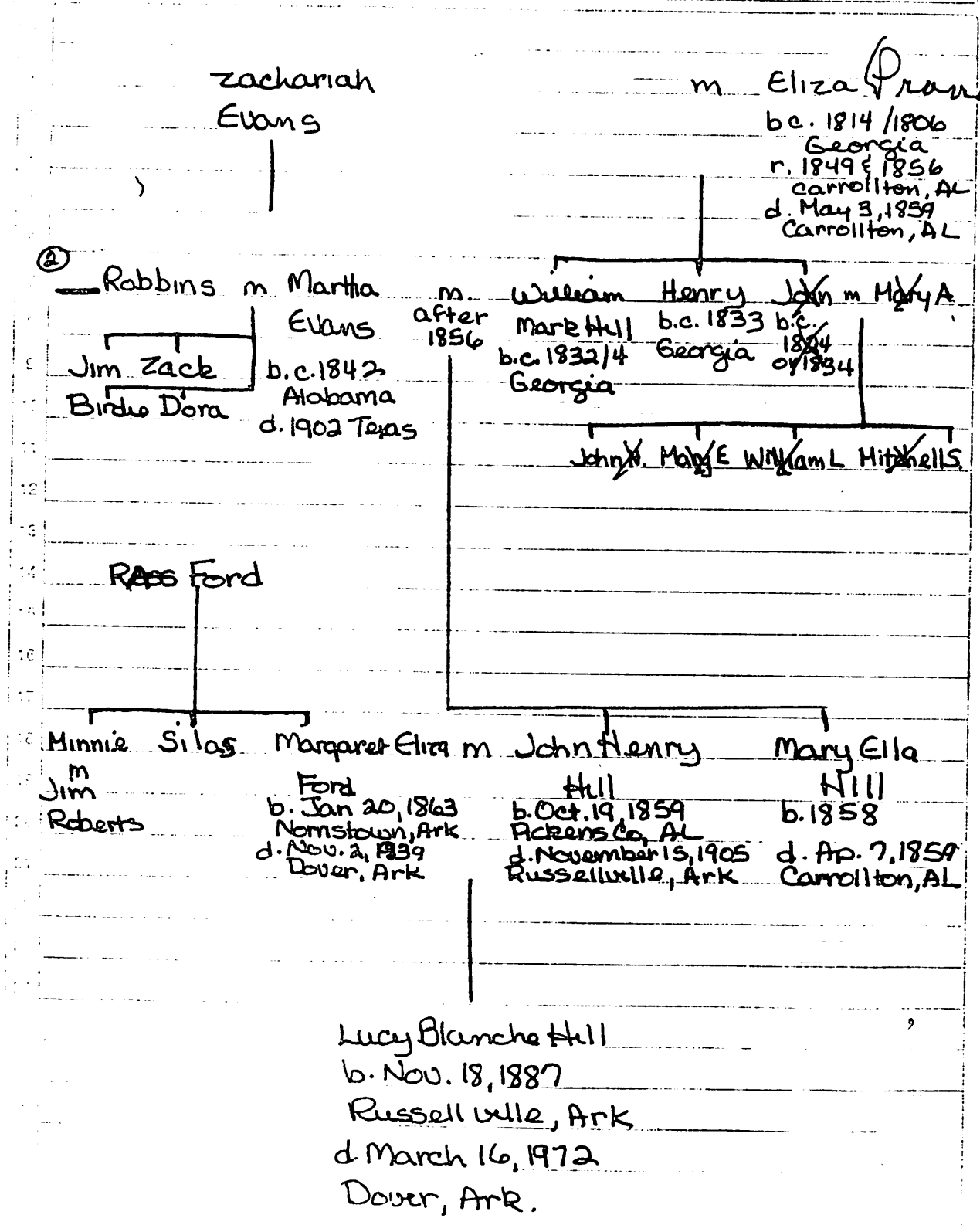

Dorcas Hill also sold William Hill Jr. 100 acres of land located on Beaver Creek. "Being part of 200 acres of land granted me 14th of July, 1774?, N. W. bounds on said Dorcas Hill land, S.W. and S. E. on Richard Hill's land, W. E. on Beams land." Deed Book L, page 171, 6th of January, 1793, filed 1798. Witnessed by Wm. Alsop and Richard Hill, - Moses Hill, J. P. Signed by Mark. Below when verifying the sale Darcus signed her name.

The deeds shown connect Dorcas with Richard Hill (Witness), Asaph and William Hill Jr. The land sold amounts to 203 acres, the amount Dorcas received in the 1772 grant. After signing the above deed, no other record of Dorcas is found.

ASAPH HILL OF FAIRFIELD DISTRICT, SOUTH CAROLINA.

