

## Ethel Lee B. Jenkins

WINNSBORO - Ethel Lee Burrell Jenkins, 91, died Sunday Dec. 15, 1996.

Services conducted by Arnold Valentine were held on Friday, Dec. 20, 1996, at the Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses.

Born in Fairfield County on Sept. 12, 1905, she was the daughter of the late Elliott Burrell, Sr. and Bertha Freeman Burrell and was the wife of the late Zeria Jenkins. Mrs. Jenkins was educated in the public schools of South Carolina and in 1949 she became instrumental in securing bus transportation and paving the way for black students from the Shiloh Community -Mossydale Area to attend Camp Liberty High School for a better education. She was a member of the Mossydale Extension Homemakers Club.

In 1955, Ethel Jenkins was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses and as such she served as a full-time minister for many years.

Survivors include four sons, Henry E. Jenkins Sr. of Winnsboro, Zeria Jenkins Jr. of Columbia, Mitchell B. Jenkins and Samuel S. Jenkins, both of Baltimore, Md.; one brother, Mitchell C. Burrell of Columbia; one sister, Lena Mae Johnson of Springfield, Mass.; 17 grandchildren; 28 great-grandchildren and 3 great-great-grandchildren.
