C., Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Tennessee, Kentucky, and in the winter of 1845 or 1846, in company with Rev. James M. Young of Alabama, by direction of Synod, explored Texas. Wishing to effect a settlement of the North or West, he spent the spring and part of the summer of last year in New York and New England. Thence through Ohio to St. Louis. Thence to Springfield, Ohio where he spent the winter. In the month of June, he returned to St. Louis, and there fell a victim to the plague. His age was about 26 or 27.
