1. Thomas Hill transported from Newgate Prison to Maryland
on board ship "Forward Frigate" on October 18, 1722;
indentured servant.
2. Thomas Hill transported from Newgate Prison to Maryland
on board the ship "Rappahanock" on March 10, 1726-27;
indentured servant.
3. Thomas Hill immigrated from Middlesex, England to
Maryland on February 1, 1730, aged 19; indentured servant.
4. Thomas Hill transported from Kent, England, to Virginia
on board the ship "Caesar" on October 26, 1732; indentured
servant.
5. Thomas Hill immigrated to Virginia ca. 1639.
6. Thomas Hill transported from Surrey, England, to Maryland
on board the ship "Brigantine Sally" on August 26, 1741;
indentured servant.

7. Thomas Hill immigrated to Plymouth, Massachusetts, prior to June 7, 1637; soldier who volunteered to serve in the war against the Pequin Indians.

8. Thomas Hill immigrated to Virginia ca. 1750.

9. Thomas Hill immigrated from London, England to Maryland on board the ship "Diana" on March 28, 1774; aged 22, smith; indentured servant.

10. Thomas Hill immigrated from Essex, England to Virginia on board the ship "Virginia" on December 18, 1773, aged 35, schoolmaster; indentured servant.

INFORMATION ON SOME HILLS OF MARYLAND.

1. Thomas Hill (wife Christian Hill) immigrated 1652.
2. Thomas Hill Jr., son of above, married 1655 in Kent County Maryland to Margaret Balie.
3. A John Hill married in 1674 to ???
4. Samuel Hill, son of John, married in 1760
5. Thomas Hill married Christian Meek in 1763.
6. In a will, there is a deed?? in 1792 "Moses Hill from Thomas Meek," H-30, would seem to connect this Moses Hill to the Thomas Hill, that married Christian Meek (number 5 above). Was this two brothers who married sisters???
7. A Moses Hill died in 1763, seems to have left no children. His brothers were:
 - a. Thomas Hill
 - b. James Hill
 - c. Aaron Hill ** (see note below)
 - d. Samuel Hill (son of John??? # 4)

NOTE: It is my belief that the Aaron Hill listed above (as "c") is the same Aaron Hill who moved into Pasquatank County NC. I also believe that the father of the above 4 Hills was named Abraham Hill, who might be connected to the famous Sir John Hill, of England, and who's descendents came into Mass, moved southward through Penn., Md., Va., then into the area of Nansemond County Virginia, Chowan Co., N.C. and then into Pasquatank County N.C.

This Thomas Hill was said (by Mrs. Christopher) to have lived in the SW section of Union County and received his land grant in 1772. His family were staunch Baptist. Thomas Hill married to Miriam ----.

The above is not necessarily the order of birth (which are unknown in most cases, however William Hill administered the estate and appears to have been the oldest). Bird Hill seems to be the next oldest son. Martha Hill was dead by March 1827
