

L.001 THE AUDIT OF LEONARD HILL'S ACCOUNT FOR HIS SERVICE OF 180 DAYS IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR BY THE COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF SOUTH CAROLINA IN BOOK "N" INDENT NUMBER 41 (AA 3605) ON 12TH MARCH 1784.

Appeared LEONARD HILL and made oath that the above voucher is just and true and that he did the above mentioned service, mentioned in GENERAL PICKEN'S Brigade in CAPTAIN CARTER'S Company.

1784 MARCH 10TH I have this day received from R. (RICHARD) WINN ESQ., the full value of my account against the public, now lying in the Auditor's Office, for auditing and afterwardly to get an Indent for the same from the Treasury, and I do request the Commissioner's of the Treasury of the State of South Carolina to make out the Indent for the same with the Interest pursuant to the Resolve of the Legislature, to that case to him the said RICHARD WINN and to accept this as a receipt in full for the said account against the public.
