This data has been compiled by me from the South Carolina  
State Archives in Columbia...Plus some data sent to me by  
each of the clients..plus some additional data which will  
later be added as it is taken from the various S.C. County  
Seats...The surname is spelled as

WOODARD and WOODWARD

and the first form is used by some Woodward Families and  
mainly in the coastal areas of S.C.

The wide margin is for punching and for a binder...The  
margin numbers are for cross references...This work is what I  
term a "Kittypot" in that each client takes a carbon copy as  
a work sheet...Then as the study goes forward, each client is  
to make her comments on any item number which she thinks may  
help in clearing her line...The Archives data is far from  
complete and has to be aided by work in the county seat court  
houses...The will abstracts are from the WPA copies, on file  
here in Columbia. I usually find these with the original  
wills on file in the county court houses. Also in the files  
with the original wills are usually some very helpful data  
which supplements the wills.

Mrs. Pauline Woodward of Indianapolis, is not in this  
kittypot..she came to Columbia and engaged me to work with  
her in trying to find the WOODWARD lineage for her two  
daughters...I will add this data to the paper however for it

may give an excellent clue for some of you...Mrs. Pauline Woodward was originally from New Orleans, La...She married WILLIAM ARCHIBALD WOODWARD, a native of Barnwell County S.C. and a former resident of Columbia, S.C....He was born 18 May 1885 and by his marriage to Mrs. Pauline Woodward had issue of two daughters and it is their lineage Mrs. Woodward was trying to prove...Her Woodward line removed from Fairfield Co., S.C. to Barnwell ca. 1800...The famous writer Woodward of Aiken S.C., who died recently, was of the same family.

7. THOMAS WOODWARD, the Regulator, wed 1st Jemima Collins and wed 2nd Mrs. Elizabeth May nee Stokes...Later data shows her as Mrs. May nee Simpson.

This data clarifies itself later on when I type the main data of Mrs. Pauline Woodward as made from our findings.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The above genealogy that implies that Richard Woodward was son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward is wrong...I notice that Andrea stopped short of saying Richard Woodward was son of Thomas, (Regulator) Woodward...HE WAS NOT. Thomas was my 5th great grandfather and he had no son named Richard...

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr...The above is wrong| Ellen Woodward not same as daughter of John Woodward, thus not part of Regulator's line. Also father of Thomas was not, repeat was not Abraham Woodward....I have documentary proof of this fact....Reference: "Annapolis Maryland Families" by Robert Henry McIntire (from Parish records) shows that the Thomas Woodward, that was son of Abraham Woodward, was not born until March 10, 1732 and died in April of 1799, which was about 20 years after the Regulator was killed (May 12, 1779 in S.C.).

#### LAND GRANTS FROM LORD PROPRIETORS OF S.C.

The Lords had control of S.C. from 1669 to 1720, but not until 1728 was the Province made a ROYAL COLONY....save for a short interval ca. 1711.

11. COLONIAL COUNTIES

South Carolina had four Colonial Counties...Granville, Colleton, Berkeley and CRAVEN...Each county began at the Atlantic Ocean and went to the North Carolina State Line entirely across the state.....CHARLESTON was the county seat for each of these four counties...ALL South Carolina Records up to the REVOLUTION (some as late as 1785) are to be found in the Court House at Charleston.

The Regulators had as one cause of their uprisings, this fact that all of the up-country folks had to journey to CHARLESTON to have their legal papers, deeds, wills and estates recorded in Charleston.

11-b

During the time that S.C. was a ROYAL COLONY, the land was allotted by head rights...A man as head of the house got 100 acres some years and other years got 50 acres...Then for a wife he got 50 acres more...for each child or dependent under the age of 16 years, he was allowed 50 acres for each of these...Up to ca. 1752 he was allowed lands for slaves or servants...Each boy or single girl could take either 50 acres or 100 acres (Depending on which year) for him or herself as a grant...No married woman unless a widow could take a land grant from the King...Often additional land was granted for "Increase in Family" and 50 acres for each new son or daughter born after the original grant...Often a man if a surveyor was paid in land...OFTEN a man who came in late was not able to find any free land where he wanted to settle and hence he bought land rather than take a grant...STUDY carefully the land grants and you can estimate the number in a family.

Lands which were original grants or sold to someone else...Had a special tag and was called a "MEMORIAL."

#### LANDS

Lands granted after the Revolution were not by head rights. Where ever free land was available, a man could apply for the land and if he paid for the surveying and costs of title, the land was granted.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL SR: Rev. William Woodward, my 4th great grandfather and son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward, helped to found this church and it is named after him. It is still an active church in 1987.

The REV. WILLIAM WOODWARD, as an early Baptist minister in S.C. is mentioned several times in the History of the baptist of S.C...He shows as a Chaplain during the Revolution...in 1791 he was Pastor of the Sandy Run Baptist Church which later became known as Woodward's Church...i.e..the lower branch... Because of the long distance from upper Sandy Run Meeting House, a meeting was organized at lower Sandy Run in Fairfield and this is the meeting house which became known as Woodward's (Meeting House). Rev. WILLIAM WOODWARD was pastor of this lower church until his death. (In 1820)

THOMAS WOODWARD was born near Annapolis, Maryland...He was married twice...His first wife bore him several children and died..Thomas Woodward then removed to Fairfax County Virginia and there wed a Scotch lady, Elizabeth Simpson, who bore him one son, THOMAS WOODWARD JR. who at the age of 46 years removed to S.C. He was the famed REGULATOR...(See land grants # 14 where a 1st land grant in what is now Fairfield County S.C. was dated 22 January 1759.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The above information is very important but incorrect in this fact....The mother of Thomas Woodward (Regulator) was named MARY SIMPSON and not Elizabeth...She and her children, Thomas & Ann, were named in the will of THOMAS SIMPSON, deceased, of Prince William County Virginia. Thomas Simpson was a Scotsman...and the only known Woodward to be in that area at the proper time was a JOHN WOODWARD. Note that Thomas (Regulator) Woodward named his 1st son John and not Thomas...indicating his father was named John...Also MARY SIMPSON WOODWARD, was named as a 2nd wife of JOHN ROBERTSON, whom Elizabeth Simpson Woodward was said to have married. The above data was arrived at from land deeds and the will of Thomas Simpson.

THOMAS WOODWARD, the Regulator ...Many of the early and also later histories of S.C. have much on the Regulator, THOMAS WOODWARD, who in the year 1764 with Joseph Kirkland and Barnaby Pope, organized the Regulators in what is now Fairfield Co., S.C.

CAPTAIN THOMAS WOODWARD in the Revolution...There is much written data on him and his company...His company was known as "The Rangers"..His superior officers were Lt. Col. William Thompson of Orangeburg and Major James Mayson...Capt. Thomas Woodward was commissioned 18 June 1775 and was killed by Tories in May of 1779. He had resigned as Captain in the 3rd S.C. Continental Regiment on 30 January 1779....His eldest

It appears that Mrs. Johnson, as have others, has confused the father of Richard (THOMAS WOODWARD) mixed up with Thomas Woodward, known as the Regulator. I suspect the Thomas Woodward, father of Richard, was another Thomas Woodward, who came from N.C. (was a Private in Revolutionary Soldier in N.C.) to Camden District and who died in 1781. The

That he is the father of Thomas Woodward, the Regulator...They state this Thomas Woodward was born 1698 and died 1782 aged 84 years...They state he is the Thomas Woodward who gave land for High Hills Church (# 24). I do know that he resided in that locality...Can either of you give further light on this?

