

L.008 LISTED BELOW IS THE WILL OF LEONARD HILL, FOUND IN BOOK 6, PAGE 30, 1825 OF CLARK CO. KY. THE WILL WAS DATED 4TH JULY 1825, MADE IN CLARK COUNTY KENTUCKY, AND PROVEN IN AUGUST 1825. ALSO LISTED ARE OTHER LEGAL PAPERS CONCERNING THE ESTATE.

NOTES: This is the same Leonard Hill, who prior to 1788, lived in Fairfield County, South Carolina. In 1788 Leonard Hill & his wife Elizabeth sold their land in Fairfield County to a Thomas Hill before moving to Kentucky. Leonard Hill is said to be the brother of Moses Hill of Fairfield County by a genealogist named DeLorme of Columbia, South Carolina. I also believe him to be the brother to the THOMAS HILL, to whom he sold his S.C. land to in 1788.

THE WILL OF LEONARD HILL

In the name of God (Amen), I LEONARD HILL, of the county of Clark and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but sound mind and perfect memory (Blessed be the Almighty God for the same) do make, ordain and publish this Instrument of Writing, to be my last will and testament, in manner and form following

1st... I will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and certainable like manner and that all my debts be paid.

2nd...After the debts are paid, I will and desire and bequeath unto my daughter MARY WILLIFORD, who is the daughter of SUSANNAH DUNFORD, a Negro woman named "Jinny," a Negro woman named Hillis, a Negro man named Isaac, a Negro man named Lewis and a Negro girl named Lucy, with the increase of the female (females) of them, to the said MARY WILLIFORD, during her natural life and after her death, to her children and heirs at law, equally, to be divided between (them?) forever.

3rd...I also will and bequeath to said MARY WILLIFORD, the plantation on which she now lives, say one hundred acres (100 acres), fifty acres of which I left to her and the other fifty acres thereof I sold to JAMES GIBSON in his lifetime, to her and heir children and heirs at law (that?) are near to claim or?....any of the residue of my Estate herein after mentioned.

4th... I will and bequeath to RACHEL DUNFORD, during her lifetime, one equal third part (one third) of all my Estate, both real and personal, except what I have herein before devised to MARY WILLIFORD and her children and my son MOSES HILL, who is also son of said RACHEL DUNFORD, (who) has the privilege of living with said RACHEL DUNFORD in the house I now live in, as long as said RACHEL DUNFORD lives and the

third part of my land, which I bequeath to said RACHEL DUNFORD, is to include the house which I now live in.

6th...(Is this 5 or did 5 start at the underlined part above?) After the death of said RACHEL DUNFORD, I will and bequeath that the third part of my Estate, which is given to ..(paper cuts off here)(her????) in this will, I give and bequeath to JOHN HILL, my said son of RACHEL DUNFORD, MOSES HILL my son and son of RACHEL DUNFORD and SARAH LILLIAN, my daughter and daughter of SUSANNAH DUNFORD, to them and their heirs FOREVER and equally to be divided between them.

7th...As to the other two thirds parts of my Estate BOTH real and personal, not herein before disposed of, I will and bequeath the same to said JOHN HILL, my son and son of RACHEL DUNFORD, MOSES HILL, my son and son of RACHEL DUNFORD and SARAH LILLIAN, my daughter and daughter of RACHEL DUNFORD and ELIZABETH (FOSTER?), my daughter and daughter of SUSANNAH DUNFORD, to them their heirs and assigns FOREVER (Paper cuts off here) and equally to be divided between them, I DO HEREBY REVOKE (DISANNUL) and make void all other wills and testaments by me here after at anytime made and do declare this to be my only true and last will and testimony WHEREOF I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 4th day of JULY 1825. his (SIGNED) LEONARD (X) HILL (LS) mark

ITEM # 3, 188 acres on Kentucky River in Clark County @ \$ 6.68 & 3/4 per acre, purchased by NATHAN WILLIFORD (2nd husband of Mary Hill, dau. of Leonard Hill).

ITEM # 4, 175 acres (or 195 acres) purchased by JOHN HILL of land located on the south side of Kentucky River in Madison Co., Ky. (John son of Leonard Hill).

Florah, a woman (prby elderly)
Peter, a man
Hannah, a woman (prby elderly)
Willis, a man

Apparently LEONARD HILL had 13 slaves in 1810 (he was taxed for that number). Leonard Hill was a man of substantial means in Clark County Ky. He was a large land owner from the acreage sold at his death. Most of the men who were witnesses to his will and also appointed Executors were from Culpeper County Virginia.
