NILES INFORMATION

(Copied word for word)

I am Theresa Igunetta Niles, better known as Nettie or Net. I was born in Glendale, Wisconsin on July 18th, 1876. My father's name was Henry Boshaw, born in Canada in 1834. My mother was Sally Rachel Wolf, born in Kega Falls on January 5, 1839.

My mother and father met in Maumee, Ohio and were married there. Five children were born to them in Ohio:

1. Caroline, born January 9th, 1860.
2. Emaline, born March 22, 1862, died August 2nd, 1891.
3. Frank, born September 22nd, 1864, died 1950.
4. Charles, born June 20th, 1868, died 1950.
5. Elizabeth (Mabel), born August 21st, 1872, died July 25th, 1919.

My family moved to Glendale, Wisconsin where I was born on 18th July 1876. My father died at the age of 58 on February 7th, 1886. Twenty years later, my mother married John Wharton and they lived in Hancock, Wisconsin.

I met Bill Niles at a masquerade ball in Necedah, Wisconsin where he worked on the Milwaukee Railroad. On July 2nd, 1893,

I was married to WILLIAM HADLOCK NILES in Necedah, Wisconsin at the Niles residence by Reverend Charles Horton, a Methodist Minister.

We went to live in Babcock, Wisconsin, where my husband was working on the Milwaukee Railroad. Our first child was born on December 3rd, 1894, and was named AMASA PINCKNEY, by his great grandma, Jane Hadlock Niles. We then moved to Necedah, Wisconsin where ALICE MARIE was born on July 30th, 1896. We then moved to Tomah, Wisconsin where NORMA GLADYS was born on March 2nd, 1898.

We moved to Minneapolis, when Bill was employed by the Soo Line Railroad. HELEN MARIA was born on 27th Avenue in Minneapolis on January 23rd, 1901. PEARL ANN was born April 20th, 1903 in Minneapolis, over Smidler's Meat Market on Central Avenue. From Minneapolis, we moved to Weyerhauser, Wisconsin. We lived in Clark's house when RUTH MARSHEY was born on August 28th, 1903. INEZ JENNIE was born in the Stubb's house in Weyerhauser on October 12th, 1909. We moved to the Skogstad house where WILLIAM HENRY FRANK was born on January 20th, 1912. We then moved to Goodman, Wisconsin. I traveled back and forth from Goodman to Weyerhauser to take care of my mother during her long illness.

On April 14th, 1914, at the age of 75, my mother passed away and was laid to rest in Weyerhauser, Wisconsin. After the funeral, we arranged for her husband, John Wharton, to go to New York State to his daughter. In return for the deed to my father's lot in Ohio, I was given the deed to mother's lot in Weyerhauser.

We moved to Rhinelander, Wisconsin in April 1914 and lived near Sheperd's Park. We later moved to Grandma Patterson's house on Stevens Street, where OLIVE ELLEN was born on October 2nd, 1915. She became ill and passed away on April 8th, 1916. We laid her to rest in the cemetery in Rhinelander.

On July 5th, 1916, AMASA NILES and ANNA NELSON were married in our house on Stevens Street by Rev. Messenpea of the Methodist Church.

On March 14th, 1917, ROYAL ALLEN was born. We moved to the house that is now the Christian Science reading Rooms. We lived there when World War I ended. (see item # 1 at end of this information for Autobiography of ROYAL ALLEN NILES).

My sister, Mabel died in July 1919. THEDA DORA was born on July 27th, 1919 in the house on Stevens Street in Rhinelander.

In December 1919, Bill's mother died in Necedah. His father, WILLIAM DODGE NILES had died less than a year before her.

On October 14th, 1919 NORMA and SAM CAHEE were married in Kenosha, Wisconsin. Pearl and A.R. Barber (Babe) were married on March 5th, 1921.

We lived in the Kepler house on Brown Street and from there we moved across the street to the Brown house.

ALICE married Joe Planeck on April 17th, 1927 in the Brown house and they went to Milwaukee to live.

