Edward Young Hill, Judge of Superior Court of Troup County 1845 to 1850. He was also Captain of Militia in 1856.

The city of West Point was incorporated in 1831. Dr. George W. Hill (son of Green Washington Hill) suggested that it be called Franklin.

In 1835 the limits of West Point were extended and Green Washington Hill being a commissioner.
