Waters. His 2nd marriage was supposed to have been to Elizabeth Simpson, daughter of a Scotsman, Thomas Simpson.

Now the problem with this is that Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham & supposedly father of the Regulator, by his 2nd marriage, did not even marry the 1st time until 21 February 1778, just a year BEFORE the death of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward in S.C. The Thomas Woodward, supposedly father of the Regulator, died in April of 1799.

Thomas (Regulator) Woodward was born ca. 1719 and died 12 May 1779...making it absolutely impossible for this THOMAS WOODWARD to be the father of the Regulator.

A close inspection of the area around Fairfax County Virginia, shows only one male Woodward in the area, and that was a JOHN WOODWARD, who was a blacksmith. Also it should be noted that THOMAS (REGULATOR) WOODWARD named his 1st son, JOHN, which in these times, was usually named after the

paternal grandfather. No son was named Thomas by the Regulator until his 7th child (first by 2nd marriage to Elizabeth Stokes Mays) was named Thomas. (He was the father of Thomas Simpson Woodward, who wrote "Reminiscences").

CONCLUSION....Thomas Woodward's, know as the Regulator, was the son of MARY SIMPSON WOODWARD, believed to be the wife of JOHN WOODWARD....John, father of the Regulator died in Virginia and his widow (mother of the Regulator) remarried to John Robertson in Virginia. The above information is WRONG!

JAMES ALLEN WOODWARD was a son of James Woodward Sr...James A. Woodward wed Louisa Walker, a daughter of the Rev. N.W. Walker.

a. The REV. SAMUEL WOODWARD helped found the Williston Baptist Church in 1857...He was brother of James A. Woodward.

b. CHARLES WOODWARD in 1815 shows as a buyer at the sale of the Johnson & Tool Estate.

c. RICHARD WOODWARD bought at sale of Mrs. Mary Johnson Estate in 1815.

d. WILLIAM LUCIUS WOODWARD was a soldier in the Confederate Army from Barnwell County.

e. ELIZABETH WOODWARD nee Simpson died at the age of 114 years and she was the mother of THOMAS WOODWARD, the REGULATOR. She died not state where she got this information. (Note by Robert Hill Sr: These Woodwards were not part of the Barnwell County Woodwards but instead was the "Regulator" in Fairfield County).

f. JAMES WOODWARD JR. wed first to Alice Walker and then to Louisa Walker, who was the mother of the children, one of who was William Lucius Woodward, who wed three times. One wife being Margaret McLemore, who was mother of John Bunyan Woodward.

g. THOMAS WOODWARD, The Regulator, had by his first wife, Jemima Collins, 3 sons and four daughters...He had by his 2nd wife Elizabeth May nee Stokes, 3 sons and 3 daughters...She did not state where she got this data.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Not of the Woodwards of Barnwell County but of Fairfield County. Again, another mistake on the family & genealogy of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward on the part of an individual, who appears to be trying to connect her self to Thomas (Regulator) Woodward! Thomas Woodward, the Regulator, DID NOT have 3 sons by Jemima Collins, he had 2

sons and 4 daughters...the sons being John, and Rev. William Woodward (b. 1762) and who was the youngest of their children. He also did not have a son Richard by 2nd wife...

h. WILLIAM LUCIUS WOODWARD wed 1st to Margaret MeLemore ...wed 2nd time to Annie Hartzog...Wed 3rd time to Hally Black.

i. COMMENT BY ANDREA.....I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT ELIZABETH WOODWARD WILL #48 IS WIDOW OF THE REGULATOR....I MAY BE MISTAKEN HOWEVER. I WILL HAVE TO STUDY FURTHER.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL SR: REFERENCE TO ABOVE COMMENTS BY ANDREA...HE WAS WRONG! THE WILL LISTED AS # 48 WAS INDEED THE WILL OF ELIZABETH STOKES MAYS WOODWARD, THE 2ND WIFE, A WIDOW OF THOMAS (REGULATOR) WOODWARD.

j. The Will of JAMES WOODWARD # 39 of Horry County S.C. is also on file in Fairfield County...His 2nd wife was a widow, Mary Killingsworth (see # 43)...I do not know how Mrs. Pauline Woodward got this data.

