Note: The figure after a name indicates what generation that person belonged to.

1ST GENERATION: General information....The origins of Moses Hill 1/ (MY 4TH G. GRANDFATHER) are unknown as of this writing but some evidence that he, or at least his parents, may have come from the area of Essex County Virginia. The names of his parents are also unknown for sure, but strong evidence that his father was a Thomas Hill. Mother is unknown.

Moses Hill 1/ first appears in South Carolina records when he apparently served 120 days in the S.C. Militia, against the British, during the American Revolution.

He married Savilla N. Roden after May of 1778 or in 1779. In May of 1778, Savilla signed as a witness to a land sale by her father, Thomas Roden. She signed the document as Savilla Roden, indicating that she had not yet married. Her first child, Thomas Hill 2/, was born in 1780. This helps to pin down the time that Moses & Savilla married. It is believed that the marriage took place at the residence of the Rodens, which was in Chester County. Both the Hills and Rodens lived close to each other but just across the county line, the Hills in Fairfield County, the Rodens in Chester County S.C.

THE FAMILY OF MOSES HILL 1/.

Moses Hill 1/ was born after 1 July 1757 or in 1758. The location of birth is unknown. He married Savilla N. Roden ca 1778-1779 in S.C. He was a surveyor, Justice of the Peace, a member of the Methodist Church and owned a large amount of land as well as slaves for the times. Moses died 1 July 1821, at age of 63. He died in Fairfield County and is buried by son Littleton Hill 2/, in the yard of what was once his home near the community of "Buckhead" in what is known today as the "Old Yongue Cemetery." He was a Revolutionary Soldier.

His wife Savilla was born ca. 1779, and based on information of a member of the Roden Family and his accounts of their movement from Maryland through Virginia and finally into S.C., Savilla was born in Virginia. She moved with children, George 2/ and his family and Rebecca 2/ and her family to near Pleasant Ridge in Green County Alabama ca. April or May of 1831. Savilla died there on the 23 July 1844 and is buried

in the Old Bigbee Cemetery, located near Pleasant Ridge.

CHILDREN OF MOSES HILL 1/. AND WIFE SAVILLA N. RODEN.

1. Thomas Hill 2/, (MY 3RD G. GRANDFATHER) born in 1780. He married Jemima Woodward, daughter of Rev. William Woodward & Nancy Barrett and was the granddaughter of the famous S.C. Regulator Thomas Woodward & 1st wife Jemima Collins. Thomas Hill 2/ died between January 1824, when he sold some land, and May 1824 when his wife confirmed a land sale by him, stating she was now widowed.

2. James Hill 2/.b. 21 Nov. 1782. He married Susannah Glenn on 10th June 1806. He became quite wealthy and built a large plantation near Fish Dam in Union County South Carolina (today known as Carlisle). He built his home with slaves he owned (several) and the house still stands. It is on the list for National Registry of Historical Preservation. It is called "HILLSIDE" and his great granddaughter still lives in the house. (This family was blessed by the fact that the grandson of James Hill 2/, GEORGE W. Hill 3/, lived until 1909. George lived in the house and was passed on to his daughter and granddaughter (Mrs. Christopher, who still lives there. This is where a lot of our information comes from).

3. Sarah Caroline? Hill 2/. Sarah was born ca. 1785-1788. Evidence point to her being somewhat older than most women married for the times. She was the 2nd of 3 wives for John Pearson, son of the Revolutionary General John Pearson. It appears that Sarah married ca. 1821 as their only child, and son, was born in 1823. The 1850 Census shows that this son was born in N.C. and for this reason it is believed that the Pearsons lived there for a short spell. (The Pearson Family originally settled this county around New Bern N.C.). John Pearson remarried 6 August 1835 in North Carolina. He still owned land in Green County Alabama and returned there right after this marriage, indicating again a connection to that state. Sarah Hill apparently was dead and her death date is unknown but probably ca. 1831-1834. She is suspected to be buried in the Old Bigbee Cemetery in Green County Alabama, near Pleasant Ridge, as is husband John. Due to the condition of the cemetery, which is extremely bad, their graves have not been found, but records exist of tombstones in the cemetery being found under "eight inches of silt." It is possible and probably they are buried here as their home was very close by.

