STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

To all whome these presents shall come, GREETINGS, KNOW YE that we, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty Shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into our Treasuey by THOMAS HILL, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said THOMAS HILL a tract of land containing One Hundred and Sixty Acres, lying and being in our county of Chatham, on the head waters of Rockey River, Beginning at a Post Oak (tree) in Thomas Branson's line, running South Ninety Eight poles to a Black Oal (tree) in N (W?) Cullseh's line thence along his line South fifty five degrees East fifty two poles to a stake, thence South forty five degrees West Seventy Six poles to a stake, thence East along James and David Vestals' line Two Hundred poles to a stake, thence North One Hundred and fourteen poles to a Black Oak (tree), thence West Eighty Eight poles to a stake in Branson's line, thence along his line North Seventy poles to a Post Oak (tree), thence West along the head of said river One Hundred poles to the first station as by the plat presents (annexed?) doth appear Together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditemants and Appurtenances to the said land, belonging or appertaining TO Hold to the said THOMAS HILL his heirs and assigns forever yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise as our General Assembly from time to time may direct PROVIDED always that the said THOMAS HILL shall cause this grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said county of Chatham within twelve months from the date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect.

IN TESTIMONY whereof We have caused our great seal to be hereunto affixed WITNESSETH RICHARD CASWELL ESQUIRE, Our Governor General and Commander in Chief at Kingston, the Thirty First Day of March in the Fourth Year of Our Independence and in the Year of One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty (31 March 1780).