We moved over Koppa's Drug Store and INEZ married Ronald Hein in the Episcopal Church on July 8th, 1928.

ALICE NILES PLANECK passed away on March 16th, 1931 in Milwaukee from "Diphtheria." She was buried in Rhineland on the lot with OLICE (sic) ELLEN.

We moved back to Kepler house. WILLIAM NILES married Onvilla Sheffler in Wausau on September 24th, 1932. Onvilla died after childbirth in June of 1933. The baby was a boy named Blain.

HELEN married Dr. Joseph Halpin on June 8th 1933 at the St. Mary's Church in Rhineland-Father Bertrand. They moved to Rush City, Minnesota where Joe was a doctor.

WILLIAM married Sylvia Sheffler on January 23rd, 1937 in Merrill, Wisconsin.

Bill moved to Minneapolis to work on the Soo Line Railroad in 1933 and in May 1934, THEDA, ROYAL & I moved to Minneapolis where both Theda and Royal graduated from Edison High School. We lived at 2222 Central Ave, N.E. where Theda lived until June L (sic) ?? 1972.

Ruth married Robert Durbin at Rush City, Minnesota in Helen's house by Rev. McCloud on May 18th, 1941.

ROYAL married Dorothy Johnson at Dorothy's house on Fillmore Street in Minneapolis on July 27th, 1941.

Bill and I celebrated our 50th Wedding Anniversary in 1943. He retired from the Soo Line Railroad in 1944.

I fell and broke my hip on September 30th, 1945. Bill had his first heart attack on November 11t, 1947. Dr. Joe Halpin took him to the Rush City Hospital and cared for him until the week before Christmas when he returned home. Bill passed away on May 29th, 1953 and is buried at Sunset Memorial Park in Minneapolis.

N.03 AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF ROYAL ALLEN NILES.

AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF ROYAL ALLEN NILES (AKA) ROYAL NILES

Born March 14, 1917 at Rhinelander, Wisconsin. I was the tenth of eleven children of Theresa Ighetta (Boshaw) Niles and William Hadlock Niles. I have been told that I was born during a very bad snowstorm in a house on Pelham Street and my father and sister had to make a path in the snow for the doctor to get through. All of my brothers and sisters were born at home as that was the way it was done in those days.

I spent my first sixteen years in Rhinelander where I attended elementary and my first three years of high school. My childhood was not too eventful as I recall, but I have memories of certain things that I will try to write about.

As a child in Wisconsin, while riding in (a) car past some rural farm country, we passed an old schoolhouse and my sister, Theda, said "Oh look, that's the school where Helen taughted." I said, taughted, nothing, taughted." My sister, Helen, always remembered that incident.

At the age of about six, while visiting my sister, Norma in Escanaba, Michigan, while I was wading in a terraced falls, I stepped into a deep hole. I believe I must have gone down at least three or four times before my brother, William, grabbed me by the hair and pulled me out. The experience was so frightening that I have always feared going under water.

At the age of five or six, I remember my first experience with a dead person. Julius Sprogue, my sister Alice's fiancée, passed away from pneumonia and since he had no family, my family had his body in the front room of our house in Rhinelander. I also remember a photographer taking pictures with a flash powder.

I also remember a shocking experience I had as a child. I stuck my finger in an open light socket. Needless to say, I never did that again!

Townline Lake was at the edge of Rhinelander and this is where much time was spent as a youngster during summer vacations. It was a nice place to hike to.

At the age of nine, in 1926, I had my first airplane ride. It was in a Waco biplane and I flew with a pilot named Colonel Jenkins. He was a World War I pilot and a friend of my sister Helen. They had worked together in Milwaukee. He was what was known as a barnstorming pilot. He would go from one town to another and take passengers up for rides! I believe Helen and I were the first in our family ever to fly!

My Dad was a conductor on the Soo Line Railroad and he had his own cabooses assigned to him. I remember being with him many times on his cabooses and climbing up into the cuppalo. I also remember riding in the engine behind his cabooses when he had a long train and needed a push to get up the grade out of Rhinelander. Then the engine would disconnect and we would ride back to Rhinelander and go home.

