Dear Ms. Butler,

Your letter dated 15 January 1990 was received with interest. I am always glad to hear from others regarding genealogical data on ANY Hill line. My hobby is collecting any and all Hill data, whether part of my line or not. Please send what ever you can on any Moses Hill of N.C. I would love to know more of him.

Please note that my correct name is Robert R. Hill, not Robert S. Hill. I do not really mind, but we might as well get things squared off correctly from the beginning.

Another thing, somehow Win Jacobs has made a mistake. I am descended from MOSES HILL of Fairfield County, South Carolina, and not North Carolina. My Moses Hill was also a Revolutionary Soldier, but not from N.C. As a descendent of his, I am a member of the SAR.

My Moses Hill was born 1757/58 and died in Fairfield County on July 1st 1821. He is buried in what was once the front yard to his house. We have not been able to locate his parents or his origins. I suspect a Maryland connection but I am just as equally certain of a N.C. origin.

His wife was Savilla N. (Nance?) Roden, b. 1759 and died in Green County, Alabama on 23 July 1844. Their first child, Thomas Hill (1780-1824) was my 3rd great grandfather. He married Jemima Woodward ca. 1805.

Now in reference to your Hill line, I had a whole computer disk full of Hill Genealogy from Georgia, but was working one night and a power failure caused me to loose every bit of it. I still have the raw data but eh gads, what a job that would be to try to re-enter it. I could never get it like I had it originally and so far I have not even tried, but I will have to start working on it a little at a time.

I have found the following information among my files:

R-5001 ISAAC HILL, served in the Revolution from N.C. and died in Habersham County, Georgia on 20th October 1844. He was married 1st to Anna Harrison in Johnston County, N.C. and who died during the Revolution. His 2nd marriage was to Elizabeth Sing on 17th September 1857???? Amos Hill of Habersham County (Aged 84) was their only surviving child. (What date was the age of 84 based on?).

NOTE: Reference Isaac Hill (R-5001) The date of his 2nd marriage (1857) is obviously wrong as he died in 1844. I would have to also question the wife being Elizabeth Sing.

Following taken from a book entitled "Gone to Georgia." I forgot to copy the author's name.

In 1827, Isaac Hill, the veteran, was in Clarke County, Anderson Hill was in Franklin County; Thomas (2), Thomas' orphans, Joshua, Ambrose, Berry, James and William in Gwinnett County; Mordecai Hill, Revolutionary Soldier (drew Muskogee and Lee Counties Land granted 1830 and 1838), Catherine, widow of a Revolutionary soldier, Benjamin, Isaiah, Joseph L., Sarah, widow of a Revolutionary soldier, and widow Nancy in Jasper County; Enoch Hill and George W. Hill in Henry County; James Hill and widow Sarah in DeKalb County; Jesse (a boy) and Elias in Newton County; Isaac, Hinton A., Amos and Percilla, widow of a Revolutionary soldier, in Habersham County; and Jeremiah and Magdalin in Hall County.

At first I thought this was his second wife, but after reviewing it closely it just may mean that Amos Hill was in Habersham County, Georgia along with a widow of a Revolutionary Soldier, who's name was "Percilla." Perhaps Elizabeth Sing was his second wife. At the same time this "Percilla" may well be his second wife. I do not know her last name.

I am of the opinion that you are just one step away from a connection to establishing your Hill line back into Virginia (Nansemond County). I would be willing to bet just about anything that your Isaac Hill is connected somehow to one of the families of a Henry Hill or an Abraham Hill or one of their children. This Family was originated from a Henry Hill of Nansemond County, Virginia, who moved to Chowan County, N.C. Also a Henry Hill (son of Abraham Hill) moved to Georgia as well. His wife was I think Sarah Cotten. Should you ever make that connection (or want it anyway) I have quite a bit that I can send to you. Let me know if you want it.

Meanwhile, again, I would certainly appreciate any thing available on Moses Hill of N.C. Or for that matter any Hill data you have. I am glad to exchange information with you.
