Alfred Jackson, Jr.

Funeral Services for Alfred Jackson, Jr. were held Sunday, August 31, 2003 at 3 p.m. and were conducted by Rev. Bruce Palmer and Rev. Bundy Bynum at the First United Methodist Church. Burial followed at the church cemetery.

Jackson, 88, died Thursday, August 28, 2003.

A native of Hogansville, Georgia, was born July 16, 1915, son of the late Alfred H. Jackson, Sr. and Aldora Hackney Jackson.

He served as a Field Artillery Captain with the 77th Infantry Division in World War II where he participated in Guam, the Philippines, Okinawa and the occupation of Japan.

He spent his entire business career with UniRoyal Tire Company, in locations in Georgia, New York, Tennessee and South Carolina, having retired in 1978 after 42 years of service.

He was a member and former President of the Winnsboro Rotary, President of the Fairfield County Club, President of the Mount Zion P. T. O. and had served on the Board of Trustees of Fairfield Memorial Hospital.

An active member of the First United Methodist Church, he served in many capacities including Lay Leader, Chairman of the Administration Board, Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School Teacher for more than fifty years. He has also served as Trustee of the Rock Hill District and the Council on Ministries of the Rock Hill District and was a member of the S. C. Conference of Health and Welfare Committees.

Surviving are: son and daughter-in-law, Dr. William A. and Faye Jackson of Rock Hill; daughters and son-in-law, Pat J. and Charles R. "Bud" McDonald of Greenville and Susan Jackson of Winnsboro; four grandchildren and one great-grandson.