4. Littleton Hill 2/. Littleton is rather obscure, but the knowledge exists that he was the 3rd son of Moses Hill 1/. Information passed down through the family is that he died as a "teen." A study of the 1810 Census on the Moses Hill Family, along with knowledge of marriages etc of the other children, points to Littleton being alive at the time of this census. Nothing afterwards shows his existence. His name is not mentioned in the estate affairs of his father but one

genealogist apparently found that he had "signed" to receive his share of his inheritance that his father gave him. (This apparently was a custom Moses 1/ did with all his sons. He gave them money, apparently to get a start in life etc). For these reasons plus a statement later by a family member that he died "just before reaching manhood," gives strong evidence that maybe he lived until about 20 years old. (Adulthood was considered to be 21 for a male before he could be granted land etc). Littleton never married according to family information. He apparently died in late 1810 or 1811. Family information is that he was buried by his father in an "unmarked" grave. Such a grave does exist. The grave has a stone at both head and foot, but it is rough sand stone with no visible inscriptions.

5. Elizabeth Harrison Hill 2/. She was born on 29th January 1793. The fact that her middle name was Harrison has caused some thought of a connection with the Harrison Family, especially a Reuben Harrison, who lived close to Moses 1/. James, her older brother, named a son Henry HARRISON Hill, and this was before the times of the President who bore that same name. Elizabeth married Stephen Terry on 4th July 1809 at age 15. They moved to DeKalb County Georgia ca. 1826. Elizabeth died in Georgia on 3rd December 1838 and had 12 children. She is believed to be buried in the family cemetery located today in the area known in Atlanta as "Lakewood Park." (Information by Atlanta Historical Society, Terry Bible Record and his will).

6. Moses Berry Hill 2/. He was born in 1795 (day and month) not given. He was a surveyor, as was his father. He married Mary Bowles Glenn and they lived in Chester County. They had four children and it is through him that several members of the Hill family, in Arkansas, are descended. Moses was one of the two administrators of his father's estate. (His brother George was the other). Moses died while the estate was being probated, death occurring in Chester County on 14 October 1824. (Brother Thomas died same year between Jan.-May 1824). Moses Berry Hill was taken across the Broad River into Chester County by the family, and is buried in the "Fish Dam Cemetery in Union County, where member of his brother James are also buried. (Note: Fish Dam today is Carlisle, S.C.).

7. Harriet W. Hill 2/. She was born on 5th March 1802. She married Edward Pickett Mobley, son of Samuel Mobley Jr. and wife Elizabeth Pickett Whitehead. Edward became a large slave and plantation owner in Fairfield County. The Mobleys were highly respected in the community and were generous in helping others. They had 5 known children. Harriet died on 30th April 1857. Her husband was born on 7th March 1799 in South Carolina and he died on 4th February 1861. Both, along with other members of the family, are buried in the family graveyard on the old home site known as "White Hall." It is located about 5 and 1/2 miles East of the town of White Oak,

in Fairfield County.

8. George Washington Hill 2/. He was born in September 1803 (exact day unknown) and he was married to Sarah A. Moore, probably ca. 1827-1828 in South Carolina. He was one of the two sons that applied to administer the father's estate in 1821. (His brother Moses Berry Hill was the other). George moved to Green County Alabama with his widowed mother and his family and the family of his youngest sister Rebecca and her family ca. April or May of 1831. George had 11 known children. Several died quite young. George Hill 2/, died in Green County Alabama on 8th September 1857 and is buried by his mother's side in the Old Bigbee Cemetery.

