SC.043 INFORMATION ON ELIZABETH HILL 2/, DAUGHTER OF WILLIAM HILL SR. 1/ & SUSANNA SMITHER, WHO MARRIED WILLIAM HALBERT AND LIVED IN ANDERSON CO., S.C.

Note: Since I am of the opinion that William Hill Sr. was not part of the Sion Hill family, I have him listed as the first known generation (i.e. William Hill Sr. 1/).

ELIZABETH HILL 2/.

Elizabeth Hill 2/ seems to be listed as the third child of William Hill Sr. 1/ (1710-1787) and Susanna Smither. Elizabeth Hill 2/ was born on the 18th September 1747 in Caroline County, Virginia and she died on the 6th of November 1836 at Belton, located in Anderson County, South Carolina.

She married William Anson Halbert, son of Joel Halbert and Elizabeth Frances Jones. William Halbert is said to have been born in Essex County, Virginia on the 14th October 1744. He died on 28th December 1808 in Anderson County, South Carolina.

He had a large estate of which was disposed of by his Will, which was probated on the 6th of March 1809 in Anderson County, South Carolina.

Both William & Elizabeth Halbert are buried on the site of their home, located about 3 miles south of Big Creek Church, located between Tony Creek and Broadmouth, near Calhoun, South Carolina.

In 1777 William Halbert & Elizabeth purchased 150 acres of land in Henrico County, Virginia.

It is said that William Halbert was a staunch Whig during the Revolution and he served as a second lieutenant in the militia in 1779-1780 in Henry County, Virginia.

William Halbert is listed as being granted 486 acres of land in Henry County, Virginia on Russell's Creek for fifty shillings. This is listed as grant number 268 dated 10th April 1781 and said to be signed by Thomas Jefferson (Land Grant Book D, Page 820 in the Land Grant Office, State Capitol Building in Richmond, Va.).

The land in Henry County was cut off in 1791 to form a part

of Patrick County, Virginia, which was just over the border from Surry County, North Carolina.

Shortly after William Halbert & Elizabeth Hill 2/ married they moved to Roane County, Virginia (now West Virginia). In 1788 they moved to Pendleton County, South Carolina and settled on the Saluda River.

After William Halbert died, she lived with their daughter Susannah Acker 3/, until her death.

William Halbert & Elizabeth Hill 2/ had the following children:

1. Joel Halbert was born on the 13th of June 1769. Another source says 1765 in Caroline County, Virginia. He died on 24th June 1848, St. Mary's, Hancock County, Illinois and was buried at the St. Mary's Churchyard. His wife was Mary Lindsey Lindley, born 26th August 1772 and died 22nd July 1839 at Shoals, Martin County, Indiana. Joel Halbert served with General Andrew Jackson during the war of 1812. They had 12 children (names not listed).

2. Martha Halbert was born on 17th March 1771/72 and died on the 12th June 1810 in Pickens County, N.C. Another sources says she died on 13th November 1854. She was married on 13th November 1788 in Anderson County, South Carolina to John Gresham Jr. John was born on the 14th March 1761-1766 and he died on 22nd June 1831. Another sources says his death was in July 1835. John was the son of John Gresham Sr. & Barbara Burdyne.

Martha's first child was named Joseph Gresham, born 17th November 1789 who later married Nancy Watt. The third child was Elizabeth Gresham (1826-1896) who married Joseph Emerson Brown in 1847. There was a total of nine children.

3. John Halbert was born on the 6th of January 1773, Another sources says it was 11th October 1773 in Virginia. He died on 7th July 1854 on his plantation located near Columbus, Lowndes County, Mississippi. John served many times in the South Carolina State Legislature and he married Margaret Harper in 1795. Margaret died on the 8th October 1842. They had moved to Mississippi in 1818 and settled about 12 miles out of Columbus, Mississippi. They had twelve children.

4. Enos Halbert was born on 6th January 1775 either in Virginia or North Carolina. He died in Warren County, Tennessee in 1833/34. He married Lucy (Nancy) Garner ca. 1786/88. After her death he married Rebecca Harper on 15th September 1809 in Summer County, Tennessee. Rebecca is listed as being born 16th May 1773 in N.C. and died in 1864 in Wilson County, Tennessee. She was buried in Cedar Grove Cemetery. Enos Halbert was living in Anderson County, S.C. when he was named in his father's 1806 will but he went to Tennessee when his daughter Susanna was a child and settled near Fayetteville, on the Elk River. He purchased 100 acres of land in 1811 on the Collins River in Warren County, and over the next 22 years gradually added adjacent lands to his own.

5. Arthur Halbert was born on 17th February 1777 in Virginia and died ca. 1806. He married Elizabeth Cobb in 1797 and they had four children.

6. James Ira Halbert Sr., born 8th September 1778. He died ca. 1860 and married in 1798 to Fanny Pepper, born 1782. About 1814 they moved to St. Francis County, Missouri and later to Steelville, Crawford County, Missouri. They had eleven children.

7. Susannah Halbert was born on 29th August 1780 and died in 1868. She married Peter Acker in Anderson County, South Carolina in 1798. They had nine children. After the death of her father, (William Halbert) her mother (Elizabeth Hill Halbert) lived with Susannah.

8. Frances Halbert was born on 30th May 1782/83. She died in 1857 and was married ca. 1805 to James Charles Garrison (1774-1864). They lived in S.C. and had thirteen children.

9. William Anson Halbert Jr. was born on 17th May 1784 and married Elizabeth Bowen and had eight children. She died sometime after 1828. William remarried Rachel Lindsey Cooper and they had four children.

10. Joshua Lucius Halbert was born on 4th October 1785 and died in 1842 at Tuscaloosa County, Alabama. He married Sarah Broyles and they had a son. Sarah died as a result and he then married Matilda Nash, born 4th June 1793 and they had seven children. He was a Baptist minister.

11. Elizabeth Halbert was born 6th January 1788 in Anderson County, South Carolina and died 8th July 1861 in Tippah County, Mississippi. She married William Berry on 30th May 1805. William was born on 17th August 1780 and died on 14th June 1858 in Mississippi. He was the son of Hudson Berry and Sarah Anthony. They had eleven children.

12. Mary Halbert was born on 10th April 1791 in South Carolina and died in 1872. She married John Sterling Sherrill (1784-1855). They were the parents of four children. They moved to Missouri.

13. Lucinda Halbert was born 16th January 1793 in Anderson County, South Carolina and died in Mississippi.. She married David Berry, born on 30th August 1789. They had thirteen children. END OF SC.043 DATA