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Again another error on the genealogy of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward! It appears that the problem with the Woodward genealogy stems from statements made by Thomas Simpson Woodward, a grandson of the Regulator. Those statements are in a Book entitled "REMINISCENCES OF THE CREEK-MUSKOGEE NATION" by Thomas Simpson Woodward...He states that the father of the Regulator was Thomas Woodward of Maryland, who had a Maryland wife and she died...Thomas went to Fairfax County Virginia and remarried a 2nd time to ELIZABETH SIMPSON, and had a son also named Thomas (who later became known as the "Regulator). Most people have zeroed in on Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham Woodward of Annapolis, Md. as the father but this was impossible for the following reasons.

Reference "Annapolis Maryland Families" by Robert Harry McIntire, page 783, The Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham and supposedly father of the Regulator, was born on March 10th, 1785...some 6 years AFTER the death of the Regulator in 1779. That Thomas Woodward (son of Abraham and supposedly father of the Regulator, was supposed to have married 1st to MARGARET (WATERS) IJAMS, dau. of Mordecai & Rachel Waters. His 2nd marriage was supposed to have been to Elizabeth Simpson, daughter of a Scotsman, Thomas Simpson.

Now the problem with this is that Thomas Woodward, son of Abraham & supposedly father of the Regulator, by his 2nd marriage, did not even marry the 1st time until 21 February 1778, just a year BEFORE the death of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward in S.C. The Thomas Woodward, supposedly father of the Regulator, died in April of 1799.

Thomas (Regulator) Woodward was born ca. 1719 and died 12 May 1779...making it absolutely impossible for this THOMAS WOODWARD to be the father of the Regulator.

A close inspection of the area around Fairfax County Virginia, shows only one male Woodward in the area, and that was a JOHN WOODWARD, who was a blacksmith. Also it should be noted that THOMAS (REGULATOR) WOODWARD named his 1st son,



Regulator, DID NOT have 3 sons by Jemima Collins, he had 2 sons and 4 daughters...the sons being John, and Rev. William Woodward (b. 1762) and who was the youngest of their children. He also did not have a son Richard by 2nd wife...

h. WILLIAM LUCIUS WOODWARD wed 1st to Margaret MeLemore ...wed 2nd time to Annie Hartzog...Wed 3rd time to Hally Black.

i. COMMENT BY ANDREA.....I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT ELIZABETH WOODWARD WILL #48 IS WIDOW OF THE REGULATOR....I MAY BE MISTAKEN HOWEVER. I WILL HAVE TO STUDY FURTHER.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL SR: REFERENCE TO ABOVE COMMENTS BY ANDREA...HE WAS WRONG! THE WILL LISTED AS # 48 WAS INDEED THE WILL OF ELIZABETH STOKES MAYS WOODWARD, THE 2ND WIFE, A WIDOW OF THOMAS (REGULATOR) WOODWARD.

j. The Will of JAMES WOODWARD # 39 of Horry County S.C. is also on file in Fairfield County...His 2nd wife was a widow, Mary Killingsworth (see # 43)...I do not know how Mrs. Pauline Woodward got this data.

k. JONATHAN COURTNEY wed Cecilia McQueen, a native of Scotland and was the son of Jonathan Sr. who had brothers: William Martin & John Courtney....Jonathan Courtney Jr. wed Cecilia McQueen and they had a son Jonathan Courtney III., who wed Nancy Brooks, daughter of Ebenezer Brooks and wife Nancy Vutler...They had a daughter, Martha Courtney, who wed William Archibald Baughman. (Question by Robert Hill: How does this relate to the Woodwards)?

l. JAMES ALLEN WOODWARD by 2nd wife, Louisa Walker, had the following children: William Lucius Woodward; Paul Woodward; Josiah Woodward; Lizzie m. Howard; Fuller Woodward; Rev. Samuel Woodward; James Woodward & Narcissa.

m. ANNIE FEASTER or Feasler, wife of James Woodward Sr. is often shown in Barnwell data as NANCY rather than as Annie.

n. Children of Annie Feaster Woodward & James Woodward were: James A.; John; Uriah; Hezikiah; Joseph; Judith; Tabitha....She did not state where she got these names.

77 (WOODWARD) MISCELLANY

Back to MRS. ELIZABETH STOKES MAY WOODWARD (# 48) IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY....She shows in 1790 Census as a widow...She IS NOT the widow of THOMAS WOODWARD (# 42) since the children do not tally...I will check further in Fairfield on her to see if the widow of the Regulator.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Andrea was wrong in his assessment on the Elizabeth Woodward ( # 48)...she WAS the widow and 2nd

wife of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward! Do not understand Andrea's assessment here. The reason why the children probably did not "TALLY" (by Andrea) was that the children named in that will were her's by her marriage to the Regulator..and none of his children by his 1st marriage (to Jemima Collins) was listed..BUT in # 48, note she stated lands between Woodward children to be divided equally..while May lands to be equally divided among her Mays children, who's father was her first husband, John Mays.

78 SON OF # 77s

THOMAS WOODWARD...He likely had an estate...He was dead when his mother made her will on 12 August 1802...From the Will of Henry Woodward (# 49) we know three of the children of this Thomas...Thomas Woodward; Joseph H. Woodward & Elizabeth Woodward.

There may have been other children of this Thomas.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The son Thomas Woodward, deceased, and who is mentioned above, was married ca. 1791 to MARY HOWARD in Elbert County Georgia. MARY HOWARD, b. ca. 1774 in Union County S.C., was daughter of Nehemiah Howard & Edith Smith.

Her husband, Thomas Woodward, was the oldest of 6 children born to Thomas (Regulator) Woodward and his 2nd wife "Elizabeth Stokes May." He was born in Fairfield County S.C. His death occurred on 23 March 1800. MARY (HOWARD) WOODWARD remarried again to James Barrat in 1802, and they had two more children. (Reference "Nehemiah Howard & His Family," pages 87-89 by Rebecca Echols Terry).

Data on the other children: Mary Elizabeth Woodward, born 1792 Elbert Co., Ga.-d. in November 1833, married General James C. Watson...they had 9 children.

Thomas (Regulator) Woodward & 2nd wife Elizabeth Stokes May had a son Thomas Woodward who married Mary Howard. They were the parents of General Thomas Simpson Woodward. They had no connection to the Woodwards of Barnwell County, S.C. General Thomas Simpson Woodward, born 22 February 1794 in Elbert County Ga., married Sarah Ann Dubose. He died 1861 in Winn Parish, Louisiana. He was the one that wrote several letters with genealogy data on his grandfather, the Regulator, that later was printed in newspapers as a series of articles and eventually in book form known as "Reminiscences." Some of that data was wrong! He had 3 children:

Thomas Andrew Woodward, b. 2 June 1821, d. 1862 in Louisiana. He married Louisa Griggs and they had 2 children (both born in Ark.) and both died early in life.

Bernice Woodward, died just before she was to

marry.

John Woodward died at age 25 unmarried.

Joseph H. Woodward, born 22 February 1797 and died as a child. (Not too sure of this statement...he was named in mother's 1802 will).

