Jennings Family

Do you know the ancestry of my 2d gr grandfather,  
John (Jackie) Jennings?

He was born 1802 in Fairfield District, SC; moved to GA then Sumner Co., TN; married 1821 in Wilson Co, TN to Sarah "Sally" Harris; children born in MO: Harrison 1823; John? (Wig) 1825; Fleming 1826; James W. 1827; H? 1829; Martin? 1832; John M. 1831; Mary Ann 1833; M. J. 1835; Wm. E. 1837; MEE 1840. Was in Grayson Co, TX 1850, Burnet Co, TX 1851, died 4 Nov 1867 buried at Mt. Zion Cemetery, Burnet Co, TX. John had brothers: Jos.? 1788 SC; Wm 1803 SC, \*died Leander, TX; John? D. 1814 TN. Sarah born 1806 TN died 1879, buried beside John. Son Fleming married Caroline Jewell in Grayson Co, TX 1849, died 1906 buried near John and Sarah.

My 3d gr grandfather, also named John, "was a lad of fourteen years at the opening of the Revolutionary war, and served the entire time in the Continental army." I am trying to locate him in SC records. Possibly he enlisted in NC after SC was overrun.

Also, I am trying to make connection with still another John Jennings in SC who may be my 4th gr grandfather. A John Jennings "served in the Cherokee War under Col. Richard Richardson whose men were mainly from Camden District of Craven County and some men from the western area of Williamsburg County." This was about 1760-61, so is getting back into the really early days of SC, and still I am plagued with more than one Jennings named John living same state, same time.

If you know names, dates, nationality, etc. regarding any of the above, please contact me. If you have no information yourself, perhaps you can tell me who does. In exchange for your help, I will later give you results of my research if you are interested.
