Darius Gandy, son of Booka Gandy and Delilah, his wife, was borned (sic) October the 20th 1811 and Harriet A. M. Hill, his wife and daughter of Jas. (James) W. Hill and Amy, his wife was Borned (sic) April the 25th, 1823.

Family Record of Darius Gandy.

Darius Gandy and Harriet A. (Amanda) Hill was married on the 22nd of August 1844.

James Hill Gandy, son of Darius & Harriet Amanda (Hill) Gandy was born on 20th March 1849.

Harriet Elizabeth Gandy, daughter of Darius Gandy & Harriet Amanda (Hill), his wife, was born (on) 8th March 1851.

Darius Newton Gandy, son of Darius Gandy & Harriet Amanda (Hill), his wife, was born (on) 17th March 1853.

Mary Amanda Gandy, daughter of Darius Gandy & Harriet Amanda (Hill), his wife, was born on the 22nd of October 1856.

Marriages:

Harriet Elizabeth Gandy, daughter of Darius Gandy & his wife Harriet Amanda (Hill) Gandy was married to George H. Powell on February 25th, 1870.

Mary Amanda Gandy, daughter of Darius Gandy & Harriet Amanda, his wife, was married to Charley H. Powell on January 28th, 1874.

Darius Newton Gandy, (son of Darius & Harriet A., his wife) married Nannie E. Mims on February 13th, 1876.

Deaths

Harriet Amanda M. (Hill) Gandy, wife of Darius gandy, departed this life on the 13th of January 1868. (She was a daughter of a James & Amy Hill). Darius Gandy, son of Bookey Gandy (husband to the above Harriet) was killed on the plantation of Gibson's, he was short (sic) (Shot?) from his horse and killed by Negroes on May 10th 1865.