James Barrat Jr. born ca. 1803 & Nancy Barrat born ca. 1805 were children of MARY HOWARD WOODWARD & HER 2ND HUSBAND JAMES BARRAT.

Back to THOMAS WOODWARD (3 & 42)....I do not think this is the father of Thomas, the Regulator, since in this will he lists as executor of his will, son Thomas Woodward Jr. and we know the Regulator was dead in 1782.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Andrea was right, also the father of the Regulator is suspected to be a JOHN WODDWARD.

WILLIAM STROTHER (WOODWARD)/ Son of O. & M. WOODWARD/ Died 16 Oct. 1825/ Aged 5 mos. & 10 days.

The other two with stones were also children of Osmond & Martha Woodward...One other in this row had stone stolen. Graves by Thomas Woodward, The Regulator, and if these ever had any stones, they have been taken or destroyed by vandals...I imagine some of these graves were wife or wives. In next row and not in line with children of Osmond & Martha are two rock tombs of grown persons...Marble tops have been turned upside down by vandals...I was unable to lift these to return and read the inscriptions. Several marked graves but all of GADSDENS...They may have been related to Woodward...Many Gadsden stones are much later.

"Sacred to the memory of Nancy Woodward, relict of the late Reverend William Woodward, who departed this life August 10th, 1829, Age 62 years. (born 1767). (Note by Robert Hill: This was my 4th great grandmother).

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Captain Thomas Woodward was the same Thomas Woodward, known as the Regulator. I think it important here to understand how the name Regulator came about...It was because Thomas Woodward was one of the founders and leaders of the "Regulator Movement" in the early 1760's in S.C.

The "Regulators" were a group of citizens in the interior sections of S.C. that tried to get law and order restored to that part of the province...and finally after the official government failed to accomplish this...took matters into their hands and with "hard, swift punishment" succeeded in restoring peace and tranquility to there areas of the province of S.C. Thomas Woodward was a leader and for that reasons became known as Thomas "The Regulator" Woodward.

You leave Winnsboro over the Newberry Road...travel out that road for 7 miles to the Lebanon Presbyterian Church (In Fairfield Co.) and here you turn northwest toward Chester County line and over a hard surface road and travel this road a few miles to a farm house, where you turn into a dirt road and travel a couple of miles to a Negro house (ALL IN FAIRFIELD CO.) and inquire for the old cemetery....This cemetery may be the KEY but it may prove to be of no value...See # 121-c and others of this family where money was spent for tombstones...IF THIS old cemetery is where those tombstones were erected, then this is your family graveyard...I have no car to travel there and a taxi-cab is too expensive and then perhaps not find it to be your family after all.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: This year (1987) I inquired of this cemetery to Mrs. Mary Boulware, a genealogist in Fairfield Co., and she knew of it and it was (by her) referred to as the "RICHARD WOODWARD CEMETERY." She sent the following data from this cemetery:

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: THE statement that Elizabeth & Thomas Woodward (The Regulator) married in Virginia is wrong! They married in S.C. Reference: The book "REMINISCENCES" by Thomas Simpson Woodward (grandson of the Regulator) on page 125. Thomas Simpson Woodward stated in the book that Quote: "At the close of the French-Indian War he (The Regulator & his grandfather) was ordered to S.C., LEAVING HIS CHILDREN in Virginia." End of Quote...Now what Thomas was actually saying was that his grandfather the Regulator first came from Virginia to S.C. without his first wife (Jemima Collins) and their children...Actually Thomas (Regulator) went back and forth for visits between 1759 and 1763. On the next page 126, it states Quote: "After marrying my grandmother, (he) moved HIS mother & 2 half brother from Virginia to S.C." End of Quote. Woodward states QUOTE..."While in S.C. he (Thomas

Woodward) became acquainted with my grandmother (Elizabeth Stokes, who was his 2nd wife." Thomas Simpson Woodward's statement while true can be miss leading...they did marry BUT ONLY after Jemima Collins (1st wife of the Regulator) died in Virginia. NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: The compiler of this information has become very much confused with this Woodward family and that of Rev. William Woodward, son of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward. First of all Rev. William Woodward was a physician, Baptist Minister and member of Congress BUT he never moved out of South Carolina...Also he was married to Nancy Barrett...He never was married to Sarah Goree. Also there was no child named Henry Woodward in the family of Rev. William Woodward (my 4th great grand father)..Rev William Woodward died in Chester County on 23 July 1820. Someone is very much confused by connecting this person to the REV. WILLIAM WOODWARD.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Again Mr. Owen has his facts confused  
and perhaps he has confused the Regulator with another Thomas  
Woodward that lived in the same area of S.C....The Regulator  
was born and raised in Fairfax Co. Virginia, the son of John  
Woodward & Mary Simpson...He did not come to S.C. until ca.  
1763 after his 1st wife died in Va. The story of the three  
brothers coming to American seems to be true...they were sons  
of a wealthy London Merchant, William Woodward...BUT research  
in England (by myself and a paid genealogist in England, who  
did research for me, shows that the William Woodward, wealthy  
merchant in England, and who all three sons settled first in  
Maryland, have no connection to Thomas (Regulator) Woodward.

Col. John Jefferson Woodward was a lawyer and a planter...He  
was educated at Mt. Zion Institute at Winnsboro, S.C. and was  
later graduated from Columbia College (today's University of  
S.C.). ca. 1827.

He was admitted to the S.C. Bar in 1828 and engaged in  
planting...In 1837 he removed to Alabama and settled on a  
plantation in Talledaga County.

In 1845 he sold his plantation and began the practice of law in Talledaga and was also editor of the "Watchtower," a Democratic Newspaper....In 1847 he was elected to the Alabama State Legislature....In January 1849 he was elected as a Circuit Judge of Alabama.

During the Civil War he entered the service of the Confederate States of America as a Captain of the Davis Blues in the Tenth Alabama Regiment...He was made a Major soon after he arrived in Virginia and was later promoted to Colonel, which commission he held at his death on the Virginia Battlefield.

He was married in May 1830 in Winnsboro to Miss Rebecca Mary Pearson, a daughter of Phillip Edward Pearson & Rachel Lavinia Younge. Mr. Pearson was a lawyer in Winnsboro and his wife was a daughter of an Irishman, who was a Presbyterian minister and President of Mt. Zion Institute...(name not given).

This ends the notes by Robert R. Hill and the data was a result of years of investigation by Mrs. Jeannette B. Christopher, of Carlisle, S.C. (descendent of James Hill) and myself (descendent of Thomas Hill).

2. South Carolina had four colonial counties, Craven, Berkley, Colleton and Granville. These counties extended from the coast up to the N.C. line. At the end of the Revolution, these counties disappeared and new counties were formed in

their place, along with the districts of NINETY-SIX, CAMDEN, CHERAW, GEORGETOWN or WINYAH, CHARLESTON, BEAUFORT and ORANGEBURG which came into being about 1765.

3. Up to 1745 land was allotted not by the number in the family. From 1745 to 1775 the land grants were allotted by the size of the family (Save for a few years when each person got 50 acres and an additional 50 acres for each member) the land was allotted 100 acres for a single man or woman over the age of 16 or 15 if nearer to age 16. Then 50 acres additional was allotted for a wife and 50 acres more for each child under the age of 16. No married women, unless widows, were allowed land during this time. Often a man took a grant and when his family increased in size, more land was allotted. Often a man had several grants in payment for surveying.

