St. Mark's Parish in S.C. was organized in 1757 and parent county (Parish) was Prince Frederick Parish.

Berkley County, S.C. was organzied in 1682, abolished in 1683 & then restored on 12th March 1785.

Craven County, S.C. was organized in 1682, abolished in 1768 & the area was redistributed, and Camden District was formed.

Fairfield District, S.C. was organized on 12th March 1785 from Camden Progeny (District) and then became known as Fairfield COUNTY in 1865.

Woodward Notations:

In Fairfield County a Sarah Woodward married William Champlain on 27th July 1816.

Fairfield County, S.C.: Mrs. Sarah Woodward, wife of Thomas A. Woodward, died on the 16th of July 1830, age 19. (Who is this? Is this a Thomas Addison Woodward)? I think so.

## Marriage:

Gandrud's Alabama Records, Vol. 132, Sumter County, Page 9: Ira Hill & Frances Woodard 11th October 1841, solemnized 13th October 1841, daughter of William. (Who is this William Woodard)? Might be part f the Charles Woodward family of Barnwell Co., SC

William Robertson 2/, born ca. 1748 in Virginia, the half brother of Thomas Woodward 2/, known as the Regulator in S.C., married Nancy Holly. William 2/ was the son of John Robertson 1/ & wife (widow) Mary Simpson Woodward, widow of a (John?) Woodward 1/ and who married 2nd time to John Robertson 1/ in Fairfax County, Va. She was the mother of Thomas Woodward 2/ (1729-1779). William Robertson 2/ and Nancy Holly had a son named Benoni Robertson 3/.

THe mother of the 3 sons, John, William & Henry have been said to be by a first unknown wife, but I suspect the mother

Richard Simpson of Fairfax County, Va. married Elizabeth Simpson and had a son named Benoni Holly Simpson.

From the book "South Carolina Provincial Troops," by A.S. Salley, on page 159, dated 1775, is a list of Troops under Col. William Thompson's Rangers showing:

CaptainThomas Woodwardage 46, (birth 1729) born Va.Lieutenants Richard Winn25 (birth 1750) born Va."John Woodward28 (Born 1747) born Va.

NOTE: This is the only type of official documentation that I know of that shows the births for Thomas Woodward 2/, The Regulator, and his son, John Woodward 3/. Thomas being born in 1729 and his son, John in 1747.

Woodward information from Dinwiddi County, Va., provied by Mrs. Rita Woodward Hulsey of Ft. Smith Ark in May of 1989:

In the book "Woodward's Reminiscences, General Thomas Simpson Woodward stated that some of the children of his great grandfather Thomas Woodward (it was John) went to Dinwiddie County, Va,. from Maryland. Thus the reason for this. I see nothing to establish a connection. The John Woodward that married Mary Simpson, the parents of Thomas (Regulator) Woodward was dead by 1742.
