ISAAC HILL 1/ (FIRST KNOWN GENERATION)

Isaac Hill 1/ was born probably in Halifax County, N.C. in 1775. He was married to Courtney Braswell in 1797. She is believed to have been born in Raleigh, N.C. They moved to Monroe County, Georgia, near Forsyth and they both died and were buried four (4) miles from Forsyth, Georgia in 1852 (sic). This family is said to have originated in Virginia, then went to N.C. and finally Georgia.

WILL OF HENRY HILL

Monroe County) March 9th 1837

In the name of God Amen, I HENRY HILL SENIOR being in sound mind and memory do constitute make and ordain this my last Will & Testament.

1st I recommend my soul to God and that my body be decently buried.

2nd I will that all my just debts be paid out of my estate after my death.

3rd I give to my beloved wife OBEDIENCE HILL all my lands consisting of Four Hundred and Five Acres, it being lot Number 5 in the 12th district and half lot Number 7 in the same district and Lot Number 9 in the 13th district during her life time and after her death to be equally divided among my three sons FIELDING HILL, WILIE HILL and HENRY HILL JR.

4th I also give to my beloved wife OBEDIENCE HILL during her life time all my perishable (sic) property and Negroes and their women to wit: Susan, Albert, Julia, Lydia, Whitt, Amy, Elesy, Lucinda, Gracy, Cesear, Seaborn and David and after her death to be equally divided among my eight children, FIELDING HILL, MARTHA COWARD, WILIE HILL, HENRY HILL JR., MARY POWELL, SINTHY HILL, NANCY HILL AND REBECCA HILL, day and date above written.

5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son FIELDING HILL, WILIE HILL, and HENRY HILL my three and lawful Executors to said Will, Given under my hand and seal. Signed, sealed in present of

same truly voluntarily and without compulsion. Sworn to and