After the Revolution, the land was not limited as between 1745-1775

Carolina State Archives in Columbia, S.C. and is to be

supplemented by other work in the various county seats. Due to the fact that many papers of mine fall into the hands of professional genealogist, I have not added the books nor pages from where this data was obtained. The client will be furnished free these books and pages on any of the names which are in her direct line. The names is sometimes spelled as HILLS as well as HILL.

1. MOSES HILL, the ancestor of Mrs. Nicholson, was born in 1758. He died in Fairfield County (S.C.) 7-1-1821...His wife was SAVILLA RODEN, who was born in 1759 and died in Alabama, 23 July 1844...Their children :

c. Sarah Hill, b. ca. 1785. m. Rev. John Pearson, they moved to Green Co., Ala ca. Apr. or May 1831. She d. ca. 1831-1835.

d. Littleton Hill, born ca. 1788-1790, never married, said to have died in late teens (after 1810?) He is named in remains of Moses Hill's bible. Buried by his father in Fairfield Co., S.C. (near Buckhead in Old Yongue Cemetery in unmarked grave).

f. Elizabeth Harrison Hill, b. 29th January 1793, m. Stephen Terry on 4th July 1809, they moved to DeKalb Co., Ga., she died there 3rd December 1838.

g. Moses Berry Hill, b. 1795, m. Mary Bowles Glenn, d. 14th October 1824 in Chester Co., S.C. (Buried at Carlisle S.C. in Union Co.)

h. Harriet Windham Hill, b. 5th March 1802, m. ca. 1818-1819 to Edward Picket Mobley, (lived life entirely in Fairfield Co.), d. on 30th April 1857.

i. George Washington Hill, b. in September 1803, m. Sarah A. Moore, moved to Green Co., Ala with widowed mother and sister Rebecca, he d. there on 8th September

1857.

j. Rebecca Carlisle Hill, b. 20th December 1807. m. Dr. John Trezevant DeGraffenreid on 25th March 1828, They moved to Green Co., Ala, along with her widowed mother and brother George ca. 1831, she d. there on 11th August 1842.

This ends the notes by Robert R. Hill Sr and the data was a result of years of investigation by Mrs. Jeannette B. Christopher, of Carlisle, S.C. (descendent of James Hill) and myself (descendent of Thomas Hill).

2. South Carolina had four colonial counties, Craven, Berkley, Colleton and Granville. These counties extended from the coast up to the N.C. line. At the end of the Revolution, these counties disappeared and new counties were formed in their place, along with the districts of NINETY-SIX, CAMDEN, CHERAW, GEORGETOWN or WINYAH, CHARLESTON, BEAUFORT and ORANGEBURG which came into being about 1765.

3. Up to 1745 land was allotted not by the number in the family. From 1745 to 1775 the land grants were allotted by the size of the family (Save for a few years when each person got 50 acres and an additional 50 acres for each member) the land was allotted 100 acres for a single man or woman over the age of 16 or 15 if nearer to age 16. Then 50 acres additional was allotted for a wife and 50 acres more for each child under the age of 16. No married women, unless widows, were allowed land during this time. Often a man took a grant and when his family increased in size, more land was allotted. Often a man had several grants in payment for surveying.

After the Revolution, the land was not limited as between 1745-1775

In the book, in the S.C. Chapters, was mentioned both MOSES & LEONARD HILL. Perhaps in your library, in Memphis, you may obtain a copy of this book and check to see if your MOSES HILL has his line traced. If you write to Miss Fay Hill, she may have some data and the notes I made for her several years ago.

b. 20 May 1829; Mrs. Almira Morgan, b. 22 Feb. 1819; Whipple Hill, b. 20 Feb. 1822; Orilla Hill, b. 14 June 1827; Levi Hill, b. 22 Sept. 1832. Thomas Young Ex. with sons. /Wit. Thomas Young, Russell Briggs, Antoine Becco & James I. Simmons.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: I believe his wife was Harriet LaPham, even though there seems to be some confliction on the dates of his birth and death. See Leonard Hill on page 35

The Hill Book gives full details of all these children and of a MOSES HILL, but I do not know whether the MOSES #1 or not...The handsome old HILL house and large family graveyard is still standing at Enoree, S.C. (COMMENTS BY ROBERT R. HILL...Could this possibly be the Leonard & Moses Hill that Mr. Andrea read about in the Jacksonville Library, in the book HILLS OF NEW ENGLAND)?

(NOTE BY ROBERT HILL: No, it is not the Leonard Hill, who was associated with Moses Hill. That Leonard Hill moved to Clark County Kentucky and died there ca.1825-27).

Elizabeth Eveline Hill, children of Benjamin & Susey Hill.

/Wit. John G. Klink, Samuel R. Todd, John D. Wright.

63. David Hill of Newberry County, (Son of # 61) will signed 4 Sept. 1834, probated 24 Oct. 1834. Wife deceased and bury me beside her (Name was Anna. See # 61). Children: Polly Turner & see #61; Rachel Hill, minor; King David Hill; Henry Hill, not yet 21; Nancy Hill, minor; and John Hill. /Wit. Joseph Duncan, James Roberts & Samuel Vance.

64. Joseph Hill, of Newberry, will signed 30 Sept. 1839, probated 9 Oct. 1839. No wife...four children: Elizabeth Prewitt; Elijah Hill Ex.; Rachel Fowler Ridglet Valentine; Nathan Hill. /Wit. William Whitmire, John C.C. Enlow & John N. Henderson.

65. John R. Hill, a marriage settlement dated 14 Feb. 1867 with Temperance Reeves & filed in Columbia.

66. John Hill, of Middlesex England, dated 1 Jan. 1795, a Power of Attorney to Samuel Scottowe for my dealings with Humphery Courtney, James Thomas & William Walter in the Province of S.C. (See Courtney in # 37).

WILLS (RELATING TO HILLS)  
FROM CROSIER (MS) MISC? ON BAPTIST

67. The Raburn Creek Baptist Church in Laurens County was organized by 1772...Members of this church were: John Hill and Nicholas Hill, who had a plantation on Reedy River, a grant in 1787.

68. The Reverend James Hill, a Baptist minister, was residing in Newberry County in 1790 and was pastor of the Cloud Creek Baptist Church in Edgefield (now Saluda Co.). In 1787 the Rev. James Hill, David Lilly & John Rowland were at a Presbytery of the Bethel Baptist Church, which was located between the Tyger and Enoree Rivers.

69. W. Hill with Thomas Berry were delegates from the Mill Creek Baptist Church, in the Saluda Association in 1796.

70. In the great hurricane in Charleston on 19th Sept. 1752, a boat was blown from the harbor and landed near the First Baptist Church and by the house of Dick Hill.

71. James Hill was a delegate to the Bethel Association in 1799 from the Bethabara Baptist Church, which was located on

the banks of the Salude River. The Rev. John Waller was pastor that year.

RICHLAND COUNTY S.C.

72. From Green's History of Richland County, he states: Isaac Hill had 100 acres, which he took 4 Feb. 1770 and by the lands of Henry Fox.

Robert Hills had 200a, which he took 13 July 1764 by John Simmons.

Theophilus Hill had 200a, which he took 7 Feb. 1770, by the lands of John Simmons, Robert Hill, Strother, Hopkins and Singleton lands.

