Sorry, but we have not been able to find anything to link Calvin Jackson with the Ragsdale's. We found information on Edward and Glenn Ragsdale's (Ragsdale & Ragsdale Lawyer Agency) probably what you have on your PDF. We also found the Census record for 1880 and others whereas it looks like Calvin moved to Richland County, South Carolina and then to Sumter County, South Carolina where he dies.

I have attached a paid researcher list, if you need to find this information in a more timely manner. We will keep in mind Calvin as we are researching other Ragsdale, Jackson or even Lott request in hopes of finding something in the future.

Your request is now number #6 of the 22 remaining request.

Thanks for your patience with us.

Apparently good news, the word must be out about us (see FYI below).
However, we are still supplied by a volunteer staff.

As FYI: we use to get on average about 3 request per month, this past year our average was 20 request per month;

our walk-in visitors is up from January 2014, 110, to an average of 139 walk-ins per month in 2014, 226 last month;

Dear Mr. Killian,

I honor you for the wonderful work you do. Here is information I've gathered on the Jacksons of Fairfield County who are probably related to me. It is five PDF pages long. I appears William had twenty children. Calvin Jackson, Sr. is reported to have been the principal of the old Thorntree School in Ridgeway, SC. If this was the case, it would probably have been between 1900 and 1920.

Family legend has it that Calvin ran away from his uncle when he was about 13 (1892) and worked for the lawyer Glenn Ragsdale, who taught him Latin, poetry and other useful tools that led to his becoming a teacher. My uncle, who is listed as the youngest of Calvin's children and born in 1930, is named after the two brothers, Edward and Glenn Ragsdale. I am unable to confirm this story because I do not see any tie to the Ragsdales in records I've reviewed.

There's one other thing. At the start of my tree, Calvin is in the household of Collins and Daphne Lott. It looks like they may have been sharecroppers on one of the Lyles properties after the war. Do you have any information that could confirm that?
