

MD.004 THE WILL OF MOSES HILL, OF BALTIMORE COUNTY
MARYLAND, DATED 14TH OCTOBER 1763. MARYLAND STATE ARCHIVES,
PREROGATIVE COURT (WILLS) 31, PP. 1018-1019.

Collected and entered by Robert R. Hill Sr in April 1987.

I, MOSES HILL, of Baltimore County in the Province of
Maryland do make and ordain this my last will and testament
in writing in manner and form following, TO WIT: (Imprimns??)
I give and bequeath unto my loving brother THOMAS HILL, my
suit of Manchester Velvet Clothes, which suit of clothes I
give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas and no more of my
Estate of any kind whatsoever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my loving brother JAMES HILL
my suit of Hairboin Cloths (Clothes?) which suit of clothes I
give and bequeath unto my said brother James and no more of
my Estate of any kind whatsoever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my loving brother AARON HILL
my suit of white Broad Cloth Clothes, which was my wedding
suit which said suit of clothes I give and bequeath unto my
said brother Aaron and no more of my Estate of any kind
whatsoever.

ITEM; I give and bequeath unto my loving wife MARGARET HILL
all the residue of my Estate in what ever manner or way it
may consist after all my just debts are paid to her, her
heirs and assigns forever AND LASTLY I do nominate my beloved
wife MARGARET HILL and my loving brother SAMUEL HILL the
Executors of this my last and only will, willing and desiring
my said executors out of my estate to raise what will be
necessary and pay off all my just debts- IN TESTIMONY whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
Fourteenth day of OCTOBER ANNO DOM Seventeen Hundred and
Sixty Three (14 October 1763).

MOSES HILL (Seal)

the legator to be his last will & Testament
& at his request and in his presence we
have subscribed our names as evidence
thereto.

ELIZABETH HILL
JAMES SPAVOLD
AMOS GARRETT

November 3, 1763, ELIZABETH HILL being one of the people
called (Quakers?) did solemnly affirm and declare that she
saw the legator MOSES HILL sign seal and deliver the
foregoing as his last will and testament, that at the time of
his so doing, he was to the best of their apprehension of
sound and disposing mind and memory, that she subscribed her

name as WITNESS to the said will and she further affirms and declares that she saw the other two witnesses JAMES SPAVOLD and AMOS GARRETT sign their respective names as Witnesses to the said will.

Affirmed before M. YOUNG DOMRY
Baltimore County

Note by Robert Hill: I am of the opinion that this Hill Family is somehow related to the Hills (also Quakers and with same given names) that settled in Pasquotank and Perquimans Counties of North Carolina. At first I actually thought it was the same family but Quaker records seem to indicate otherwise. Those Hills in N.C. originated from an immigrant (Quaker) named Samuel Hill.

I also suspect some of these Hills may have moved into northern Virginia (not proved).