73. Robert Hills, a will signed 15 Apr. 1795, probated 6 July 1795 in Richland County. No wife is listed. Children: 1/3 to Robert Hills, a minor; 1/3 to Jean Hills, a minor; 1/3 to James Raley, minor son of Ann Raley now living with me. Special legacies to these children: Andrew Hills; John Hills; Elizabeth Ross; & Mary Hills. Robert Knox is to account for the slaves lent to him (perhaps son in law) EXS: Joel Adams, Daniel O'Quinn & James Denton. /Wit. William Meyer, Silas Campbell & John Landenham.

EDGEFIELD COUNTY

74. From Chapman's History of Edgefield County: "Enoch Grigsby wed Susan Butler and they had a daughter (not named) who wed Lod. Hill, who lived at Richardsonville. Lodowick Hill was a soldier in the Revolution. He had a son Theophilus Hill and a son Henry Hill. One of the daughters (not named) of Lodowick Hill married Capt. Bryan Dean and she had two children, Capt. A.B. Dean and Theophilus Dean. Henry Hill, the son, had a son, Dr. Lovick Hill or Lovett Hill.

75. Theophilus Hill, the son of Lodowick Hill, had several sons and they were: Rhyden Grigsby Hill; Dr. Walter Hill of Edgefield Court House; Benjamin Hill; Henry Hill of Johnston S.C.; James R. Hill; Thomas Hill, killed in Battle while serving in the CSA.

NOTE: Reference Page 628 of "OLD ALBEMARLE AND ITS ABSENTEE LANDLORDS" by Worth S. Ray (under # 324, the genealogy of John Thomas & His Family) shows that John Thomas married Christina Roberts and among their children was a daughter TERESA THOMAS, who married THEOPHILUS HILL. This THEOPHILUS HILL & Thersa Thomas were the parents of the above Lodowick Hill. Theophilus Hill (m. Thersa Thomas) was son of Abraham Hill of Chowan Co., N.C. and his wife Judith (Hunter?). Abraham Hill was son of Henry Hill (b. Nansemond Co., Va. and wife Mary). This information very obvious in my researching the William Thomas Family of Virginia and by putting together the Hill Genealogy that was established by others.

The slaves entailed from my mother, Dorcas Hill, are mentioned. /Wit. Samuel Mays, Hazel Culbreath & William Mays. EXS: With my wife, my brother Samuel Mays with Elisha Brooks.

(NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Dannett Hill may be son of Thomas Hill of Cumberland County Virginia. The name Dennett was named in his father's Virginia Will).

78. Abney Mays in a will signed in 1804 with wife Elizabeth Mays, calls Dannit Hill "my brother," who with my brother Samuel Mays and my son William Abney will act as executors. children: William Mays; Gardiner Mays; James Hill Mays; Tabitha Mays; Sally Mays; Meda Mays, a son; Maddox Mays; John Mays; Abney Mays; Elizabeth Whitley\*\*. /Wit. were Dannett Hill, Dorcas Hill & Jesse Mays.

(NOTE: Abney Mays calls Dannit (Dannett) Hill brother and he was probably a brother in law to Dannett Hill...in these times a brother in law was often referred to as just simply "brother."

Reference to \*\*: Mrs. Elizabeth Whitley, in a later will, named one child as Whitley as Stephen Cash Whitley and my children by my first husband, Abney Mays as: Meda Mys; Nancy Mays; Maddox Mays; John Mays; & Abney Mays.

Evidently Elizabeth Mays was second wife of Abney Mays and she also had a stepdaughter Elizabeth Mays, who also wed a Whitley.

79. John Hill Sr., a will signed 23 Aug. 1804, probated 7 Oct. 1807, wife Jeane Hill & she to have what is now occupied by Nancy Stidham. All my children have gifts from me of senior date and are not named. Grandsons: John Hill & William Hill, sons of deceased son, John Hill. EXS: My sons, William Hill, Frederick Hill & Travis Hill. /Wit. Burrell Ross, Stephen Elmore & John Matthews.

(NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Mr. Andrea had the word "INCORRECT" typed at the end of this section but gave no explanation. I believe he was correcting himself, regarding the fact that



he listed Dannett Hill as son of # 76 (Sophia Hiles when in fact he was not but may be son of Thomas Hill of Cumberland County Virginia..

79a. John Hill Sr., a will signed 23 Aug. 1804, probated 7 Oct. 1804, wife JEANE HILL Ex., and to have the place now occupied by Nancy Stidham. Children & no surnames for any: John, Nancy, Thomas & Polly. /Wit. John Blocker Sr., William Glenn & John Mitchell.

80. John Hill, will signed 16 Oct. 1812, probated 4 Aug. 1813, no wife listed. "My children have from me gifts of a senior date, which I confirm." Grandsons: John Hill, William Hill, sons of John Hill, deceased. EXS: my sons, William, Travis & Frederick Hill. /Wit. Burrell Ross, Stephen Elmore & John Matthews. (NOTE: In other words, there were originally four sons, but John Hill (Jr.?) died, leaving only William, Travis and Frederick Hill as survivors.

Children: Nancy Cox, Mary Loveless \*\*, Elizabeth Talley, Hulda Tompkins, Susannah Kilcrease, Visay Jennungs, Sarah Blalock and Hamatta Hill. My son is deceased (not named) and I will his share to his widow, Mrs. Margaret Hill, for the nine children of my deceased son...My grandson, ABEL HILL, is to have the slave I gave his father in addition to his share. Grandchildren, being children of my deceased son. Samuel, Naza, John, Mary, William, Sarah, Abel, Priscilla & Elizabeth. EXS: Charles Hammond & John Key /Wit. Hillary M. Collins, Thomas Kilcrease \* Willis Kilcrease.

NOTE BY MR. ANDREA Reference to\*\* (underlined) I was not sure as to Loveless for WPA had it Sovnless & Soueness and as Lovelefs and all spellings made by WPA.

83. Jesse Hill, a will signed 13 July 1818, probated 4 Jan. 1821, wife is listed as Elizabeth Hill. Children: Susanna Cossy or Casey \*\*; William Hill; Sally Garrett; Joel Hill,

minor\* & John Hill.

(Wife was second wife and evidently not mother of any of the children). "My youngest son, Joel Hill, is to reside with his stepmother and to heir the home plantation when she dies."  
EX: Son in Law, Thomas Garrett. /Wit. Joshua Hill, James Oliver & Jno. Simpkins.

Additional information found and added by Robert Hill Sr  
Information & Abstract of Will of Jesse Hill #83... (not part of Andrea's work) Taken from Book "EAsT Goes West," by Alta Craft. (page 102)

Jesse Hill was born ca. 1759-1761, was son of the son of William Hill Sr. of Surry Co., N.C. was born in Caroline Co., Va. His mother was Susannah Smither.

First wife of Jesse was named Mary, (maiden name unknown) but they had a daughter Saley, who is named as Saley Garrett.

Mary Pittman, 2nd wife, married Jesse Hill before 1794. Their three sons were John Hill, William P. (Pittman) Hill and Joel Hill, all named in the will.

Colonel John Hill, son of Jesse Hill & 2nd wife Mary Pittman, was born in N.C. between 1756 and 1763 (over 45 in 1810). He died in Edgefield, South Carolina on 17 August 1820.

