

SC.022 A LAND WARRANT TO THOMAS HILL (SR.???) IN APRIL
1770, THE MEMORIAL WAS PAID IN 1773 BY ROBERT
WATKINS FOR THOMAS HILL.

Prusiant to a warrant, decribed under the hands o and seal
of (Mr.?) Bernard Glenn, Deputy Surveyor General, dated 3rd
day of April 1770, I have admeasured abd laid out unto THOMAS
HILL, a plantation or tract of vacant land in Berkley County,
in the fork between Broad & Saludy Rivers, containing Two
Hundred Acres, situate on the North side of Enroee River and
bounded Southeast by said river, on all other sides by vacant
land, and hath such shape froms and marks as the above plat
represnets.

MEMORIAL EXIBITED BY THOMAS HILL to be registered in the
Auditor General's Office (Approved??) of a plantation or
tract of 200 acres of land, situat in Berkley County, in the
fork between Broad & Saludy Rivers, on the North side of
Enroee River, bounding on Southeast, said river, all other
sides vacant land. Survey certified the 1st of February 1772
and granted the 24th day of December 1772 to the Memorial
(dated?) 2 (meaning February?): 3/ST?? or 4/ (the meaning of
these numbers is unclear but suspected to relate to the
motnhs of incidents, such as 2 = February, 3 = March, 4=
April) proper 100 acres to commence two years from the date
(in Witness?) whereof he hath set his hand, the 2nd May 1773.
