(Wake County, N.C. Will Abstracts 1760-1800 by Olds:

Will of Isaac Hill 1/, dated 23 December 1789, proved in
1790. (Wife was Ama (Amy) .
Named were (children?): Jacob; James; Isaac; Olive; and dau.
Amy.

Will proved by oaths of Abel & William Olive.
Recorded in Wake County, N.C. Book "C" page 294, on 4th
August 1793.

Brief wording of will:
Isaac Hill 1/: wife Ama (Amy) all land except 300 acres where
son Jacob Hill 2/ now lives.
Daughter: Sarah Copeland 2/.
Daughter: Ama. 2/
Daughter: Frances 2/
Son: Jesse 2/.
Son: Isaac 2/., land where he now lives, (you say "indicates
he is married by this date."). I agree, or at least he was
18 years old or older!
Daughter: Olive 2/.

Witnesses: Abel Olive and William Oliver.

(Seems to be the same as above)

Also found in Wake County, N.C.:
Isaac Hill (wife Amy)
Jacob, James, Jesse, Isaac, Olive & dau, Amy.

Wake Co., N.C. Book III (or is that Book 3?), 1793-1796, Page
43.

Jesse & Isaac Hill, orphans of Isaac Hill, deceased, 1790?
Nathaniel Hill chooses as guardian.

Note: When comparing the two, they seem to be the same man
BUT in the bottom one, I notice no mention of a son James, or
daughter Sarah Copelan (sic) or daughter Frances. I still
think it was the same man and will.

A Isaac Hill died in Darlington County, S.C. in 1799. He was from Moore County, N.C. He had a son named Michael Hill. that married a Mary Record. (Note: He might be the son of the above Michael Hill????)

A Isaac Hill b. 1800 In S.C. (son of Michael Hill, who was the son of Isaac Hill who died in 1799 in Darlington Co., S.C.) How can this be? Dates are wrong?

In Darlington County, SD.C. He had a daughter that married into the (Thomas?) Lowe family in Butler County, Alabama.
