:Aunt Sarah" was born August 17, 1849 in South Carolina and was the daughter of a Confederate soldier. She lived in Oklahoma and the old Indian Territory for more than 40 years - coming first to (South) McAlester in the early 1890's when Rev. Porter was stationed on the South McAlester circuit of the church that is now the Grand Avenue Church of that denomination.
