State of North Carolina } On this 14th Day of March 1871
Cleveland County } personally appeared before James Roberts
an acting Justice of the Peace in & for said County Sarah
Jenkins a resident of North Carolina in the County of
Cleveland aged 68 years who being first duly sworn
according to law both on her oath make the following
Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 granting
pensions to certain widows that she is the widow of
John Jenkins who was a Soldier in the war of the
Revolution first he enlisted in the South Carolina
line for the term of Eighteen months and after the expiration
of that term he was Draughted and went two different
times in the Militia of South Carolina. She believes the first
time to have been in the Crop Season of the year 1778
for her husband had commenced a Crop with one of his
neighbours and when called out in service she had to work
in the field in her husband's place and that she believes the
last time to have been sometime in the year 1781 or 82
for she well recollects that her oldest and only Son
must have been three or four years of age from circumstances
well recollects. She further saith that her husband
John Jenkins was a pensioner and was Entered on
the pension list of the North Carolina Agency and
that she being instructed did apply for a pension
under the Act of 7th July 1838 not knowing that there
was any other Act or provision for widows and did
receive a pension Certificate under that Act at the
rate of sixty Dollars per annum which money has
been received and that she refers the Department for
proof of service and of the date of Marriage to her papers
on the files in the pension office. She further saith

that she was married to the said John Jenkins some
 time in November 1777 and that her husband the above
 said John Jenkins died on the sixth day of July 1830
 and that she was married to him prior to his leaving
 the Service and that the marriage took place at the
 time above stated — and she further saith that
 her husband the aforesaid John Jenkins was a resident
 of Fairfield District at the time of his Service.

Declaration to be placed on the Pension list under the
Act of the 18th March 1818

State of North Carolina Superior Court of Said Term
Rutherford County of the 2^d Monday after
the fourth Monday of September 1827

On this 15th day of October 1827 personally appeared
in open Court being a Court of Record for the County
of Rutherford John Jenkins resident in the said
County, aged seventy three years, who being first duly
sworn according to Law, doth on his oath make the
following declaration, in order to obtain the pro-
-visions made by the acts of Congress, of the 18th March
1818 and 15th May 1820 that he the said John Jen-
-kins enlisted for the Term of 18 months, or
about the last of the Summer or 1st of the fall
of the year 1796, or about that time (but as to
the time he cannot say positively as his memory fails)
in the State of South Carolina, in the compa-
-ny commanded by Captain Francis Boykin, in the Regi-
-ment commanded by Colonel William Thompson,
being the 3^d Regiment in the line of the State of
South Carolina, on the South Carolina Continental estab-
-lishment; That he continued to serve in the said
Company 1st as private and then a Sergeant for the
Term of 18 months, when he was discharged from the ser-
-vice at the Ten mile house between Charleston and
Fairfield, in the State of South Carolina; That he was
at the Siege of Fort Mifflin when Sir Peter Parker
Cannonaded it, that he served better than 9 months of that
time in said company a first Sergeant and was discharged
as such.

That he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a
pension, except the present that his name is not on

the Roll of any State, except the South Carolina, and
that he has not known whether he made an affidavit
to provide himself with evidence to support the applica-
tion, that was entitled to a pension. That he is
very poor and is farming and lives with his son who
takes care of him and his wife - an old woman,
about the same age of himself. That he has depen-
ded upon his son for support and
maintenance for upwards of twenty years, that he
has no property but his wearing apparel.

And in pursuance of the act of the 1st of
May, 1820, I do solemnly swear, that I was a resi-
dent citizen of the United States on the 18th day
of March 1818, that I have not since that time
by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my
property, or any part thereof, with intent there-
by so to diminish it as to bring myself within
the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled an
act to provide for certain persons engaged in
the Land and Naval Service of the United States
in the Revolutionary war, passed on the 12th
March 1818, and that I have not, nor has any person in
trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts or
debts due to me, nor have I any income, other than
my wearing apparel. That since the 18th of March 1818
no changes have been made in my property, or circum-
stances.
