JAMES HILL FAMILY

Family tradition states that James Hill and a brother migrated from Virginia to Tennessee about the beginning of the 19th Century (1800). The brother settled in what is now Union County, Tennessee.

James Hill established a home on Hines Creek, in Anderson County, Tennessee. The site is near Mt. Hebron Primitive Baptist Church. In the same valley, one will find the burial place of his family.

In an old bible that originally belonged to James Hill, the following deaths are recorded:

Stephen Claton died March 1st 1819.
Cander F. Hill died September 20, 1820.
Molly Claton died September 15, 1821.
Ery Thu Hill died November 23, 1821.
Mary Hill died April 3, 1824.
James Hill died September 4th, 1826.

Stephen Claton and Molly Claton were the parents to Mary Claton, the wife of James Hill.

Nothing is definitely known of the other three Hill listed above. It is assumed that they were brothers and sisters of James Hill. however Cander F. Hill was probably a child of James Hill, since it is known that he had a child by that name.

To James Hill and Mary Claton Hill were born the following:

1. Mastin Hill, born November 19, 1795, married Mary Hansard.
2. Edy Hill, born July 13th, 1794, married a Childress.
3. Freely Hill, born October 26, 1800, married Underwood
4. Marvel Hill, born November 4, 1802, died August 28, 1870.
5. Duly Hill, born May 1st, 1805 married William Loy of Orange Co., N.C.
6. Parley Hill, born November 27, 1807 m. Lewis Miller.
7. Hazy Hill, born February 11, 1810 m. Jacob Loy.
8. Eary Hill, born January 15, 1813 (never married).
9. Cander F. Hill, born October 4, 1815.

10. Aletha Hill, born October 18, 1818, m. George Miller.

Their children were: Tiny, Ruch, Jane, Isaac, & John.

Marvel Hill married Milly Cox (b. 1 March 1806), the daughter of Curd Cox and Susan Overton Cox. Curd Cox was a Revolutionary Soldier.

Marvel Hill and his wife settled on Bull Run Creek near the site of the Hill Cemetery. The original tract of land contained about 1,000 acres. The old house was standing in 1955 and was occupied by Isaac Ellison. Marvel Hill died on the 29th of August 1870 and his wife, Milly, died on the 22nd of July 1886.
