

Moses K. Hollis
Oct. 8, 1828 - February 14, 1905

Born to Isaac K. and Elizabeth Hollis on Oct. 8, 1828 in South Carolina. His parents moved to Georgia about 1832 and then to Chambers Co., Ala. around 1836/38. Moses married Martha Louise Heath on Oct. 16, 1855. They had eleven children. Moses enlisted as a private in Company H of the 47th Alabama Infantry Regiment of the Confederate Army. On August 9, 1862, he was wounded at Cedar Run, Virginia while serving in Jackson's Division; he was wounded again in Talleferro's Brigade, sometime between the time General Lee took command at Gordonsville and the time they left the valley near Snickers Neck at Sharpsburg.

- * In 1880, he could be found living near Roaxoke, Randolph Co., Alabama. Moses died February 14, 1905 and is buried at Wehadkee Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery at Rock Mills, Randolph Co., Alabama.

- * At the battle of Cedar Run his military record shows he lost ^{his left} one leg just below the knee. Then, while in the hospital with this injury he lost his right eye to small pox.