Asaph Hill received a land grant; Book 24Q, page 113, Camden Dist., S. C. August 20, 1788. "Unto Asaph Hill 114 acres 20 Aug., 1788, District of Camden on Beaver Creek." Andrew McDowell D. S. The grant adjoined the land of George Powell, George Miller, Elijah Beams, Darkus Hill, John Carr and David Hopkins.

Asaph Hill was born as early as 1767 since he received a land grant in 1788 (required to be 21 years of age) located near that of Dorcas Hill on Beaver Creek. As mentioned, he bought land from Dorcas in 1793. He was one of the Administrators to the estate of Wm. Hill Jr. in 1795 along with Abel Hill and Thomas Mobley.

He was shown in the 1790 census of Fairfield Co. as follows: "Asaph Hill, 1 male over 16 years of age."

The 1800 census of Fairfield, page 384-385: "Asaph Hill, 1 male 26-45 years; 1 female under 10 years age; 1 female 26-45 years of age."

Fairfield County, Deed Book 1, page 221-: "I Asaph Hill for \$300.00 sell unto Samuel and Elijah Hill 98 acres of land on Beaver Creek, a branch of Broad River bounded N.E. by Darcus Hill's land." /signed/ Asaph Hill. Date of Instrument 1804, recorded 1806. Samuel and Elijah were sons of Wm. Hill Jr. Mrs. C. G. Young wrote: "Asaph Hill had bought the above land from Joseph Hill who in turn had bought it from Darcus Hill." We have not been successful in verifying the transaction with Joseph.

Fairfield County, Deed Book Q, page 390 - recorded 1805. "Asaph Hill to Buch & Randolph (?). Apparently Asaph was not shown in the Fairfield records after 1806.*

Simeon Hill, Sr., son of Richard and Mary Mobley Hill, died ca. 1857. "Small Plat describes land assigned to Jehew W. Hill & land assigned to the Widow, Elizabeth Hill. Dated December 10, 1857, /signed/ Jacob Feaster." Deed recorded in Book VV, page 308-309, 22 January, 1858. "From Simeon A. Hill and Jehew W. Hill, A. A. Hill and Mary E. Hill, for money paid by Elizabeth Hill..lands with residence of the late Simeon Hill..according to plat made by Jacob Feaster, D. S....Witness William E. Hill. Affidavit to this deed signed by W. E. Hill, before Jacob Feaster, Magistrate."

Another affidavit to this deed signed by Mary E. Hill and witnessed by Jacob Feaster, Magistrate...states "Mary E. Hill, wife of the above A.A. Hill."

'A small plat, signed by Jacob Feaster, Jr., D.S., surveyed the 10th September, 1853: "I certify that I have surveyed and laid off to Wm. E. M. Hill, at the request of Dr. Robert W. Coleman, the above described tract of land, and find it to contain thirty-eight acres, it being the northwest part of the tract whereon Dr. R. W. Coleman now resides...and on a spring branch of McClures Creek, waters of Broad River."

'Deed from Wm. E. M. Hill to J. V. Hill, recorded in Book WW, pages 256 & 257, Dec. 16, 1861...land granted "to me by R. W. Coleman, being the plantation whereon I now reside, situate lying and being in Fairfield District, on a spring Branch of McClures Creek, Waters of Broad River..near the road from Crosbyville to Feasterville,..according to the plat made by Jacob Feaster, Jr., D. S., Sept. 10, 1853". Witness: Jas. I. (or S.) Hill. Sworn before Jacob Feaster, Magistrate. Affidavit to this deed, states Mrs. M. Jain Hill, wife of within named Wm. E. M. Hill"...dated Dec. 22, 1859."

'Copy of a deed recorded in Fairfield District, book WW, page 255 & 256, Dec. 16, 1861...from H. I. Coleman of said district, to Elizabeth Hill...land on Bear Branch of Stomp Branch of Middle Fork of Beaver Creek, waters of Broad River, adjoining lands of Mrs. E. Hill, John C.C. Feaster, and H. I. Coleman, Senr., as plat in hands of Jacob Feaster, D. S., sets forth. Dated Feb. 18, 1860. Witnesses: J. C. C. Feaster and S. A. Hill.

Simeon Hill, Sr., son of Richard Hill, is mentioned in Edrington's History of Fairfield Co.: "Of the step-son, Adam Cooper, all of his descendents removed to Mississippi.. His son, George, the crack rifle shot of his day, married a Triplet of Chester Co. His children all now live in Winston Co., Miss. Adam Cooper's daughter married Capt. William E. Hill*, a brother of Simeon Hill..and here the old Election Box, it was called "Hill's Box", afterwards Feasterville, and it was then said, that as the

* Although Edrington states that Wm. E. Hill md. Cooper, ; We have not been able to verify this.. The records show that he married Elizabeth Cockrell. (This could have been a second Marriage.) A number of William Hills' lived in this neighborhood and perhaps Edrington was mistaken.