k. JONATHAN COURTNEY wed Cecilia McQueen, a native of Scotland and was the son of Jonathan Sr. who had brothers: William Martin & John Courtney....Jonathan Courtney Jr. wed Cecilia McQueen and they had a son Jonathan Courtney III., who wed Nancy Brooks, daughter of Ebenezer Brooks and wife Nancy Vutler...They had a daughter, Martha Courtney, who wed William Archibald Baughman. (Question by Robert Hill: How does this relate to the Woodwards)?

l. JAMES ALLEN WOODWARD by 2nd wife, Louisa Walker, had the following children: William Lucius Woodward; Paul Woodward; Josiah Woodward; Lizzie m. Howard; Fuller Woodward; Rev. Samuel Woodward; James Woodward & Narcissa.

m. ANNIE FEASTER or Feasler, wife of James Woodward Sr. is often shown in Barnwell data as NANCY rather than as Annie.

n. Children of Annie Feaster Woodward & James Woodward were: James A.; John; Uriah; Hezekiah; Joseph; Judith; Tabitha....She did not state where she got these names.

Back to MRS. ELIZABETH STOKES MAY WOODWARD (# 48) IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY....She shows in 1790 Census as a widow...She IS NOT the widow of THOMAS WOODWARD (# 42) since the children do not tally...I will check further in Fairfield on her to see if the widow of the Regulator.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Andrea was wrong in his assessment on the Elizabeth Woodward (# 48)...she WAS the widow and 2nd wife of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward! Do not understand

Andrea's assessment here. The reason why the children probably did not "TALLY" (by Andrea) was that the children named in that will were her's by her marriage to the Regulator..and none of his children by his 1st marriage (to Jemima Collins) was listed..BUT in # 48, note she stated lands between Woodward children to be divided equally...while May lands to be equally divided among her Mays children, who's father was her first husband, John Mays.

THOMAS WOODWARD...He likely had an estate...He was dead when his mother made her will on 12 August 1802...From the Will of Henry Woodward (# 49) we know three of the children of this Thomas...Thomas Woodward; Joseph H. Woodward & Elizabeth Woodward.

There may have been other children of this Thomas.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The son Thomas Woodward, deceased, and who is mentioned above, was married ca. 1791 to MARY HOWARD in Elbert County Georgia. MARY HOWARD, b. ca. 1774 in Union County S.C., was daughter of Nehemiah Howard & Edith Smith.

Her husband, Thomas Woodward, was the oldest of 6 children born to Thomas (Regulator) Woodward and his 2nd wife "Elizabeth Stokes May." He was born in Fairfield County S.C. His death occurred on 23 March 1800. MARY (HOWARD) WOODWARD remarried again to James Barrat in 1802, and they had two more children. (Reference "Nehemiah Howard & His Family," pages 87-89 by Rebecca Echols Terry).

Data on the other children: Mary Elizabeth Woodward, born 1792 Elbert Co., Ga.-d. in November 1833, married General James C. Watson...they had 9 children.

Thomas (Regulator) Woodward & 2nd wife Elizabeth Stokes May had a son Thomas Woodward who married Mary Howard. They were the parents of General Thomas Simpson Woodward. They had no connection to the Woodwards of Barnwell County, S.C. General Thomas Simpson Woodward, born 22 February 1794 in Elbert County Ga., married Sarah Ann Dubose. He died 1861 in Winn Parish, Louisiana. He was the one that wrote several letters with genealogy data on his grandfather, the Regulator, that later was printed in newspapers as a series of articles and eventually in book form known as "Reminiscences." Some of that data was wrong! He had 3 children:

Thomas Andrew Woodward, b. 2 June 1821, d. 1862 in Louisiana. He married Louisa Griggs and they had 2 children (both born in Ark.) and both died early in life.

Bernice Woodward, died just before she was to marry.

John Woodward died at age 25 unmarried.

Joseph H. Woodward, born 22 February 1797 and died as a child. (Not too sure of this statement...he was named in mother's 1802 will).

James Barrat Jr. born ca. 1803 & Nancy Barrat born ca. 1805 were children of MARY HOWARD WOODWARD & HER 2ND HUSBAND JAMES BARRAT.

Back to THOMAS WOODWARD (3 & 42)....I do not think this is the father of Thomas, the Regulator, since in this will he lists as executor of his will, son Thomas Woodward Jr. and we know the Regulator was dead in 1782.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Andrea was right, also the father of the Regulator is suspected to be a JOHN WODDWARD.
