1. COLONEL WILLIAM HILL OF YORK COUNTY S.C. (REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER).

Col. William Hill York County, S.C. 1817 Case 22 File 913 Date of will 21 May 1814, Probated 2 January 1817. List of heirs: Jane (McCall) Hill, wife: sons: Solomen Hill, Andrew Hill, Robert Hill, William Hill; granddaughters: Margaret Malvern Alleson and Betsey Adeline Eveline Alleson; Grandson: Francis Ross. States in will that Margaret & Betsely Alleson were heirs of Dr. John Alleson, deceased. SIGNED William Hill York County Court Records indicate that in the 1790s William Hill was in financial difficulties. His son William (b. 1768) was shown to have been in York County in the early 1790s,

then for a time in Spartenburg County, but shortly after 1800 both Colonel William Hill and son William were back in York County, where Col. Hill acquired much land before his death on 1 December 1816 at age 76. His Iron works were burned by the British apparently accounted for his financial problems in the 1780s and 90s. The son William Hill was the oldest son.

1798, Mary Hill, daughter of Leonard Hill married Bennett Brown.

1798, Mary Hill, relict of Leonard Hill married_____? Campbell. (This might be Mary Micou m. 1st Leonard Hill).

Charles Hill died 1845. His children were: a. James Hill, no information.

- f. Sallie or Sophia married Charles Strange, lived in Greenville, S.C., has son Edward, of Chick Springs S.C. (1940).
- g. Ursula (Nutty) married a Parsons, left Polk County N.C., went west, buried at Antiock. (where is this ??).
- h. Francis Hill, no information.

i. Edith Hill, buried south of Blue Ridge, Georgia.

Felix Walker Hill, Mr. Muaney's ancestor married Elizabeth Cooper, on 1st February 1831. She was born 24th October 1811 at Cane Creek, Buncombe County, N.C. She died 15th November 1896 Union County, Georgia.

4. RUTHERFORD COUNTY N.C. COURTHOUSE DEEDS

A. WILLIAM HILL, bought for 75 pounds in 1786, 200 acres land on Mountain Creek, near Major Hampton on Main Broad River. (deed).

B. ABEL HILL, State Grant, 20th February 1794, 50 acres on Hill Creek, signed by Alexander Martin Esquire, our Governor Captain-General and Commander in Chief at Newburn on the 28th November in 17th year of our Independence 1792.

C. ABEL HILL, Abel Hill paid 100 pounds, proclamation money for 300 acres on McFadden's Creek of Second Broad River, first granted to John McFadden by letters? Patent bearing date of 16th December 1769 in 10th year of his Majesty's reign.

Other deeds found to George, Richard, Charles, John, Gustavis, Green and Jesse Hill.

5. GENEALOGY DATA ON A HILL FAMILY OF N.C. AND GEORGIA (SOURCE OF INFORMATION: "N.C. HISTORICAL & GENEALOGICAL REGISTER-JANUARY 1901." IT IS ALMOST CERTAIN THAT THIS FAMILY IS RELATED TO THE JOHN HILL FAMILY OF MASS., CONN, PENN. MD. AND VIRGINIA.

Henry Hill 1/, born 1660-75 married Mary----?. He died in Nansemond County Virginia ca. 1719-20. A son of his was Abraham Hill Sr. 2/, (wife Judy). Abraham Hill 2/ was born ca. 1698 probably in Nansemond County Virginia, later lived in Chowan County N.C. and died there in 1760. His sons were Henry Hill 3/, Abraham Hill 3/, Issac Hill 3/ and Theophilus Hill 3/.

Henry Hill 3/, oldest son of Abraham Hill 2 and wife Judy, was born in 1730, married Sarah Cotten. He died in 1804 in Wilkes County Georgia.

Henry Hill 3/, and wife Sarah Cotten had a son also named Henry Hill 4/, who was born ca. 1780-90 in Wilkes County Georgia. Henry Hill 4/ died after 9th March 1837 in Monroe County Georgia.

Abraham Hill Jr. 3/, who was the 2nd son of Abraham Hill Sr. 2/ and wife Judy, later removed from Chowan County N.C. to Wake County, N.C. ca 1768. Abraham Hill Jr. 3/ was born 23 April 1732, married in Chowan County on 7th January 1756 to CHRISTIAN WALTON, (daughter of Thomas & Sarah Walton) as appears from the following.... Deed of Gift recorded in BOOK II, Number 1, page 189, At Edenton, N.C. "From Thomas Walton to his son in law Abraham Hill Jr. 3/, & wife Christian (my daughter) dated 3rd August 1757. Test. Charles Roundtree, Hardy Hunter, Thomas Roundtree.

In the marriage bond, in the body, it gives the wife as Katherine but is briefed Christian. Thomas Walton, Surety to Bond.

Their children:

John 4/, Abraham 4/, Henry 4/, Sarah 4/, Julie 4/, Noah 4/, Clara 4/, Miles 4/, Wylie 4/, Polly 4/ and Thomas Hill 4/. Abraham Hill 4/, the 2nd son, was born on 14th January 1769.

Abraham Hill Sr. 3/, served as a Private in Lieutenant Colonel John Croppers command, attached to General Woodford's Brigade (see page 286 in Records of the Revolutionary War by W.T. Raffe??). Abraham Hill Jr. 3/, (Revolutionary Soldier) died in Wilkes County Georgia on 4th February 1792. His wife Christian died there on 6th July 1808. Abraham Hill Jr. 3/, and son of Abraham Hill Sr. 2/, and grandson of Henry Hill 1/, sold his landed estate in 1756 shortly after his marriage. This deed is signed by Abraham Hill Jr. 3/ and wife Christian and executed to Josiah Granberry. It is recorded in BOOK H, # 1, page 101, and dated 1756. Abraham Hill Jr. 3/ then removed (ca. 1765-68) to Wake County N.C..

There was a Henry Hill, born 1730 and died 1804, said to be a nephew of Abraham Hill Sr. 3/, served as a private in a N.C. Unit in the Revolution. This Henry Hill married about 1773 to Sarah Walton. Their 3rd son (Abraham Hill) was born in 1778. His children were Theophilus, John, Abraham; daughter Elizabeth Hill married Josiah Woods of Virginia. Daughter Nancy Hill married Colonel William Johnson of N.C. Another daughter, Sarah Hill, married _____Lumpkin; they removed to Wilkes County Georgia about 1790 and died there. Theophilus 4/, son of Theophilus 3/, died in S.C. in 1826.

One man named Abraham Hill, (obviously an older generation but believed to be of this family), was one of the Lords of Trade and was born in April 1663? (in England) and died 5th February 1721 in Kent County England.
