#### Holmes, William

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 13 February 1779 and re-enlisted on 1 February 1780. He was in the fall of Charleston. A.A. 3719C; N.A.853.

#### Holmes, William, Sr.

He served three hundred forty-six days in Capt. Benjamin Tutt's Independent Company during 1779 and 1780. A.A.3719C; R149; X493.

#### Holroyed, Turpin

He served as sailing master aboard the South Carolina. A.A.3719D; Y225.

#### Holsenback, Abraham

He served in the militia before and after the fall of Charleston. A.A.3720; T359.

#### Holsenback, Derrick

See Derrick Holsonback.

#### Holsenback, William

He served in the militia after the fall of Charleston. A.A.3722; T357.

#### Holsey, Benjamin

He served sixty days in the militia during 1781. A.A.3723; R142.

#### Holsey, William

He served sixty days in the militia during 1781 under a Capt. Thomas. A.A.3725; R143.

#### Holsombake, Derrick

See Derrick Holsonback.

#### Holsonback, Derrick

He served as a sergeant under Capts. Richard Jones, \_\_\_\_\_ Cartree, Francis Sinquefield, John Ryan and Col. LeRoy Hammond. In addition, he was in the sieges of Augusta and Savannah, the taking of Brown's Fort (or Fort Cornwallis) and the battle at Eutaw Springs. A.A.3721; T358.

#### Holton, John

He served as a horseman under Capt. Alexander Pagan beginning 7 June 1780. A.A. 3728; Y779.

#### Holton, John

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 18 March 1776 as a sergeant and was a private on 23 April 1776. N.A.853.

#### Holton, John

He served in the militia during 1780 under a Capt. McClure. A.A.3728; Y1483.

#### Homes, George

He served thirty-nine days in the militia during 1782. P66.

#### Hoober (Hoover), John

He served in the Orangeburg District Independent Cavalry under Capt. Jacob Rumph. Salley, O., p. 473.

#### Hood, Allen

He served in the militia during 1780 under Gen. Sumter and during 1781 under Gen. Marion. A.A.3729; N35.

#### Hood, Archibald

He served under John Barkley as a horseman guarding wagons that were bringing salt from Black Mingo to the hills of Santee during 1781. In addition, he served under Maj. Thomas Thompson in the cavalry. A.A.3730; N36.

#### Hood, James

He served in the militia from 20 October 1781 to 17 February 1782 under Col. Marshall. A.A.3731; S574.

#### Hood, James

He served in the cavalry under Maj. Robert Crawford in 1780. In addition, he was in the cavalry under Lt. Col. Hamilton in 1781 and was with Maj. Thomas Thompson in 1781 at Camden and at the Catawba River. A.A.3731; O352.

#### Hood, John

S7031

b. 1750, Va.

While residing in Lancaster District, he enlisted during 1781 and served under Capts. George Dunlap, Robert Montgomery and Col. Kershaw. He was in the battles at Camden, Edisto, Eutaw Springs and in numerous skirmishes. (Moved to Tenn. and N. C.)

#### Hood, John

He served as a lieutenant under Capt. Adam Meek and Gen. Sumter. When Meek became a major, Hood became a captain. (McNabb, John, S16466); Habersham, pp. 84, 85.

#### Hood, John

He served in the militia under Col. Bratton

during 1781 and 1782. A.A.3732; A73; I295.

**Hood, John**

b. 1750

d. Post 1834

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 24 July 1776. He also served in Col. Hezekiel Maham's Light Dragoons and was at the fall of Charleston. A.A.3732; P.I.; N.A.853.

**Hood, John**

He served in the Second Dragoons under Capt. Francis Moore, Col. Charles Myddleton and Gen. Sumter during 1781. Next, he was in the cavalry under Col. Maham. Salley, Doc., p. 82; A.A.3732; C593; M374.

**Hood, John, Sr.**

S1534

b. 1760

He enlisted in Burke County, North Carolina, and served under Capts. Godfrey Adams, Francis Moore and Col. Myddleton. During the battle at Eutaw Springs, he was wounded in the left thigh. (Moved to Tenn.)

**Hood, Lazarus**

BLWt 87482-1855

While residing in Edgefield District, he enlisted under Capt. Michael Watson and Col. Philomen Waters during 1780 and 1781.

**Hood, Matthew**

He served in the militia during 1781 and 1782 under Col. Marshall. A.A.3733; S573.

**Hood, Nathaniel**

b. 1758

d. 1838

m. Elizabeth Bullard

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 1 December 1778. In 1779, he was under Capt. William Caldwell. S.C.H.&G., V, 152.

**Hood, Robert**

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 1 June 1777 and became a sergeant on 1 January 1778. He was a sergeant under Capt. William Caldwell during 1779. S.C.H.&G., V, 151; N.A.853.

**Hood, William**

b. c. 1730, S. C.

He served in the Rangers under Capt. Edward Richardson and Col. Thomson during 1775 and 1776. S.C.H.&G., II, 182; III, 70; N.A.853.

**Hood, William**

b. 18 May 1750

d. 25 January 1828

m. Jane Wiggins

He served in the militia. Patriot Index Supplement.

**Hoof, John E.**

He served in the German Fusiliers of Charleston during 1775 and was later at the Savannah. Yearbook, 1885.

**Hook, Martin**

He served as a sergeant in the militia during 1782. A.A.3736; R168.

**Hook, Philip**

He served as a lieutenant in the militia during 1781. A.A.3737; R167.

**Hooke, James**

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment in February 1776 and became a gunner May 1778. N.A.853.

**Hooker, Edward**

He served in the militia under Col. Roper after the fall of Charleston. A.A.3738; 3739.

**Hooker, John**

He first served in a Virginia unit. According to a listing in the artillery under Capt. Purvis, Col. Hogan, he was in the battles at Charlestown (where he received a sabre wound in the head), Guilford Courthouse (where he was wounded by a musket ball in the ankle) and Eutaw Springs (where he was hit by a musket ball in the thigh, by a dragoon's horse which broke his collar bone, in the right foot by a ball, and lost his right thumb in the carriage of the carriage). He was also a musician under Capts. Johnson and \_\_\_\_\_ Powell of the Fourth Regiment. (Moved to Ga.)

**Hoole, Edmund**

He served in the militia as a horseman during August to 11 September 1781 and as a private man, from 5 July to 11 August 1782, under Maj. Thomas Thompson. In addition, he supplied beef for militia use during 1781. 3868; N59.

**Hooper, Absalom**

BLWt 19510

d. 9 December 1845

m. Sarah Salers or Silers, July 1781 or September 1788

While residing on the Broad River at the mouth of Green River, he enlisted during 1778 in the Sixth Regiment under Capts. Richard D. Jesse Baker and Col. Henderson. He was wounded in the battles at Sullivan's Island, Stono, the fall of Savannah (where he was hit by a musket ball in the right arm) and the fall of Charleston (where he was wounded by a musket ball in the left thigh). After being taken prisoner, he escaped and fled to Georgia where he was captured by Tories and released after five months. Next, he served in a Georgia unit. (Moved to N. C.) A.A.3738A; N.A.246.