Col. John Hill had a son, Thomas Jefferson Hill, born 29 June 1802 in Edgefield, S.C., died near Maretta (sic), Cobb County, GA., on 28 July 1873 and his second wife was Elizabeth Weldch, born ca. 1812, Edgefield Co., S.C. She died on 20th August 1849. They were married 16th February 1832 (DAR #434303-Helen (Hill) Warwick).

#### Will of Jesse Hill

Will dated 13 July 1818 in Edgefield Co., S.C., proved 14 August 1820, recorded in Will Book C, #10.

I Jesse Hill...do make and ordain this my last Will and testament

Item...I will that my wife, Elizabeth (third wife) ..have... possession of all the premises where I now live during her natural life or widowhood.

Item..I give unto my daughter, Susannah Cossy (mother was Jesse's first wife, ? Mary,) a piece of land..(and two slaves).

Item..I give to my daughter, Saley Garrett (mother was first wife), all that plantation or tract of land whereon Thomas Garrett now lives...and a Negro girl.

Item..I give unto my sons John and William, (mother was second wife..Mary Pittman) have the land I now live after the decease of my wife, and I wish him to make his home and take up his residence with his step mother (underlining supplied) during her life or until he becomes of age.

Also I give to my wife, Elizabeth (third wife) during her life or widowhood."

84. Lodowick Hill (see #74) will signed 29 Nov. 1817, probated 23 Dec. 1822, no wife is listed. Children: and not named save three: My daughter Polly is to have the Negro man I gave her when she wed. My daughter Tressa Lewis is also to keep the Negro I gave her. My daughter Sarah is to have the Negro man I gave her. My estate to go equal to all my children (none named). EXS: my sons (not named) /Wit. Theophilus Hill, Hugh Neal & Ranson Melton.

NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Wife of Lodowick Hill (# 84) was Susan Grigsby).

85. Theophilus Hill (son of #84 & see # 74a), wife Susan Hill, will signed 10 Sept. 1852, probated 13 May 1853. All my sons and all my daughters (none named) to share equal. My son, Henry Hill already has \$ 1500. EXS: My sons, Rhydon Grigsby Hill and Lodowick Hill Jr. /Wit. James M. Richardson, James C. Adams & Henry Hill.

86. Joel D. Hill (Likely son of # 83) will signed 10 May 1848, probated 12 July 1848, Wife, Mary Hill, Children: John D. Hill Ex; Mary Ann w. of Benjamin Hall Ex.; Sabra w. of William H. Matthews Ex. The children (not named) of my first wife, I do not give anything. /Wit. Elizabeth Hall, Charles Hammond & Lucius L. Hall.

87. Aaron Hill, will signed 14 Jan. 1851, probated 3 Mar. 1851, no wife listed. EX: My friend Ransom Timmerman, estate into 9 equal portions and 1/9th to each of my children: Eleanor Burnon; Lewis Hill; Elizabeth (no surname given; Sarah Huskey; William Hill; Levi Hill & James Hill. A share to Oliver Perry Hill, Elizabeth Hill, Susannah Hill & Sarah Hill, the children of my deceased son, Benjamin Hill. /Wit. J. Shepard, A.L. Oxner & Jarriot Nobles.

NOTE BY ANDREA: In some McClendon work I did several years ago, I recall some Hill data. I will add it now. These McClendons came from N.C. to Sparrow Swamp in Darlington and on to Richland-Kershaw (Counties) and were near Bear Creek, along the Fairfield County line S.C. and on to Barnwell and Edgefield in S.C. Eventually they went to Wilkes Co., Ga.

NOTE: Theophilus Hill listed in names in Darlington &

Richland & Edgefield in S.C. and again in Wilkes Co., Ga.

88. These settlers came and had plantations by 1748/49.

101a. Capt. Joseph Hill with Hubbard Rees, Thomas LeNoir, John & Samuel Dinkins, J. Calbreath and others, signed a petition for clemency for John Adamson, the Tory, soon after the Revolution, when John Adamson was wanting to return to claim his estate.

Mentions lands on the McCaw Road by John Wallis and formerly the DeGraffenreid land. /Wit. John P. Rawdon, Samuel Morris & William Hill Jr.

104. William Hill of Sandy River in Chester. Will signed 24 May 1831, probated 25 Dec. 1834. Wife Armemel Hill Ex. Children: Maria Hill; William Hill; Mary Meadows; Emeline Hill; Anna Halsey & Littleton Hill Ex. & see (# 103). /Wit.

Matthew Williams, William McClure & William A. Roseborough.

FAIRFIELD COUNTY S.C.

105. William Hill, will signed 1 July 1790, probated 14 Aug. 1790. No wife listed. "I give all I possess to my son, William Hill Jr. and make him Ex. I revoke my other will in which I divide my estate among my heirs for now I desire my son William Hill Jr. to have it all." /Wit. William Alsop, Adam Effurt & Richard Odom.

106. Richard Hill, will but not completed. Wife, Mary Hill, my 5 sons and my 3 daughters, no surnames: William, Jehu, Susannah, Simeon, Schen (Sion?, a son), Sarah, Richard Jr. & Dorcas.

22 Jan. 1810, John McCully, George S. Smith & Daniel A. Mobley make sworn statement that they were present when Mr. Richard Hill had John McCully to write this will but before Mr. McCully could complete the will, Mr. Hill lapsed into an unconscious state and died before the will could be completed. The will was probated 5 Fe. 1811. Ex. not given.

107. MOSES HILL (See # 1) died in Fairfield County on 1 July 1821 and no will found for him.

IMPORTANT NOTE BY ROBERT R. HILL SR.: Moses Hill died intestate, and there are several papers (Package 18, Box 252 Fairfield County Records) relating to the estate which was probated from Aug. 1821 through 1825. His two sons, Moses Berry Hill & George Washington Hill were appointed Executors. Another son, James Hill, of Union District, posted the Security Bond along with Splisby Glenn.

After the estate was finally settled (in 1825) the family stayed in Fairfield until about April or May of 1831, when George W. Hill moved his family to Green County Alabama. Along with him went his widowed mother, Savilla N. Hill, and the families of his two married sisters, Sarah Hill and her husband, Rev. John Pearson and his youngest sister, Rebecca Carlisle Hill, who married Dr. John Trezevant DeGraffenreid, M.D..

They all died there and Savilla Hill along with son George W. Hill & daughter Rebecca Hill, are buried in a cemetery near Pleasant Ridge, known as the "Old Bigsby Cemetery." It also has been called the "Old Williams Cemetery."

My son and I visited this graveyard in July 1986 and found the three graves. The markers are in reasonably good shape, considering the age etc., although George Hill's marker is lying on the ground. (A large tree had fell on top of Savilla's marker, which was intact and holding the tree up, however it had knocked George Hill's marker down).

The cemetery is adjacent to the side of a church, where blacks worship in. The cemetery itself is in very bad shape, badly over grown with tree, bushes with thorns etc. Silt and leaves are about 4 to 6 inches deep and markers are scattered about randomly. Just about all of the graves belonged to people from the area of Chester and Fairfield County S.C., who also had moved to this once popular area. (End of note)

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Comments by Andrea: This completes all HILL data and will abstracts to be found in the S.C. Archives. These wills are WPA copies and I find them to be about 5% inaccurate, when compared to the original wills on file in the various county seats. I have a few more items to add from Charleston trip when I edit the further data found on my second trip.