9. Rebecca Carlisle Hill 2/. She was born on 20th December 1807 and the name of Carlisle is believed to be after the first methodist preacher that was a circuit rider in the area of Fairfield and Union Counties in South Carolina. She married Doctor John Trezevant DeGraffenreid, son of Christopher and his wife Hannah Sartor. The doctor was born in Union County S.C. on 22 August 1799. He received his medical degree in New York. They were married on 25th March 1828 in South Carolina, moved to Alabama with the Hills (George, Rebecca and probably Sarah & John Pearson, who moved about the same time). The DeGraffenreids had six known children, and had a tragic time after moving to Alabama in 1831. A serious disease known as "bilious fever" (hepatitis?) swept the family. In 1842, they lost two daughters to this disease and Rebecca herself died from it just eight days after her daughter died. Rebecca Carlisle Hill 2/ died on 11 August 1842 in Green County and is also buried in the Old Bigbee Cemetery near Pleasant Ridge. Dr. DeGraffenreid remarried in 1850 (after Census).

This concludes the 2nd generation

CHILDREN OF THOMAS HILL 2/. HIS WIFE WAS JEMIMA WOODWARD.

1. Nancy B. (Barrett?) Hill 3/. Based on an entry in the "fly leaf" (remains) of an old bible that once belonged to Moses Hill 1/, Nancy was born on 4th June 1806. (Census data of 1840, 1850 & 1860 show 1 year later or 1807). Nancy was married three (3) times. Her first was to Edward M. Mobley of South Carolina. They apparently went to DeKalb County Georgia ca. 1828-30 and in the 1830 Census (page 48) are found listed NEXT to Nancy's aunt and uncle, Elizabeth Hill 2/ and husband Stephen Terry. In the 1840 Census, they were in Tuscaloosa County of Alabama. Edward Mobley died ca. 1846-1847 (Sumter Co., Ala.??). They had eight known children. Nancy remarried a 2nd time to William Price (Sr.) on 27 July 1848. They had one child, a daughter. In the 1850 Census, the Price Family was in Green County Alabama and apparently Wm. Price died shortly afterwards because on 4 November 1853, Nancy remarried a third time to James H. Sims. They had no children. By the time of the 1860, Nancy was widowed again

and she is found in Green County Census of 1860 on page 72, family number 562 as N. B. Sims (female) age 52. She is listed with a son and daughter. Nancy is not heard from again and her death date and place is unknown.

2. Jemima Hill 3/. We have no information on her except she was apparently born in 1807 or 1808 in S.C. and is one of the three (3) female children listed in the 1810 Census of the Thomas Hill 2/ Family in Fairfield County.

3. Charlotte L. (Louise?) Hill 3/. She was born on 8 August 1809 in S.C. She married Moses Cockrell (b. 28 Feb. 1799-d. 9 April 1867) in South Carolina. Based on Census information of children, they moved to Noxubee County Mississippi ca. 1839. In the 1840 Census they are listed in the household of one Mordicai Harrison. (That Harrison connections again appears, relationship unknown). They had 5 known children. One source has stated that the widowed mother, Jemima Hill, moved and lived with the Cockrells and that she died in 1851 in Miss. We have not found any such evidence. Charlotte Hill 3/, died on 28 October 1867 in Noxubee County Mississippi. She and her husband with some children are buried in Soule Methodist Church yard near Macon Mississippi.

