

DATA.059 A LIST OF LAND SALES BY VARIOUS HILL FAMILIES  
TAKEN FROM VARIOUS SOURCES.

(Sources for the following) Notes from Dr. Gertrude Foster>

1. Chester County Deed Book D, page 133:  
Between John McCullough and George Augusta Hill of Chester County S.C., 100 acres on 23 June 1774. (Amount of money not listed). Situated on Branch of Rocky Creek, bounded by Samuel McCullough, James Crawford, and Alexander Crawford etc...
2. Chester Deed Book O, page 101  
Paid by Stark Hill, 1601/2 acres conveyed from Ferdinand Hopkins to Atterbury on waters of Bushy Fork, branch of Broad River at Joel Triplett. 1808. Wit: William Foote and V. Foote.
3. Chester Deed Book W, Page 95, (Recorded Feb. 3, 1822)  
Hiram Hill...\$1000.00 to me paid by William Foote, 299 acres. One tract estimated as 117 acres, conveyed January 11th 1790 by Daniel Hopkins to James Mitchel Sr., to John Hancock on August 10th 1811, by James Hancock to John Foote on 9th Nov. 1815, by him to Hiram Hill. Other Tract 100 acres conveyed December 22nd 1795 by Ferdinand Hopkins to William Hill Sr., and same by William Hill, deceased, to said Hiram Hill the 4th of December 1797 and given (in?) his will to the William Hill (deceased). Also one tract of 7 acres sold by Thomas Moore to Hiram Hill...

(Despite the fact that the above was recorded in Chester County, and the land MAY have been in Chester County, it is suspected that the 100 acre tract conveyed on December 22, 1795 by Ferdinand Hopkins to William Hill, was to William Hill Sr., of Fairfield County. He died in 1790 and left all in his will to son William Hill Jr. (wife Dorcas Mobley). John Foote was guardian of John and Mary Hill of Fairfield County).

Present at sale of William Hill (Estate) Asaph Hill, Richard Hill, Abel Hill, Thomas Mobley, Dannie Major & Edward Mobley.

Reference: (Fairfield District) Dated 21 September 1790  
Bond of Administration of William Hill Sr.'s Estate, 500 pounds in one place, 300 pounds in another. Late William Hill, planter, deceased. Letters of Administration granted to William Hill Jr.

Ferdinand Hopkins of Chester District sells to Richard Hill  
(of Fairfield?) 100 acres on John's Creek for \$ 332.00.

FAIRFIELD DEED BOOK MM, PAGE 18  
Richard Hill sells unto Reuben Hill, 100 acres of land for  
\$425.00, 100 acres located on John's Creek, a warrantee Deed,  
surveyed by Benjamin Lindsey.

ANSON COUNTY N.C., BOOK B2, PAGE 24, 5TH NOVEMBER 1786

A Joseph White sold to Thomas Hill, 188 acres, part of a  
tract surveyed for Robert White in 1768. This land was sold  
to Zachariah White by "THOMAS HILL OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY S.C."  
on 28th November 1793. (Thomas signed his name to this sale).  
BOOK C2, page 261.

1. In 1784 287 and 1/2 acres of land in Washington County was  
granted to a Moses Hill.
2. On 13th December 1791, Moses Hill and wife Hannah, of the  
State of Georgia, a deed bearing the date of December  
13th, 1791 for a parcel of land in Wilkes County Georgia.

3. October 9th 1796, Moses Hill to Jessee Richetson  
(Richardson ?) for 200 acres on Water of Briar Creek,  
granted in 1790. (Source: Georgia Genealogical Magazine