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NOTE BY ROBERT R. HILL SR.: (In the following note, the figure that follows a name (viz Robert Hill 3/, shows that he belongs to the 3rd generation of that family). In Craven

County S.C., later known as Camden District and located today in the general area of Fairfield County S.C., resided a man named Matthew Gibbs, along with his wife Milbry Hill 4/. They removed there from Halifax County N.C. by 1769. Milbry Hill 4/ was the daughter of Robert Hill 3/ (1678-1765) & his wife Tabitha. Robert Hill 3/, in turn was son of Sion Hill 2/ (1654-1705) of Isle of Wight & Surry County Virginia and his 2nd wife (widow) Mrs. John Spiltimber. Sion Hill 2/, was in turn the son of the immigrant & patriarch of the famous Hill family of Surry County Virginia, ROBERT HILL 1/ & wife Mary Webb. They immigrated into Va. ca. 1642.

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127. HILL INDEX for books from 1680 to 1799 in Charleston Office of the Judge of Probate....No dates are given, however the first books are A up thru Z. the begin A thru 2Z, then begin 3A thru 3Z and on....15A thru 15Z takes one to 1800.....These books have been rebound and the original names are not on the book. More than half the time I was not able to find the items in INDEX, EXCEPT the wills, for the wills are kept in a separate set and have a master index.....However some of the wills were not found. I knew that you did not want to run up so high a bill. All wills that could be found, are already in this paper on Hill. NONE HAD A MOSES HILL.

134. My suggestion to you would be to secure a Charleston genealogist and have records checked carefully. You may find what you want and then again you may not. The Court of Equity Records, I did not even attempt, nor did I go to the Charleston Historical Society Library. That library has a building of its own and has much published and typed data. Charleston is a Historic and antiquated city...the records are kept also in an antiquated method.

Samuel Hill (# 2033) was born Feb. 16, 1680, died July 27th 1732. Wife Ann, who died Dec. 3rd, 1747

Lieutenant Samuel Hill (4th) born Feb. 19, 1714, died Nov. 12th, 1758 son of Samuel Hill (# 2033) & wife Ann. His wife was Deborah Cushing, born 13th Nov. 1746, she died 16th May 1828. She dau. of Matthew & Mary Cushing.

Samuel Hill 5th (Son of Samuel Hill 4th) born 14 Dec. 1740, married Jan. or June 8th 1766 to Rhoda Phillips (b. 20 Dec. 1746-d. 16 May 1828). He died 14th March 1833.

John Hill ( Son of Samuel Hill 5th) born 29 April 1768, died 9th October 1806. Wife Lucena Ramsey, b. 23 June 1773, d. 18th Aug. 1834.

Leonard Hill, son of John Hill & Lucena Ramsey. He was born 6th Sept. 1791, died 18th August 1834. Wife Harriet LaPham, dau. of James & Jemima LaPham. She b. July 11th, 1794, d. 27th December 1873. (SEE ITEM # 58 ON PAGE 17).

James L. Hill, son of Leonard Hill, was born 13th May 1815, d. 14th November 1889 (Wrote here was "my grandfather." Wife was Jemima B. ??? She d. Jan 1853.

William A. Hill, son of James L. Hill. He was born 27th March 1842. Wife was Nancy Ann, b. 8th June 1843.

John Wheeler came to New England in 1638 on ship "Confidence" (see pages 253 to 254, Edition 1897, Old Families of Solisbury & (last name not legible). Hand writing slurred.

NOTE BY ROBERT R. HILL SR.: The following is a typed note of some sort. I do not believe it was typed by Andrea (different typewriter used) but wonder if it were not typed by Mrs. Nicholson, in response to Mr. Andrea's notes. I also wonder if perhaps Mrs. Nicholson was a genealogist, searching for MOSES HILL for a client in Memphis, Tenn. She may have hired Andrea to do her S.C. research. This suspicion is based solely on this note.

I mentioned this will below to you when here-it included in my clients data..

Also wrote at bottom of article was " Elizabeth married William Halbert (See #30) also will. I have certified copy." In your Hill paper, you have wills for-- Item 51. Abbeville , UEL HILL, received 3 Nov. 1832. (In long hand here was wrote by Andrea "See Uel Above."

Item 83. Edgefield, JESSE HILL, pro. 4 Jan 1821. note he names a son JOEL, he should be son of above will. (ANDREA Wrote by her name in long hand " also daughter Susannah & son William)."

# 86. Edgefield, Joel Hill, dated 1848. Can as you say be son of Jesse above-or could be son of William of Surry...he seems to be youngest son -named last.

#47. James Hill will, he with 2 sets of children, note he names a son Jesse, could be?? also son of William Hill of Surry.

On your Jesse Hill will # 83, a Joshua Hill is a witness--son of William of Surry--possible?????

In Abbeville, you have a will for John Hill and wife Susannah--note deed my data-for their deed.

THIS APPARENTLY CONCLUDED THE PART OF MR. ANDREA'S SEARCH FOR MOSES HILL & READERS SHOULD VIEW THIS AS IF THEY WERE A CLIENT OF MR. ANDREA'S AND HE IS SENDING THEM HIS REPORT ON MOSES HILL (#1). THIS PART IS KNOWN AS HILL 1 IN THE ANDREA COLLECTION.

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOTES BY ROBERT R. HILL SR.: Over the years, I too have researched for information on MOSES HILL (#1) in Mr. Andrea's collection. Moses Hill was my 4th great grandfather, and as a result I am a member of the Tampa Chapter of the Florida Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. (Joined in Nov. 1985).

In my research, I have found additional information not included in Mr. Andrea's data, and therefore have added or made the entries. I have made NO CHANGES in Mr. Andrea's data. I also have come across information on several members of the Hill Families (not related to Moses) and for the sake of making it available to others, make those entries too.

In Clarke County Alabama, a Moses Hill is listed in the 1830 Census as aged 70-80 with a female aged 50-60 (wife?).

This Moses Hill died in 1832 and an Inventory of his Personal Property was taken on October 17th, 1832 by James Daniel, Abner Wislon & John Easley, Appraisers. Several notes were filed including one from Sterling Hill (son). on 31 Dec. 1830. (Reference "Alabama Records" by Gandrud, Vol 239, page 15 & 16).

In Surry County Virginia, on 21 January 1782, a Moses Hill made a will that was proven on 24 Sept. 1782, naming sons: Lewis Hill and Sterling Hill and children of a deceased son, Benjamin Hill.

Note the name of Sterling Hill as son of the Moses Hill of Clarke County, Alabama. It is said that the father of this Moses Hill was a S. Hill, who came to Georgia at age 17 or 18. It appears that this Moses Hill, of Alabama, may be related to the Moses Hill of Surry County Virginia as well as his son Lewis, Sterling & Benjamin (deceased son). The names are identical to those in Alabama.

REFERENCE # 20 of Andrea's Report, This Dorcas Hill was the widow of William Hill Jr., of Fairfield County S.C. He died ca. 1795 and her maiden name was Moberley (Mobley): Children named in will were: Richard Hill (m. Mary Mabry); Samuel & Elijah Hill (minors); Elizabeth Hill; John Hill; Mary Hill (m. Matthew Hosch) & Abel Hill. IGI Index of LDS Church shows other children as Charles Hill, b. 1769; Robert Hill. b. 1770 & William Hill, b. 1772, all born near Monks Corner in Berkley County S.C. (If this is so, why were they not named in the will?) (Ref IGI Index of LDS Church).

