110, CUMBERLAND COUNTY VIRGINIA ON 25TH OCTOBER
1773.

In the name of God Amen-

I Thomas Hill of Cumberland County-in the Colony of Virginia
Being in health and Body, and of perfect and Sound mind and
memory (Thanks be to Almighty God therefore) Calling to mind
the Uncertainty of this Life and the Certainty of Death, do
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and
form following, that is to say first and principally I
commend my soul into the hand of Almighty God, who gave it;
hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ my Savior, to have
free Pardon of all my Sins, and a joyful Resurrection- and my
Body to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executor
hereafter Named and as for the Disposal of such Worldly
good(s) it has pleased God to Bless me with I give and
dispose of in manner and form following-

First- I will that all my Just Debts and Funeral charges be
duly paid.

ITEM, I give and bequeath to my son JOHN HILL, one hundred
Acres of Land to be Laid of (off) at the upper end of this
(land?) I now live on more or less by the following Bounds,
that is to begin at a pine Corner on Browns Line, and Running
from thence a straight line to a Corner white oak on Toenys
Branch at the fords, and from thence a strait Line to
Dunsfords Corner on Cary's Line, to have and to hold the said
Land to the said JOHN HILL and his Heirs forever.

ITEM, I give and bequeath to my son DENNETT HILL all the
remainder of my Land Containing the plantation whereon I now
Live for one hundred Acres more or less after the above
mentioned Land is Laid off for my Son JOHN To have and to
hold the said Tract of Land to the said DENNETT HILL and his
heirs forever.

ITEM, I give and bequeath to my Daughter SARAH my bed
whereon I commonly Ly (lie) and one Horse and Side Saddle and
one Iron Pott....

ITEM, I give and bequeath to my Daughter MARY, one Cow and
Calf....

ITEM, I give and bequeath to my sons, THOMAS, WILLIAM,
JOSEPH and JAMES and my Daughter ANN, Each of them one
Shilling Sterling....

ITEM, My Will and Desire is that my beloved wife BARCHEWAY

shall possess and Enjoy the Land and Plantation whereon I now

Live, and all the Residue of my estate goods and Chattels,
for her use during her Natural Life but not to be by her sold
or any way Disposed of unless to my son DENNETT.

ITEM, My Will and desire is that after the death of my said
wife all my Estate goods and Chattels, with the Plantation be
my Son DENNETT'S INTIRELY (entirely) at his disposal and for
use and His Heirs forever....

Lastly, I nominate and appoint my said son DENNETT, my hole
and Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby
by Revoking and Disannulling all former Will or Wills, by one
heretofore made, hereby declaring this to be my only true and
last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this sixth Day of October one thousand
seven hundred and seventy.
