

BOTH LOST THEIR ARMS.

**Capt. R. H. Jennings and Mr. J. Fuller
Lyon Wounded Same Day.**

Capt. R. H. Jennings, State treasurer, and his bond clerk, Mr. J. Fuller Lyon, yesterday celebrated an unusual anniversary. It was just 43 years ago that each of them lost his left arm in the service of the Confederacy. They were then unknown to each other, and did not meet until later years, when they were both on the board of finance of the South Carolina conference. But the coincidence of their having lost their arms on the same day brought them together and they are now fast friends.

They were not serving in the same armies at all, Capt. Jennings having received his wound at the battle of Deep Water Falls, Va., and Mr. Lyon was in the Western army and was wounded at Ezra church, in front of Atlanta. It is indeed unusual for two men similarly marked in service to be associated together so closely in after life.