REFERENCE # 77 of Andrea's report, Dannet Hill, the spelling is very simular to Dennett, and that name is found in a will of Thomas Hill, made in Cumberland Co., Va. on 6 Oct.1770, proven 25 Oct. 1773. Thomas names his wife as Barchany and children as John, DENNETT, Mary, Thomas, William, Joseph, James & Ann. It was witnessed by John & Joseph Starky and John Spearman. It is known also that a Starky Hill lived in the area of Camden District S.C. and it therefore appears that Starky Hill and Dannet Hill of Edgefield County might be related to this Virginia Family. (Data furnished me by Mr. Jonathan Butcher, Genealogist, of N.C.)

REFERENCE # 88: This Abraham Hill (b. 23 April 1732, d. 4 Feb. 1792) married Christian Walton and was originally from Chowan Co., N.C. (Revolutionary Service). He is known as Abraham Hill Sr.

REFERENCE TO # 129. to Elizabeth Quincy. This was her second marriage. Her maiden name was Elizabeth Godfrey and she first married Charles Hill.

Charles Hill was a wealthy planter who lived in St. Andrews Parish, Berkley County, S.C. The Register of St. Andrews

Parish (Published in S.C. Historical & Genealogical Magazine) shows that Charles Hill and Elizabeth Godfrey were married on 13 Jan. 1714/15. A later deed (RR:345) shows she was the daughter of Captain John Godfrey.

On 5 March 1728, Charles & Elizabeth Hill purchased a lot in Charleston from William Harvey. However Charles Hill Esquire was buried in St. Andrews Parish on 27 July 1734. An informative deed of 4 March 1757 (RR:350) shows that Charles left a will dated 12 April 1734.

Elizabeth (Godfrey) Hill, widow of Charles Hill secondly married Reverend Samuel Quincy and returned to England. She apparently left a will in England, according to the deed.

The record of St. Andrews Register is some what damaged but does show the following children of Charles & Elizabeth Hill:

- a. Elizabeth, baptized 19 Nov. 171- St Andrews Parish
- b. Charles Jr., baptized 13 Feb \_\_\_\_\_
- c. Jane, baptized 24 May 1718.
- d. John, born 21 Dec. 1719
- e. Sarah, born 17 Apr. 1721. In 1757 she was the wife of John Lining of Charleston.
- f. Mary, born 15 Jan. 1722/23.
- g. Robert, baptized 17 Apr. 1726, buried 16 May 1727.
- h. Judith, buried 25 May 1732.
- i. William Jeffries Hill, born 29 Jan. 1729/30 St. Phillips Parish, buried 5 April 1734 St. Andrews Parish.

In the deed of 1757 (RR:350) it is stated that when widow Elizabeth (Godfrey) (Hill) Quincy returned to England, she deeded her lot in Charleston to Jacob Motte, in trust for her daughter Sarah. This may tie in with a reference in the will of John Abraham Motte of Berkley Co., dated 24 Aug. 1710, who appointed as executor his brother in law, Charles Hill, "now of Jamaica, merchant."

It appears that Charles Hill was somehow related to Richard Hill of Charleston, and perhaps Jonathan Hill too (#130). On 2 September 1717, a deed for a lot in Charleston from John Kinard to Charles Hill, was witnessed by Richard Hill (A:10). "Mrs. Hill, ye wife of Mr. Richard Hill," was buried in St. Phillips Parish on 21 July 1734. Richard Hill Esquire, of "Charles Town, Berkley County" made a will on 2 June 1746, proven 3 April 1747. This refers to a marriage settlement made with his late wife, Grace Farmer, for lands in Bear-forest, called Carrigane Shonennberg, in the Parish of Mallow, County Cork Ireland. Reference is made also to the land purchases of Robert Farmer Esq., and wife Grace, of the city of Cork. Richard appointed as his executors his son Charles Hill, John Guerard and JACOB MOTTE. Richard Hill left his property to his sons Charles, Robert & William Howell Hill and his nephew, Richard, son of brother in law John Guerard.

REFERENCE TO CHARLESTON INFORMATION: Additional information on Charleston shows that on 4 December 1751, a Littleton Hill was buried. He was apparently a British Naval Officer. P.W. Coldham's "English Estates of American Colonist," in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, 1700-1799, shows that in May 1752, administration on estate of Littleton Hill, widower, late Lt. on the H.M.S. Scorpion, who died in S.C., was granted to George Hill, uncle and guardian of the deceased only child, also a Littleton Hill. Unfortunately it is not clear from Coldham's abstract if the administrator was also a resident of S.C.

REFERENCE TO #130. Jonathan Hill was married to Margaret or Miriam Hall, daughter of George Hall of Berkley County, and Jonathan later moved into Craven County, Camden District.

In Berkley County S.C., will abstracts show a will of George Hall, dated 24 Dec. 1753, proven 15 April 1754. It names as heirs his wife Miriam, daughters Margaret & Miriam, and sons Joseph, George & Thomas. Executors were the testator's wife, his SON IN LAW JONATHAN HILL, & Dr. William Keith: Witnesses were John Cannar, RICHARD (X) HILL and David Lafons.

Probate records shows that Jonathan Hill died in Camden District. (Journal of the Court of Ordinary for 1771-75, page 72, by Holcomb, Probate Records for S.C., 2:47) we find a citation granted to Joseph Kershaw to administer the estate & effects of Jonathan Hill, late of Camden, as great creditor, to be read in said Parish church of St. Marks. Dated 10th Nov. 1772. (VERY IMPORTANT: Proof of this being the same Hill Family that later moved to Camden District, is found in a copy of the Bible Record that I have obtained, showing this to be the same Thomas Hill that is the son of Jonathan Hill). Thomas states he was born near Monks Corner, in Berkley County S.C. Church Records of the LDS Church show that Jonathan Hill had three sons: MOSES HILL, born 1749; THOMAS b. 11 Nov. 1750 & JOSEPH, born 1752. I have been unable to show a Moses Hill was a son of Jonathan Hill

\*\*Reference to Thomas Hill, son of Jonathan and underlined above: Thomas Hill stated on his application that he lived in Camden District S.C before, during and after the war. He stated that he later moved to Kentucky, where he applied for and received a pension ( Number S-31131) for his Revolutionary War Service. I have a copy of the Family Bible of this Thomas Hill.

On his application though, Thomas Hill stated he was born near Monks Corner (Berkley County) S.C. on 6th March 1758 (not 11 Nov 1750 as the LDS Church Records shows). Thomas stated that he did indeed move to Camden District before the war, lived there until after the war, then removed to Kentucky.

Another thing of interest about the Will of George Hall, (father in law of Jonathan Hill) is that it shows a Richard Hill as a witness, proving that a Richard Hill was in the area of Berkley County in 1753 as well as Jonathan Hill. (Is this Richard Hill the one that later moved into Fairfield County of Camden District about 1760, and who was married Dorcas Moberley?)

LDS Church Records shows also that a William Hill & Dorcas Moberley (not the same as above) gave birth to a son, William Hill in 1772 in Berkley County S.C. Since it is known that they also later lived in Fairfield County (Camden District), it certainly adds support to the possibility that this could be the place or origins of several of the Hill Families of Fairfield County???