Our house in Rhinelander was next door to the butcher shop. The Jorsch's were an old German family and they were good friends of our family. I recall spending much time watching Mr. Jorsch make sausages and I can especially remember his rings of balogna. That was one of our lunch specials-sliced balonga on crackers. I also remember his pork cracklings and blood sausage.

As a young boy in Rhinelander, my brother William, had a BB air rifle and he was shooting it from our back porch. I asked if I could try it and he handed me the gun. Believe it or not, I was shooting at a chimney on the blacksmith's shop behind our house and a bird flew by and I killed it with my first shot. I think I cried.

My first experience with a radio was at about the age of six or seven. My brother was a crystal set at a variety store contest. I remember how we used to fight about whose turn it was to listen on the head phones.

I remember as a child, going to the Majestic Theater in Rhinelander to see silent movies (the only kin in those days). I recall the piano player in the front of the theater, just below the screen. He provided the music and sound effects according to mood during the film. I remember the first talking picture at the theater in Rhinelander. Al Jolson in the "Jazz Singer." Old time serials like Perils of Pauline and Tarzan were a must on Saturday matinees.

Doug Hergren was my childhood friend in Rhinelander during my first fifteen years. His father owned a beer parlor. His brother Harlan was also my brother, William's best friend. After Doug graduated from high school, he became interested in animals so he went to veterinary school in Chicago where he is now a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

Ralph Weaver, another boyhood friend's father owned a restaurant (in) downtown Rhinelander. During our high school days, I had become adept at playing drums. Ralph played the violin and another friend played a saxophone. We played for dances and during dinner hour we played at Ralph's father's restaurant. Ralph was killed while doing a solo flight while learning to fly in 1946.

I attended Rhinelander High School through my Junior year and then, my father, being a Railroad Conductor, was transferred

to a run from Weyhauser, Wisconsin to Minneapolis, so I finished my senior year in Minneapolis and graduated from Edison High in June of 1935. At that time, my mother and father and Theda and I lived in an upstairs apartment which was just two blocks from school for two years and then we moved to 2222 Central Ave.

My first car was a 1928 Model A Ford Roadster, which I acquired from my brother, William, in 1936. He had driven it to Minneapolis and left it there. It was parked in our back yard for some time and finally it was given to me. I put many fun miles on it and drove it until 1940 when I traded it on a 1936 Ford V8.

Some of my first jobs included being a stock clerk in a variety store, file clerk for a lumber company, usher at the Arion Theater and a tool crib attendant at Minneapolis Honeywell.

IN 1937, I became interested in photography and bought an Argus candid camera (35mm), more or less at the beginning of candid photography. This was the beginning of a hobby and vocation that was an influence on my life's work. One of my first jobs in photography was at Brown & Bigelow, greeting card company in St. Paul, in 1940. I was working there during the famous Armistice Day, from which I got pneumonia! I will never forget the storm.

I met Dorothy Evelyn Johnson while I was working as an usher at the Arion Theater in Minneapolis. We had a lengthy courtship (about three years) and then we started a partnership which has lasted for forty five years. WE were married at the home of Dorothy's mother, Mrs. Rosalie Johnson in Minneapolis on July 27, 1941.

On Sunday, December 7th, 1941, we were on our way for a visit with Dorothy's sister Gladys, when we heard the news on the car radio, that Pearl Harbor had been attacked by the Japanese. This, of course, was a big turning point in our lives as in everyones.

On September 11, 1942, I entered the U.S. Army at Fort Snelling in Minneapolis. After the usual indoctrination testing, etc., I was shipped to Miami Beach, Florida, for my basic training. This was considered at the time as the most desired place to have basic, with the living conditions in hotels, etc. I guess I was lucky! I was in the next group to go through after Clark Gable was there.

