ISAAC W. HILL 4/.

Brief Genealogy: Isaac W. Hill 4/ (Revolutionary Soldier) was
born on 10th February 1761 in Chowan County, N.C. and stated
he moved with his family to Wake County, N.C. when he was 6
years old (1767). He appears to have been the son of Isaac
Hill 3/ & wife Nancy Evans or Anna Harrison (different
source). Isaac Hill 3/ was a son of Abraham Hill 2/, who
lived & died in Chowan County, N.C., and his wife Judith
Hunter. Another source says her maiden name was Judith
Perry. Abraham Hill 2/ was a son of Henry Hill 1/ of
Nansemond County, Virginia, who moved to Chowan County, N.C.

Isaac W. Hill 4/ was married to Nancy Crane. He moved to
Wilkes County, Georgia where he married the above Nancy in
March of 1784. He later moved to Clarke County, Georgia. He
died on 15th August 1833 in Clarke County Georgia.

Abstract of Will of Clarke County, Georgia named Wife: Nancy

(Note: Bible record shows a daughter Nancy Hill born 28th
September 1799 but was not mentioned in will, apparently she
died earlier).

The following found among court record: "Be it remembered
that I have drawn a tract of land in the County of Muscogee

when drawn, which I drew as a Revolutionary soldier and not intended to be included in the foregoing request. It is my will that the said tract of land be sold after my death."

PENSION APPLICATION FOR ISAAC HILL'S REVOLUTIONARY PENSION BENEFITS, FILED BY HIS WIDOW, NANCY HILL, FOR HIS SERVICE IN NORTH CAROLINA, NUMBER W-3812, PENSION PAPERS FILED IN GEORGIA & PENSION CERTIFICATE ISSUED 4TH MARCH 1843. HE WAS ORIGINALLY FROM CHOWAN CO., N.C.

STATE OF GEORGIA) ON THIS 14TH DAY OF MARCH 1838...

CLARK COUNTY) Personally appeared in open court before William Dickens, presiding Judge of the Superior Court of said County, now sitting, ISAAC HILL, a resident of the County of Clark and state aforesaid, aged Seventy One (71) years--who being first duly sworn according to law, doth make his oath (&) make the following declarations, in order to obtain the benefits of the Act of Congress, passed 7th of (JUNE??) 1832. That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as here in states...he was born on the 10th day of February 1761 in CHOWAN COUNTY, IN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, He knows his age from the information of his parents and from having seen their old Family Record, such is now destroyed but which he directly recorded, his father moved to WAKE COUNTY when he was SIX YEARS OF AGE and there he remained with his father until he entered the service of the United States Army (being then 19 years old and a volunteer) under General Sumpter, under whom he served THREE MONTHS TOUR. Charles Robertson was Colonel of the Regiment, Robert Bean Captain of the Company and William Smyth Lieutenant. (IN?) which tour there was an engagement with British and Tories on the waters of Big Broad River and in this engagement a fort was taken in South Carolina. In the second tour, he was drafted and had a skirmish under General Butler at the SHALLOW FORD on the YADKIN RIVER in North Carolina. He was in the army and commanded by General Sumpter, at the time Gates was defeated in South Carolina. In his second tour of two weeks after the first served, 3 months-----commanded by GREENE, BUTLER, WILLIAM MOORE was the Colonel of the regiment, Nedious Bryant his captain, John Hopkins?? (Hoysn??) Lieutenant. After this second tour, which he believed was the last in the Revolutionary War, he was discharged and that discharge he has long since lost. This comprised the principal important events that transpired during MR. HILL'S attachment to the United States army---He asserts that he has no documentary evidence and that he knows no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service. He hereby relinquishes every claim what ever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the

Pension role of the agency of any state. SWORN TO & SUBSCRIBED THE DAY & YEAR AFORESAID.

DECLARATION

In order to obtain benefits of the Act of Congress of the 7th of July 1838, entitled an Act Granting Half Pay and Pensions to Certain Widows,

STATE OF GEORGIA)

CLARK COUNTY) On this fourteenth (14th) day of October 1844, before me the Subscribing Justice of the Inferior Court for said County personally MRS. NANCY HILL, a resident of the county and state aforesaid, aged Seventy Eight (78) years part who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the Provisions made by the Act of Congress, passed July 7th 1838 entitled "An Act Granting Half Pay and Pensions to Certain Widows" that she is the widow of ISAAC HILL, of the county and state aforesaid, the identical person who was a pensioner of the United States under the Act of Congress of the term 1832 in the county and state aforesaid, at the rate of \$ 20.00 per annum, that the said ISAAC HILL was a private in the War of the Revolution and served in the NORTH CAROLINA MILITIA and for proof of his service, she refers to the evidence on which he drew his pension and this deponent further states that the said ISAAC HILL died on the Fifteenth (15th) day of August, Eighteen Hundred and Thirty Three (1833) in Clark County, State of Georgia, and this deponent further declares that she was married to the said ISAAC HILL on the _____ day of March, Seventeen Hundred and Eighty Four (1784) by John George, a Justice of the Peace, according to the laws of the state, in Wilkes County, STATE OF GEORGIA, that she has no documentary evidence having no family register, that she knows of no person living who could testify to the fact of their having been married on the day aforesaid, that they resided in the County of Wilkes for the (span of his???) or eight years and removed from there to Clark County, where her husband died on the day aforesaid, leaving her as his widow and that she is still his widow, that she was not married prior to her husband's last service, but was married from the 1st day of January 1794 (viz) at the time of above, states all of which will more fully appear by reference to proof hereunto annexed.