4. Nathaniel Barrett Hill 3/. (MY 2ND G. GRANDFATHER) He was born in 1811 (1850 Census) and married Judith E. (Eliza?) Stewart (b. ca. 1811 based on 1850 Census). He was elected as "Sheriff of Richland District S.C." in November 1848 and resigned in March or April of 1851. He was a partner with Gilbert Stalker in a steamship company known to have carried both freight and passengers between Charleston & Columbia S.C. The company was known as "Stalker & Hill." Nathan was known among family as "Barrett" and was apparently named after his maternal grandmother Nancy Barrett. There is some suspicion that he was named after Nathaniel Barrett, a Revolutionary Soldier in the area of Fairfield County, and who might be the father or brother of Nancy Barrett. This has not yet been proven BUT if so, then it would appear Nathan was the 2nd son and not the first as listed here. (Custom of naming 2nd son after maternal side of grandparents existed in these times. Nathan Hill 3/ died on 13 December 1854 in New York City. (His estate papers and article in Charleston paper Charleston Mercury dated 15th Dec. 1854. City records of New York say death was on the 12th). Records in New York show he was returned to Charleston for burial, but since he lived in Columbia it is believed he is buried somewhere here. A rather good investigation has failed to locate his grave. Wife Judith was still in Columbia in 1860 Census but that is the last known of her. They had 5 children.

5. William W. (Woodward? Hill 3/. He is believed to be the 2nd son and 5th child of Thomas Hill 2/. He was probably born ca. 1812-1813 and is believed to have been the cousin that married Mary Glenn Hill 3/, daughter of his uncle Moses Berry

Hill 2/. Nothing else is known of him except he was obviously in Mobile Alabama around the time of the 1840 census and in 1843, he gave his brother Nathan a power of attorney. Some suspicion exist that the widowed mother (Jemima Hill) was with him instead of Charlotte 3/, his sister, as had been suggested by others. There is an elderly adult female in the 1840 Census with him in Mobile. We have no other information.

6. Moses Hill 3/. Said to have moved to Pickens County Alabama.

7. Savilla Hill 3/. Based on age of 1830 Census, she was born between 1815-1820. She married Green B. Mobley of South Carolina. Census Records of 1830 show them first in Green Co, Alabama (on page 406 of 1830 Census (Green Co., Ala.). The 1840 Census Records locate this family in Sumter Co., Ala. (page or family number 110). Savilla is believed to have died in Sumter County ca. 1839-1840, and she appears to have had 3 children, all born in Alabama. Green B. Mobley remarried a widow, Henrietta Wilson and they are in Sumter County in the 1850 Census. (page 288 #494/500).

8. Thomas Hill 3/. Nothing known of him except one source states it was him that married his cousin Mary Glenn Hill 3/, a daughter of his uncle Moses Berry Hill 2/.

CHILDREN OF JAMES HILL 2/ MOSES 1/. THE MOTHER WAS SUSANNAH GLENN.

1. James Glenn Hill 3/, b. 4 March 1807 in Union Co., SC. He died 27 December 1823.

2. Moses Green Berry Hill 3/, b. 17 Dec. 1808 Union Co., SC, d. 17 Aug. 1827.

3. Sarah Anderson Glenn Hill 3/. b. 21 Jan. 1811 Union Co. SC, unmarried. She d. 12 Dec. 1827.

4. William Henry Harrison Hill 3/. b. 27 Aug. 1813 Union Co., SC (note name of Harrison again). He d. 25 Dec. 1824.

5. John Thompson Hill 3/. b. 13 Feb. 1816 m. 1st on 5 July 1842 to cousin Elizabeth Pickett Mobley, dau. of his aunt Harriet Hill Mobley. He married 2nd time to Ann E. Meng. He d. 1887.

6. Susannah Elizabeth Hill 3/. b. 14 May 1817, m. Charner Terry Scaife on 6 Nov. 1832. She died as result of child birth on 28 July 1838.

7. George Washington Hill 3/. b. 5 May 1822, m. 1st Sarah Young on 15 Oct. 1851, 2nd to Sarah Jane Graham. He was the one that gave us lots of data. He d. 5 March 1909.

CHILDREN OF SARAH HILL 2/, DAUGHTER OF MOSES HILL 1/. HER HUSBAND WAS JOHN PEARSON.

1. Moses Hill Pearson 3/. The 1850 Census states he was born in NC ca. 1823. He moved with his parents to Green Co., Ala. and married 1st Martha A. Coleman, who d. 19 March 1848. He remarried to Nancy Rebecca Hutton. He had one known son by 1st marriage by name of, Edward C. Pearson 4/.

