Subject: Aaron Jones land and othe family info

Dear Sir or Madam:

Pelham Lyles on Facebook recommended writing you to learn more about the **Aaron Jones** family

that apparently lived in North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia. The Aaron in question received **640 acres of land**, maybe in 1785, as a result of colonial service. Please see attachments.

We've found the land records, but are now seeking to establish if the Aaron who received the land was father to a son, Aaron, born about 1774 in Laurens, S.C. who died in Carroll County, Ga. In 1836. It appears that that Aaron also had a

son named Aaron, but we can't document these 3 "apparent" father-son connections. Any assistance you could provide related to this family would be very much appreciated.

There are many lineages that pertain to aspects of this family, which was related to the Holcolmbe family (Aaron, Jr.) but they are confusing as to documentation of fathers and sons. This era, as we know, often makes documentation hard. We come to you believing that you may have information we can use to clarify. We have consulted Ancestry, FamilySearch, and other lineage sources. We're trying.

Again, there are many family trees that associate Aaron Jones the second with an Aaron Jones the first from Virginia, but we have not been able to clearly establish that connection, and I remain somewhat skeptical as a result.

It seems to me that the answers to our questions must lie in South Carolina or North Carolina, as we have not been able to delineate them clearly in Virginia.