After completing basic training, I was transferred to Charleston Army Air Base in South Carolina, where I spent the next seventeen months in the photo lab. I received a lot of valuable experience, both in photography and military service. While at this base I met a good friend in Captain

Donald Frost, the officer in charge of the base lab. While stationed in Charleston, I was sent on detached duty to Lowry Field at Denver, Colorado, to the Air Force Photo School, where I graduated with distinction.

While I was stationed at Charleston, I was allowed to live off base for a couple of months and Dorothy came down there. We had a small apartment in a special section for service personnel in a subdivision of Charleston. It was a fun experience living in Charleston. We enjoyed being there even though it was for only a short time.

Having completed my tour of duty at Charleston AFB, I was transferred to an overseas shipment list and moved to Newport News, Virginia, from where I sailed on a cargo troop ship named the Santa Maria. I hope Christopher Columbus had a better crossing on his Santa Maria than I did! The next fifteen days were a real nightmare since I was seasick most of the time. We were part of a large convey of ships headed for Naples, Italy. We arrived in June of 1944.

My first impression of Italy was not too friendly! As we were marching from the ship to where we were to bivouac, a small boy (paisano) evidently slashed the back of my knapsack with a razor, hoping that stuff would fall out. Luckily I had a jacket close to the outside and that kept things from falling out, even though it ruined the jacket. You couldn't trust any of them!

My assignment to Italy was as a replacement. The original men of the 32nd Photo Reconnaissance Squadron enroute to Naples was dive bombed by a German Stuka and the ship went down with a loss of all 500 on board. It so happened that a few of the officers of the 32nd were on the ship behind the one lost and these men were the nucleus of the new 32nd to which I was assigned as Public Relations photographer with the Fifteenth Air Force.

My next year and a half were spent at an air base in San Severo, Italy. The climate was quite a bit like in Minnesota except for dampness. The cold and snow in the winter made it a little uncomfortable in the winter living in tents, but you soon learn to get used to it. I wouldn't trade anything for my experiences in Italy. I had the opportunity to visit much of the country. I spent much time in Rome and one of the highlights of my life was visiting ST. Peters and along with other service men, having an audience with Pope Pius XII. He blessed a string of prayer beads that I had bought for my sister, Helen. I was happy years later to learn that the beads were a prized possession of hers and that she had willed it to be placed in her hands when she was buried.

After the Germans surrendered, a friend and I had furloughs and we hitchhiked all the way to Northern Italy as far as the

Po Valley near the Austrian border. We spent some time in many cities, including Florence, Bologna, Naples, Rome and several days in Milan. Our group was scheduled to go to the Pacific, but while enroute on ship, our orders were changed and we were returned to the USA (THANK GOD!). Our ship, the Sea Scamp, arrived at Camp Shanks, New York and from there I was shipped to Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, where I was discharged in September 1945.

After returning home from the service, I returned to Minneapolis Honeywell, but I could find no interest in working in a tool crib, so I started looking for another job. In January of 1946, I found an ad in the paper for a portrait photographer to work for the Bawden Studios of St. Paul. I applied and got the job, which turned out to be a traveling job on the West Coast. Since the job was for both a photographer and receptionist, and they preferred a husband and wife team, we both had a job. We worked from Mid California all the way up the coast to northern Washington. It was an interesting experience, but I soon learned to hate to photograph crying kids, mostly babies! However, we did get a chance to travel and see a lot of the country,

At the end of 1946, we returned to Minneapolis and bought out a portrait studio on Lake Street in South Minneapolis. The owner of the studio had ruined the business because he had an alcohol problem. It took us a year to rebuild the business to where it was a paying proposition. About that time we had two offers that we couldn't turn down. We had a chance to sell the studio at a profit and an offer to return to the job on the West Coast at an increase in salary, so we did both. With the profit, we bought a new 1948 Ford and headed West. It turned out that just one more year of photographing kids was all I could take!

In the meantime, the chance that I had been waiting for sometime finally arrived. I was accepted to attend the Art Center School of Los Angeles. We packed up and left Minneapolis and arrived just in time to see snow in Pasadena. I believe it was a first for that! This was in January of 1949.