CHILDREN OF ELIZABETH HARRISON HILL 2/, DAUGHTER OF MOSES HILL 1/. HER HUSBAND WAS STEPHEN TERRY.

1. Green Berry Hill Terry 3/, b. 8 Nov. 1810 Chester Co., SC m. ca. 1830-31 Eleanor Gill. He d. 22 Mar. 1848.

2. Benjamin Terry 3/. b. 14 March 1813 Chester Co., SC, d. as infant on 7 April 1813.

3. John Westly Terry 3/. b. 7 Apr. 1814 Chester Co., SC m. 4 Apr. 1850 to 1st ?, 2nd Nancy Ferguson. He d. 8 Sept. 1898.

4. Sarah Caroline Terry 3/, b. 25 Feb. 1816 Chester Co., SC, m. James B. Morris.

5. Harriet Elizabeth Terry 3/, b. 14 Mar. 1818 Chester Co., SC, m. 13 Apr. 1840 Aaron Jones. She d. 9 Dec. 1890.

6. Jane Arrominta Terry 3/. b. 9 Mar. 1820 Chester Co., SC, m. 1st ca. 1839 to Benjamin M. Morris, 2nd a Mr. Gillispie.

7. Stephen Josephus Terry 3/. b. 14 May 1822 Chester Co., SC, m. ca. 1840 Martha Suggs. He d. after 1880.

8. Martha Amanda Terry 3/. b/ 23 July 1824 Chester Co., SC, m. Mr. Boyls.

9. Moses Andrew McKee Terry 3/. b. 2 Dec. 1826 Chester Co., SC. d. 7 May 1827 in DeKalb Co., Georgia.

10. Rebecca DeGraffenreid Terry 3/. b. 2 Feb. 1829 DeKalb Co., Ga., m. ca. 1843 Marshall M. Elliott. She d. 8 Oct. 1905.

11. James Littleton Terry 3/. b. 28 Oct. 1831 DeKalb? Ga. m. 3 Apr. 1851 Martha or Margaret Ann Medlock? He d. June 1917.

12. George Washington Terry 3/. b. 21 Aug. 1834 Ga., m. 21 Aug. 1851 to Elizabeth Lanier. He d. 20 June 1920 in Tampa, Fla.

1. James Leslie Stewart Hill 3/. b. 1815 in Chester Co., SC. He m. 1846 to Mary A.R. Sartor, 2nd to Margaret A. Beaty. He d. in Miss. 1902. Was a confederate soldier and sheriff in Miss. of Chickasaw Co.

2. Mary Glenn Hill 3/. b. 1822 Chester Co. SC. She m one of her cousins William W. Hill 3/ or Thomas Hill 3/, sons of her uncle Thomas Hill 2/.

3. Sarah Savilla Hill 3/. b. ca. 1818-20 Chester Co., SC. m. 1st Mr. Fleming, 2nd Mr. Gregory. She d. 12 Apr. 1878.

4. Moses Hill 3/. b. 25 Dec. 1821 Chester Co., SC. m. 5 Dec. 1843 Mary Elizabeth Wesson of Laurens Co., SC. He d. 12 Apr. 1878. His move to Arkansas was the beginning of several Hill descendents in that state.

3. Andrew C. Mobley 4/, 3rd child of the Mobleys. Born ca. 1830 in DeKalb Co. Ga.

4. Martha M. Mobley 4/. 4th Mobley child was b. 18 May 1837 in Alabama (Tuscaloosa Co.?). She m. 23 Sept. 1852 to Berryman Hall. There were children.

5. James Mobley 4/ b. ca. 1839 in Alabama, 6. Amelia Mobley 4/, b. ca. 1841 Tuscaloosa Co., Ala. 7. Edward B. Mobley b. ca. 1846 in Ala. This is 2nd son to have name of Edward. The next child was born by Nancy B. Hill 3/ and her 2nd husband William Price Sr.
