James Hill was granted 500 acres in 1784.

Isaac Hill died in Bertie County, N.C... had a grandson named Henry Hill, who was son of John (Jolin?) Hill.

Hampton Hill 1800-1851 married Eudocia Lane, daughter of Joseph Lane Jr. and his wife, Elizabeth Hill, the daughter of Isaac Hill (1761-1833) and wife Nancy Crane (Cain? Lane? sic) Hill, a sister of Nancy Lane, (sic) (Crane?) who married Judge Walter Terry Colquitt. Hampton Hill was the first husband of Eudocia Lane, who married a 2nd time to Joseph Winship of Atlanta, Georgia.

ABRAHAM HILL 3/.

Abraham Hill 3/ settled in Wilkes County, Georgia in 1780 or 1781. By tradition he was of Scotch-Irish extraction. His grandparents (Henry Hill 1/ & Mary Hinton?) moved from Nansemond County, Virginia to Chowan County, N.C. (now Gates

Co.) in 1770 and here his father, Abraham Hill 2/ was born. Abraham Hill 2/ married Judith Hunter and they had 6 children, four sons and two daughters. The four sons were: Abraham Hill 3/, Henry Hill 3/, Isaac Hill 3/ & Theophilus Hill 3/. The daughters were Sarah Hill 3/ m. Jacob Hunter and Mary Hill 3/ m. a Mr. Easton.

Abraham Hill 3/ married Christian Walton in NC in 1756. He died in 1792 and his wife died in 1808. Both are buried on their old estate in Wilkes County. Their son Thomas Hill 4/ and his wife Sarah McGee, are also buried there as is their grandson, Jason A. Hill 5/ and his wife Amelia Hill. The last two were cousins.

Abraham Hill's 3/ home was very near the Indian line and in 1790 was only 20 miles away from the line. During that same year the Indian line was moved 20 miles further west.

Henry Hill 3/, brother of Abraham 3/, married Sarah Cotten. They moved to Georgia from N.C. in 1787. Henry Hill 3/ died ca. 1800-04 and his wife died ca. 1812-1814. They had four sons: John Hill 4/, Abraham Hill 4/, Theophilus Hill 4/ and Henry Hill 4/. These names are the exact same names as were the sons of his brother, Abraham Hill 3/.

Isaac Hill 3/, a brother of Abraham 3/ and Henry Hill 3/, came to Wilkes County, Georgia but later resided in Clarke or Franklin County, Georgia.

Hampton Hill 1800-1851 married Eudocia Lane, daughter of Joseph Lane Jr & his wife Elizabeth Hill, daughter of Isaac Hill (1761-1833) and Nancy (Crain) Hill, and the sister of Nancy Lane, who was married to Judge Walter Terry Colquitt. Hampton Wooten Hill was the first husband of Eudica Lane. She married second time to Joseph Winship, of Atlanta, Georgia.

Abraham Hill b. 1697 in Nansemond County, Va. moved to Chowan County, N.C. and died there in 1760. He married Judith Hunter, b. 1708 in Chowan County. Among their children was a son:

Henry Hill, b. 1730, m. Sarah Cotten in 1756, he died in 1804 in Wilkes Co., Ga.. They were the

grandparents to Henry W. Hill.

Henry W. Hill 5/, born 9th January 1827 in Wilkes County, Georgia, was a son of Abraham Hill 4/, son of Henry Hill 3/ & Sarah Cotten. The mother of Henry W. Hill 5/ was Clarissa Callaway, born in Georgia.

Henry W. Hill 5/ married 3 times, the 1st to Mary Lipscomb on 12th July 1849, the 2nd to Ann T. Hall on 27th March 1855 & the 3rd time to Mrs. Mary E. Girault on 25th February 1859.

Abraham Hill 3/ settled in Wilkes County, Georgia in 1780 or 1781. By Tradition he was of Scotch-Irish extraction. His grandparents removed from Nansemond County, Virginia to Chowan (now Gates) County, N.C. in 1770? There were four brothers named; Abraham 3/; Henry 3/; Isaac 3/ & Theophilus Hill 3/.

Abraham Hill 3/ married Christian Walton in 1756. He died in 1792 and both he and wife are buried on the old estate in Wilkes County, Georgia. So is their son Thomas Hill 4/ and wife Sarah McGee and their grandson Jas. A. Hill 5/ and his wife Amelia Hill.

He acquired land on both side of Long Creek, about three miles above its confluence with Dry Fork & about 20 miles northwest of Washington, Georgia.

His home was very near the Indian line and in 1790 the Cherokee border was only 20 miles west of Washington. During the same year it was moved 20 miles further west.

A brother, Henry Hill 3/ married Sarah Cotten. They moved to Georgia from North Carolina in 1787. Henry Hill 3/ died ca. 1804, his wife died in 1812 or 1814. They had four sons, John Hill 4/; Abraham Hill 4/; Theophilus Hill 4/ & Henry Hill 4/. Their names are the same as Abraham's 3/ children.

Isaac Hill 3/, brother of Abraham Hill 3/, came to Wilkes County, Georgia in 1787 but later resided in Clarke or Franklin County, Georgia.