I started school in January right after we arrived in California and for the next two and a half years, with the help of the G.I. Bill and a wife who had enough faith in me, I was able to achieve my goal. Without her help in working to help make the expenses, we wouldn't have been able to do it. I graduated from the Art Center School in May of 1951 with Honors from a starting class of Sixty students of which eight graduated. I received a Bachelor of Arts Degree..

After graduating from school, we again returned to Minneapolis with the intent of possibly going into business. I tried Photojournalism which was my major in school, but

soon learned that this was a pretty rough field. I sold a few magazine articles and a few magazine covers, but it wasn't enough to live on. In order to survive, I accepted a job at the Twin Cities Arsenal as a Photographer/Gunner. The job was testing of ammunition. This was during the time of the Korean war. I worked at this job from October 1951 until March 1953.

During the time after returning from Los Angeles, I had kept in touch with a friend we had met while I was in school. Irving Bacon, a well known actor comedian. Irving was known for his role as the mailman in the old Blondie series. I photographed him while I was in school and since he also was interested in photography, we became good friends. Irving died in 1965 from cancer. In our correspondence, Irving repeatedly tried to talk me into coming to Los Angeles and go into business with him. We finally decided to do this and returned to L.A. in April 1953 and Irving and I started Niles-Bacon Photography Studio in Westwood, a suburb of L.A. We operated our studio from April 1953 until March 1954 doing portrait and commercial photography.

A month after we moved to L.A., my wonderful father passed away in Minneapolis. He was eighty years old and in two more months, my mother and he would have had their sixtieth wedding anniversary. We felt he lived a full and happy life and we were lucky to have him with us for so long.

Irving and I found it a little difficult getting started in a new business so he did parts in films to help support the business and I got a job at Douglas Aircraft Company in Santa Monica in the Photo Department in September 1953. Since our business only lasted a year due to financial problems, I continued to work Douglas until May 1956.

While I was working at Douglas, to be precise, on December 29, 1954, one of the highlights of our lives took place. After thirteen years, our first son, Bruce Allen Niles was born at St. John's Hospital in Santa Monica. We had just about given up the idea of being partners, but God decided we should be.

I learned that a friend from Minneapolis, Neil Kaplan, worked in the Motion Picture Department of a new company called Ramo-Wooldridge. Neil arranged for an interview for me and I was hired to work in the Guided Missile Research Division of Ramo-Wooldridge on May 28, 1956. The name of the company changed through the years and finally became TRW for Thompson Ramo Wooldridge.

On July 4, 1956, we bought our one and only home at 5520 Halison Street in Torrance, California. This is another good reason I am glad to have been in the service and to have the opportunity of using the G.I. Bill of Rights.

On January 10, 1957, we had another highlight in our lives. Our second son, Kevin Patrick Niles was born, also at the St. John's Hospital in Santa Monica. So we were twice blessed by God.

My career at TRW has been one of many fulfilling experiences. I worked as a cameraman for several years and then became chief cameraman. Through the years I traveled to many places throughout the world, including Austria, Indonesia, Japan, England and Australia. My position progressed from cameraman to Director to Film Production Coordinator and finally to Production Manager. After twenty six years with TRW, I am retired on July 9, 1982.

I have continued working part time for TRW as a consultant in the field of Engineering Cinematography.

As an additional hobby, I started oil painting in September 1982, specializing in portraits--I enjoy it!

She was the mother of the son:

Joseph Berney 4/ was born on the 9th of March 1673 at Salem, Massachusetts and apparently his mother was Ann Witt, second wife to his father. He died on the 5th of February 1730/31, location not given. His wife was Constance Davis, born on the 9th of March 1674 at Haverhill, Massachusetts. She died between 1722 and 1728, location not stated. Joseph Berney 3/ held the title of Lieutenant and he was a farmer and also a Baptist Minister. He built churches in Salem, Charleston and Boston, Massachusetts. His son was:
