Death of Miss Isabella Edgar Shiell, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Shiell, on the morning of the 28th February, at the age of eighteen years and four months. (eulogy)

Died, at his residence on Savannah River, on Monday 21st Feburary, Peter F. Moragne, aged 30. A wife and four children are left to feel that utter deprivation.... (eulogy)

Died, at his residence in Union District, on the 13th instant, William Rice, in the 64th year of his age. He served his District and State in various public stations, for a number of years, as Sheriff, Ordinary &C, and finally filled the office of State Senator for eight years... attached himself to the Methodist Episcopal Church.



Died, of fever, after an illness of fourteen days, Mr. Daniel Lyle, on the 15th of September, 1843, at Mr. F. L. J. Pride's, York District, S. C. a member of the Presbyterian Church, a Stone Mason and Bricklayer by trade. He was a native of Virginia, where it is supposed his relations reside.

Died, in Marion District, on Saturday 7th Instant, Ernest Horrell, infant and only son of R. R. and M. S. Brooks, aged six months and two days.

Departed this life in Lexington District, on the 10th September, at her father's (Mr. John Drehr), Mrs. Barbara Harman, consort of George Harman, being 37 years 11 months and 13 days old. (eulogy)

Issue of November 16, 1843

Married, on the 29th ult., by the Rev. J. C. Hope, the Rev. Geo. H. Brown, to Miss Margaret McClintock, all of Newberry District.

Married, on Thursday, the 19th of October, by the Rev. Mr. Andrew McGuffin, Rufus J. P. Ward, to Miss Belinda Jane Jenkins, both of Pickens District, S. C.

Another Revolutionary Patriot Gone. Died, of Apoplexy, at the residence of his son, Joseph A. Black, Esq., in Columbia, on the 7th instant, Joseph Black, a soldier of the Revolution, aged 80 years, 9 months, and 20 days. The subject of this notice was born on the 17th January 1763, in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. While he was yet a child, his parents removed to Mecklenburg, North Carolina, where they continued to reside, until the war broke out between this country and Great Britain. As soon as he was able, being then only sixteen years of age, he entered the service of his country, and in 1781, enlisted in Capt. Peter Burn's Company of Mounted Infantry, attached to Col. Washington's Regiment.... At the cloase of the war, he married and removed to Abbeville District, South Carolina, where he has resided ever since. In 1806, he was elected a member of the Legislature, and later in the Senate. (long account) To his aged partner in life, who has survived him, and with whom he enjoyed sixty years of uninterrupted domestic happiness, to his children....

Died, in Maybinton, on Friday morning, the 10th inst., of inflammation of the lungs, Mr. Moses Stabler, a native of Lexington District... interred in the Methodist Church yard in this place.
