BOTH LOST THEIR ARMS,

Capt. R. H. Jennings and Mr. J. Fuller Lyon Wounded Same Day.

Capt. R. H. Jennings, State treesurer, and his hond clerk Mr. J. Fuller Lyon, yesterday celebrated an unusual madversory. It was just 43
years are that each of them lost his
left arm in the service of the Confederary. They were then unknown
to each other, and did not meet until
later years, when they were both on
the board of finance of the South Caroling conference. But the coincidence
of their having lost their arms on the
same day brought them together and
they are now fast friends.

They were not serving in the same armies at all, Capt. Jennings having received his wound at the battle of Iseep Water Falls, Va., and Mr. Lyon was in the Western army and was wounded at Ezra church, in front of Atlanta.
