HANCOCK COUNTY, GEORGIA.

HANCOCK COUNTY, GEORGIA

Records from N.C. shows that Isaac Hill Sr. performed service
in the American Revolution in that state.

Book C, Page 37, Allowed by Auditor of Edenton, District, No.
1165, to Isaac Hill, Voucher No. 3736, 16 pounds, no
shillings, no pence. April 1781.

Book K, Page 26, for sundries paid by William Skinner,
Treasurer of Edenton District, 1006 to Isaac Hill, clothing
certificate No. 700. September 1781.

Martin County Deed Book A., Page 556, John Jones of said
county to Isaac Hill of said county, 200 acres. 25 June 1784.
Edgecombe County, N.C. Deed Book 5, Page 533, dated 20th
August 1790, Henry Irvin Toole of said county to Isaac Hill,
of Martin County, 280 acres in Edgecombe County.

Two deeds give Isaac Hill as Attorney for Richard Clark, of
Hancock County, Georgia in 1803, so it seems that Isaac Hill
removed to Hancock County, Georgia between 1800-1803.

Comments: I believe this to be the same Isaac Hill who left
MD. to NC, then GA & finally TN. In Georgia, he married a
two time widow, Lydia White Jones Hill, widow of Hugh Jones &
a unrelated to Isaac Hill named William Hill.

Hancock County) Know all men by these presents that I,
Isaac Hill, of the same state and county aforesaid, for and
in consideration of the natural love and affection which I do
bear to my granddaughter, Elinor Morgan, her heirs,
executors, administrators and assigns forever, have given,
granted and by these presents freely give and grant to my
said granddaughter, Elinor Morgan, one Negro girl, named
Mill, which said Negro girl I have freely given and delivered
by these presents to my said grand daughter Elinor Morgan,
her and her heirs forever and in case of death before she
arrives to the age of 18 or married, the said Negro girl
shall descend to her sister Lythia Morgan, and until she
arrives at that age or marries, the said Negro to remain in
the father's (David Morgan's) hands, in trust for the said
Elinor Morgan.

Hancock County) Know all men by these presents that I,
David Morgan, of the same state and county aforesaid, for and
in consideration of the natural love, good will and affection
I have and do bear towards my two daughters, Elinor Morgan
and Lythia Morgan, their heirs, executors, administrators or
assigns, have given and granted and do by these presents
freely give and grant, first to my eldest daughter, Elinor
Morgan, one feather bed and furniture, half a dozen plates,
one dish, one case knives and forks and fifty dollars in cash
and secondly to my second daughter, Lythia Morgan, I give one

Negro girl named Poll, one feather bed and furniture, half a dozen plates, one dish, one case of knives and forks and fifty dollars in cash, all which property I have freely given and delivered by these presents to my said daughters, them and their heirs and assigns forever and in case of death of either of them, the surviving one to heir the whole at the age of 18 years or if married before that age, the said property is to be divided up to them by me, who holds the said property in trust for my said daughters.

According to the Georgia Royster of American Revolutionary Soldiers, William Hill, James Hill & Joshua Hill served under Col. Elijah Clarke.

GEORGIA INFORMATION ON A WILLIAM HILL

Records from Family Bible of Mr. & Mrs. Jas. (James?) R. Hill

William B. Hill, father of James R. Hill, was born April 9th, 1798.

[Note: Something is wrong with this birth date of April 9th, 1798. I understand this to mean that James was born in 1798 because two of his brothers (ie John (b. ca.1762) & William (b. 1710) are said to have fought in Revolution. I also question the 1710 birth of the son William. He would have been a man nearly 80 years old when the Revolution was fought from 1776 till 1782. Perhaps that was for the father].

Mary A. Pratt, wife of William B. Hill, was born June 8th, 1807. They were married on May 3rd, 1825.

children of the above Wm. B. Hill & Mary A. Pratt:

William (Hill), Mrs. Mary Hill Mooney, Jack, John, James, Rouland, Mrs. Georgia A. Hill Bramblett, Mrs. Martha Hill Pierce.

James R. Hill was born on October 29th 1844, married Fannie Chamblis, born December 24th, 1852.

[Note: The following are also listed as children but if they served in the Revolution, I do not see them as children of Wm B. Hill & Mary Pratt. Perhaps they were brothers of Wm. B. Hill.].

William Hill Sr., Revolutionary Soldier, (born?) about. 1710
Above Bible records in possession of Mrs. Jas. (James?)
Harold Nicholson, formerly of Madison, now of Atlanta,

Asa Hill to Elizabeth Barksdale 8 October 1809

Comments: These 3 men were sons of Isaac Hill & Lucinda
Wallace, who came from Maryland, to NC, GA & finally to TN.
